Complete this form if you are an individual who ceased to be a resident of Canada in the year and you are electing to defer paying tax on income relating to the deemed disposition of property that you listed on Form T1243, Deemed Disposition of Property by an Emigrant of Canada.

You must file this election by April 30 of the year after you emigrate from Canada.

If you make this election and the amount of federal tax owing on income from the deemed disposition of property is **more than** \$16,500 (more than \$13,777.50 for former residents of Quebec), you need to provide adequate security to cover the amount. You may also be required to provide security to cover any applicable provincial or territorial tax payable. Contact the Canada Revenue Agency as soon as possible to make acceptable arrangements before April 30. For more information, go to **canada.ca/dispositions-property**. If applicable, also complete Form T1161, List of Properties by an Emigrant of Canada.

Notes: Security is **not** required if the amount of federal tax on income relating to the deemed disposition of property is \$16,500 or less (\$13,777.50 or less for former residents of Quebec). However, you must complete this form and attach it to your tax return. If your election to defer payment of tax is only for some of the properties listed on Form T1243, Deemed Disposition of Property by an Emigrant of Canada, use the chart on page 2 of this form to list the properties that you want to defer paying tax for.

If you resided in Quebec prior to ceasing Canadian residency, do **not** complete lines 11 to 13 of this form.
