POOL RULES AND REGULATIONS

Heartland Conference Retreat Center

Thank you for keeping Heartland Conference Retreat Center a smoke and alcohol free environment across the entire grounds of 356 acres.

- 1. Modest swimwear is required by anyone using the pool and surrounding area. Ladies and girls must wear modest one-piece bathing suits. Men and boys must wear modest swimming trunks. At each swimming session at least one person from each group renting the pool needs to 'monitor' the bathing suits upon entrance to the pool area. Lifeguards should not be distracted by having to monitor the bathing suits.**
- 2. A cover-up (not a beach towel) is to be worn to and from the pool area. The cover-up needs to be worn over bathing suits and swimming trunks anywhere on Heartland property when not at the pool area.**
- 3. Swimming is allowed only when there are lifeguards on duty at the pool.**
- 4. Each hour the lifeguards are required by law to take a 15 minute break. All swimmers must exit the pool during the required breaks.**
- 5. Shoes or sandals must be worn at all times on Heartland property.**
- 6. No food or drinks are allowed inside the fenced area. Food and drinks are permitted outside the pool area.**
- 7. Diving Area: Only those who pass the swimming test and have a valid wristband are permitted in the diving area. Anyone in violation of this rule will lose all pool privileges, possibly for the remainder of the scheduled event. No backward dives or flips. No swimming in the diving area. Swim to the ladder, not under the ropes. Wait for the person in front of you to get to the ladder before diving. Jump off the diving board forward, not to the side.**
- 8. Swim Test Rules: You are required to swim the width of the pool on one side without stopping and swim the front crawl.**
- 9. General Rules: No Running, horseplay, pushing, shoving or pulling people into the pool. No jumping or diving off the sides of the pool at any time. No food or drink inside the pool area. Stay in area of pool where you can touch bottom. No flotation devices that have a hole in the middle, such as inner tubes.**
- 10. Above all – the lifeguard's decision in any matter is final and will not be disputed with the patrons.**

POW WOW PERSONAL EQUIPMENT

The following are items that we feel are desirable to take on a Pow Wow. Some of the items may not be available to a boy, so a substitute or deletion may be made at the discretion of the parents. Your son's Commander will be able to help you in making those decisions. We suggest you check off each item as you pack it.
Please mark all items with your son's name.

CLOTHING

- Medium weight jacket
- Ranger utility uniform or dress clothes
- One or two RR T-shirts
- Extra pair of shoes (tennis OK)
- Extra change of clothing
- Four pairs of underclothing
- Poncho or raincoat (a must)

PERSONAL ITEMS

- Toilet kit – soap in a case,
- toothbrush in a case, small tube of toothpaste, comb, towel, and wash cloth
- Sleeping bag or two blankets
- Dirty clothes bag
- Bible (small RR OK)

OPTIONAL ITEMS

- Pen or pencil
- Sweat shirt or sweater (may get cool at night)
- Air mattress / Cot and pillow
- Mess kit or plate, utensils
- Bathing suit
- Insect repellent
- Sweat pants
- Spending money for Snack Bar



Ohio Royal Rangers and Parents,

This year I am excited to announce that we are officially rolling out online registration for all our statewide Royal Ranger events starting with The Academy.

Now, by utilizing the same program that Ohio Kids and Youth use to register for Summer Camp, we will be able to streamline the registration process. Starting with Powwow we will use this same software and will continue to use it for each of the following events such as Fall Trace, The Crucible, Spring Rendezvous, and The Academy. This means that if you register for summer camp, all your information is already in there! You just need to log in and select the camp, answer a few questions, submit your payment and you are good to go!

To register you just need to visit www.ohioministry.net/login. If you have registered for kids or youth camp, use the same login, otherwise select "new user." It is recommended that a parent create the account then add their children in the account creation process. This will also help when applying family discounts. Once your account is created you can follow these instructions to get registered:

1. Click on "Reservation" on the left side of the top tool bar.
2. Select "New Reservation" and "Individual Registration"
3. Select the name of the person you would like to register, if their name does not appear you can add names at this time. Once you start the process of registering the first boy, there will be an option to add additional names before completing the registration.
4. You will then see a list of available camps, select the camp to start the registration process. (Keep in mind the prices shown are for the cost of the camp only, check with your Outpost for any additional cost related to meal, activities, etc.

I understand that this will take some time to get used to, but once that happens, I believe it will make registration for all Ranger events easier, more streamlined, provide more accurate attendance counts, and centralized health and safety information.

3201 COUNTY RD 225, MARENGO , OH 43334

FROM I - 71

Take Exit 140, and go south on State Route 61

Turn right (west) on County Road 15 also called West Liberty Mt Vernon Road

Note: County Road 15 will go back over I-71

Turn right (north) on County Road 218 also called Berkshire-South Woodbury Road

Turn left (west) on County Road 225 also called West Liberty East Road

The entrance to Heartland is on the right!



FROM ROUTE 23

Turn east on State Route 229

Note: Continue through the town of Ashley

Turn right (south) on County Road 218 also called Berkshire-South Woodbury Road

Note: you will come to a sharp left curve.

After the curve, Turn right to stay on Country Road 218

Turn right (west) on County Road 225 also called West Liberty East Road

The entrance to Heartland is on the right!
