OUR FIREFIGHTERS ATTEND TRAINING CLASSES

There are many things happening at the fire department this year. Winter is the time when things kind of slow down, especially in the area of wild land fires and the threat it can bring. Unfortunately, we still do the normal things like heart attacks, car wrecks and stuff like that. During this slow down the emphasis goes to training. It is an opportunity created by the shorter days, nastier weather and more volunteers at home to do some education. Seems today in the fire service training and education are constant necessities while at the same time the demands of what is expected of fire fighters grow ever larger.

Last fall I got together with the Chiefs of the Garden Valley Fire Protection District and the Georgetown Fire Protection District to discuss the possibility of putting together a joint training program for new volunteer fire fighters. In looking at the similarity of what we do, the terrain we do it in, the equipment we use and the all volunteer fire fighters we have we felt it was time for us to come together and put a training program in place. The Georgetown Divide Fire Academy was formed with the full intent of providing a basic fire fighter course for all new volunteers. With all three districts participating it was quite evident there was a great deal of talent and capabilities available for teaching and providing experience and support. A Lesson Plan was developed that would fit the needs of a new person wanting to become a volunteer fire fighter. In January we started the fire academy with instructors from all three fire departments. In this academy are 21 new volunteers who are training with each other in areas throughout the Divide. This gives us an opportunity to share our teaching resources, equipment, and experience while at the same time giving these volunteers an opportunity to work with other fire fighters. After this academy is completed there will be a formal graduation for all who completed the program with each volunteer fire fighter receiving their Districts badge, a certificate of completion and our gratitude.

Today there are many things expected of a fire fighter. Not only do we have to know how to deal with the suppression of a structure fire along with the possible rescue involved in it, the control of a wild land fire and the structure protection problems that go with it, the mitigation of a vehicle accident, the removal of a cat from a tree and the most important is how to provide medical aid to a patient in need, but now we are being asked to develop the abilities to deal with new threats that the state will be requiring of all fire departments.

Along with being able to respond to a 911 incident there are behind the scene requirements of the volunteers such as passing the driving program in order to acquire a driving license, CPR certificates, automatic defibrillation certificates, and emergency medical technician certificates. Other requirements such as hazardous materials awareness, confined space, over the bank rope rescue and swift water rescue are also part of what is expected. I often wonder how these people can do what they do

considering what is expected of them along with managing their own lives, their families and their professions. But that is not all, the State is now coming out with new demands that really do not apply to our fire district but we may still have to deal with, such as dealing with terrorists, biological, and chemical incidents, things that were not even thought of just two years ago. I just hope if the state mandates this kind of stuff they give us the money to pay for it.

Two years ago the Board of Directors of the District desired to increase the Districts ability to offer a higher medical standard to the community. They developed a policy where all volunteer fire fighters must be EMTs and they backed this up with money, support and commitment. In order to carry this policy out an Emergency Medical Technician class will be developed and put into affect within the next month. Jerry Okumura and I will be teaching this class with the assistance of other fire fighters serving as proctors. Not only will we be instructing an EMT class we will be attempting to enhance this program by teaching the utilization of an airway device called a Combitube. This device is designed to be inserted into someone who has a compromised airway, thus providing them with oxygen. All that is required for us to do this is support from the El Dorado County Emergency Medical Association and I am working on that process right now.

This Emergency Medical Technician class is offered to anyone in the community who is interested in taking it. Just call me at the station and I will answer any questions you may have.

Winter is far from over even though we have had fantastic weather for the past month. It has been difficult to believe that it is in fact winter and not spring. There is still plenty of opportunity for rain and snow before the real spring is here so be careful.

CUCUMBER SALAD

1 tsp. sugar

1/4 c rice or tarragon vinegar

2 T vegetable oil

½ tsp. salt

pepper -- freshly ground is best -- to taste

1/4 c fresh herb leaves such as dill or mint

4 small cucumbers -- about 1 pound

Mix sugar, vinegar, oil, salt and pepper in the serving bowl. Mince herbs if using and add to dressing.

Peel cucumbers if desired, then thinly slice and add to bowl. Stir to mix and coat.


