BRIDGE WOES!

Well like the saying states, "you don't know what you have until it is gone." Right now what is gone is the bridge and Mosquito Road. I do hope by the time this article is received the bridge is open. Well, what happened to the bridge for those who have not heard is - someone with an IQ around 42 decided to drive a log skidder across the bridge instead of waiting for a truck and lowboy to haul it to Camino. The individual that did this knows the area and definitely knows the capability of the bridge but just didn't seem to care. That is the frustrating part, as this lack of care and consideration has really placed a hard ship on many of the people in our community.

The Highway Patrol came to the station to get some information from me regarding this mental giant of a

moron clan. At the least, I can say the Patrol Officer was very upset and said he was going to dedicate himself to get this guy because he had a \$10,000 ticket to hand him. The last I heard they know who the individual is but they may not have enough proof. Seems that nowadays in order to prosecute someone they have to be video taped, witnessed by 327 people, given a polygraph, confess, undergo psychiatric evaluation, obtain counseling, and be represented by a legal staff of 14 lawyers and have all this paid for by the citizens that pay taxes. Anyway, the CHP is trying to get enough evidence gathered to slap this guy's wrist.

Fortunately the bridge was not damaged as much as they thought it could have been. Seems a log skidder weighs somewhere over 15 tons and is just about as wide as the bridge. The weight was sure one test for that ole bridge, the cables and substructure underneath were not damaged but the side rails did take a good beating. It could have been much worse with major damage that could have keep the bridge closed for weeks.

In thinking about the hardship on this community it comes down to two things, time and money. Being a numbers kind of a guy I performed a little exercise. Right now a little over one thousand cars a day use Mosquito Road to get anywhere from here. Taking Rock Creek Road adds an additional 30 minutes a day to a commute and that is if it is being driven in a sane manner. One thousand people losing 30 minutes a day works out to 500 hours lost a day. If the bridge is closed for 10 days that amounts to 5000 hours, or 208 days. Now, the extra 5 miles that is added each way for the average person up here adds up to 10,000 miles a day. Over a ten-day period that is 100,000 miles. Lets say with an average vehicle getting 15 miles per gallon that works out to 6,666 gallons of gasoline being used. Now, with gasoline being about \$2.10 a gallon, that is a cost to this community of about \$14,000. To me that is not chump change and when 208 lost days are put in this equation this one person who didn't give a damn got to be pretty expensive.

Let's hope that Ole Bridge never gets closed for any

length of time. Could you imagine if it was closed for 100 days or even worse, closed for good? One good thing about the bridge closure is, as one person told me, he wasn't going to gripe about a pothole on Mosquito Road. Yep, it does point out that you do not really miss anything until it is gone.

In the meantime Rock Creek Road is the only way to get to anywhere. Yep, it is the long road, the high road that no one seems to like. But, when Mosquito Road is open Rock Creek can be a joy. If you drive it slow and easy you will have a chance to look at the flowers, especially in the spring, as they are everywhere. You can stop and look down to the river and realize how large that canyon really is. You can even take a little walk along the road and not get run over by someone in a mad rush to get nowhere. Rock Creek Road is not really a bad way to go, you just have to realize that it will take a few minutes longer but when all other routes fail, at the least it does get you somewhere.

Summer is coming so take the time to clear brush and ground fuels away from your house. In the meantime, be careful

MOSQUITO FIRE SAFE COUNCIL MEETING REPORT

Walter Graves told us about the El Dorado Fire Safe Council pilot program regarding chipping. This grant was for \$50,000 for a crew that is restricted to four communities with the county. They hired a lady, who advertised in the local paper and sent out forms to find someone to do the chipping. However our community is not one of the four that will be involved in this program.

Walter turned in our grant on February 3rd. The Council discussed what to do if the budget is cut, and decided to prepare a plan for \$150,000 and one for \$125,000. Leo discussed the fuel load reduction that the feds did at Slate Mountain and that they need to finish the work they started on the southwest side. Leo was asked - If they do the burn at Slate Mountain will we benefit any thing from this? Answer is no.

The Council discussed the criteria used to award grants, especially the need for National Forest and

Mosquito Fire District land be planned so as to reinforce the work done on each. The strategic plan must be developed in concert with the Eldorado National Forest.

Leo asked the group can we work with \$150,000 and everyone answered yes. A budget committee will be formed, to trim the budget to \$150,000. Joe Lima will head the committee since he is the Treasurer. Walter and Leonard will also be on the committee. The budget will be completed and given to Leo by next week.

Walter said that the grant monies from last year had yet to be sent to us. It has however been approved by the Council. The supervisors had passed it and now it was in the hands of the El Dorado Risk Management and the hold up was due to worker comp. They felt that this money was still going to be given to us. We still have some outstanding bills that need to be paid to individuals who laid out money to get the first mailing out. These individuals will be paid back as soon as we get the money from the El Dorado Fire Safe Council.

When Leo put a letter in the *Mosquito Byte* for a free ride on the fire truck to determine if your driveway is clear enough for fire truck access, he did not have any calls. Leo will put the same invitation in the *Byte* again.

We had to come up with a new contingency plan. John Moalli wrote a letter about access to your driveway and how to improve it. The group will work on the letter and add to this mailing information that the Forestry Service gave us. Gene Bowen, Leonard Newell and John will rewrite the letter to be sure it is current, and circulate if for review. Leonard suggested that we should also do a budget for \$75,000 less (i.e. \$125,000) this will make us prepared for the worse case scenario. The group described how we should educate people and let them take the responsibility for their own property. Leonard suggested that if we do not get the grant, there are other ways people could do the work without a lot of money. He had pictures from his own forest that show an easy way to reduce the fuel load without a lot of work.

Leo said that he would administer the grant once it is in place. He would need our help as the Mosquito Fire Safe Council to verify that the company we hire is completing the chipping and that they are working the prescribed time we contracted for. The equipment purchased with the grant money can be stored in the container at Finnon Lake.

Leo wants to form a volunteer group to be trained to do home inspections. This group would be trained to inspect the clearance of land around the home, placement of propane tanks, and access from the street to the home. He plans to do these inspections in May. He will ask for volunteers and train them on what they need to inspect and how to explain to the homeowner how they can make their home fire safe. They would go door to door and if the homeowner does not want them to inspect their home a letter would be sent to CDF and it is possible that CDF would come out to inspect. If a wild land fire happens, and a home inspection was refused and the home is destroyed, CDF would not be liable.

SOMETHING DIFFERENT

This is just a wonderful way to do catfish. My brother has had to become "chief cook and bottle washer" due to his wife's health and I must say, that he is doing a great job. He had several family members over for dinner and all said that his 'catfish parmesan' was SUPER.

6 catfish (whole or filet)

2 c. dry bread crumbs

3/4 c grated Parmesan or Parmesan-Romano blend

1/4 c chopped parsley

½ tsp Oregano

1/4 tsp Basil

2 tsp salt or to taste

½ tsp pepper

3/4 c margarine or oil

Lemon wedges

Combine bread crumbs, Parmeson cheese, parsley, paprika, oregano, basil, salt and pepper. Dip catfish in melted butter or oil and roll in crumb mixture.

Arrange in well-greased 14x9x2 " baking dish. Bake in preheated 375 degree oven for 25 minutes or until fish flakes easily. Cooking time will be less if using fillets. Garnish with the lemon wedges.

SUMMERFIELD DITCH EID WORKSHOPS

Since meeting with the community and EID at the Fire Station on August 28, 2002, we have named our committee. The name reflects the past ownership of the ditch. However we have made one small change. The committee is now known as The Mosquito District Mutual Water Committee.

The committee focuses on water issues for the entire community. For now, and in the future, our research has revealed that EID has obligations to provide water to Mosquito and we are working with them to determine exactly what those obligations are.

The committee has met a total of six times to discuss the matter. We also have met with EID three times and a lot of ideas were exchanged. EID has been very receptive considering a long term solution to the Summerfield Ditch issue. Some of our ideas include: lining or piping the ditch, the importance of water for fire protection in our lakes and ponds, the possible generation of electric power, agricultural irrigation and recreation at both Finnon and Dyer Lakes.

Just after the **Kelsey fire** in 1994, Chief Ben Scott was asked what importance Finnon Lake played as far

as fire protection was concerned. He stated many more homes would have burned if it were not for Finnon Lake. Many helicopters took water from Finnon Lake at the same time for that one fire.

During the fire at the **Camino Mill** the Sykorski helicopter took on 5,000 gallons of water in less than a minute and was just one of the helicopters dipping from the lake. The other two were the Chinook with a 4,000 gallon bucket and a smaller Bell Jet ranger with a 250 gallon bucket.

During the **Chili Bar fire** in 1979 a fire truck would pump water from Dyer Lake. Then they would mix it with Foschex (that red stuff) on site and a helicopter would then take off to dump the load at the end of Triple R Road. This is what saved our community from total conflagration.

Our lakes and ponds not only service our community but many others. Water may be only one of the things needed to survive but it is a very important one.
