#### FIRE SAFE COUNCIL

The Fire Safe Council had a meeting July 19 at the Fire Station. The next step for the obtaining a Grant for fuel reduction for fire safety in our area was explained. An RFP (request for proposal) for the Fire Safe Plan is being written. About 15 people came to the meeting and Leo explained what we are trying to do and about the area that the grant will address. Mosquito and the National Forest are the areas the grant will cover and principally brush and a few diseased trees will be cleared.

## REALLY MOSQUITO

Mosquito is certainly the correct name for this area as I recently discovered while doing some clearing in Jaybird Creek. It didn't take long to be dotted with welts over my face and arms and itching like crazy.

Mosquitos are more than a nuisance, they can also cause disease. They can spread heartworms to your dogs and even your cats. Dogs are the natural host and can be infected after being bitten by an infected mosquito. The mosquito injects larvae with its bite into the dog's tissues and the larvae then migrate to the bloodstream where they hitch a ride to the heart. With enough bites the large vessels of the heart can become filled with worms and cause severe symptoms and even death. Signs to look for are coughing and exercise intolerance. Heartworms can be detected by a simple blood test. Treatment is available, but expensive, and not without risk. You can prevent heartworms in your pets by putting them on one of the several preventatives that are available through your veterinarian.

#### **SCPOA REPORT**

Our maintenance person Tod Sorrell has been hard at work at Dyer Lake. New sand has been placed on both the east and west sides of the lake, the pavilion, pump house and bathrooms all have

new roofs. Sand has also been placed on the beach area at Catfish Lake and the replacement of the old wood fence with new vinyl is continuing. The bathometric mapping process has been completed at Dyer Lake that will allow for a very precise chemical treatment of the lake to get rid of the unwanted vegetation. This is the same treatment that was used on Trout Lake last year and has yielded fantastic results. The chemical used is called Sonar and is safe for humans and wildlife including fish and should be applied the first part of August.

The SCPOA board is working on common area improvements and would like more input from the community. Included in the midyear packet is an information sheet for feedback on several possible projects. What would you like at Dyer Lake? Some suggestions have included: a walking trail around the lake with the possible additions of some workout/stretching stations and swing sets. Another idea being looked at is to build a community center/office at Dyer Lake; more information on this project will be included in the packet. We need your suggestions about Dyer Lake as well as the other common areas, please forward your inputs to the board and fill out the questionnaire when you receive it. The board is still investigating the possibility of acquiring the Dogwood well from EID as well as working out details of a meter to provide water for Dyer Lake. We need to keep the lakes full in the summer and are trying to find the most economical way to accomplish this. We are having a problem with vandalism at Dyer Lake and will have to consider some options including locking the bathrooms at night and using surveillance to catch and prosecute the individuals doing the damage.

#### VANDALISM

We are having a chronic problem at Dyer Lake and other common areas with vandals causing damage. The toilets and sinks in the restroom are plugged with toilet paper and the water turned on to cause flooding. Other damage has been done to the restrooms and picnic tables have been thrown in the lake. The most disturbing incident involved nails from a nail gun that were cut into sections, twisted and thrown into the swimming area at Dyer Lake, needless to say this could cause serious injury. The damage seems to be done mostly by juveniles and is costing all of us money for repairs. We have a few possible leads as to some of the perpetrators and will be pursuing these leads. We would encourage

anyone with information on any damage done to any common area to contact SCPOA at 621-0309. We will be working with the sheriffs department to aggressively pursue those responsible and may consider locking the bathrooms at night and monitoring the area with surveillance. We would like to strongly encourage everyone to participate in protecting our common property so that we can all continue to enjoy it.

### **SWEET TOOTH?**

I found this in an insert of the Mountain Democrat, so many of you may have seen it there. I made some and it is easier than regular fudge and tastes great.

Frying Pan Fudge

2 1/2 cups sugar

1 cube margarine or butter

6 oz. canned milk (I used fat free)

6 oz. semi-sweet chocolate chips

1 cup chopped pecans or your choice of nuts

1 tsp. vanilla flavoring

½ cup coconut (optional)

Chop nuts and set aside

Mix sugar and margarine in a heavy frying pan until margarine is soft (not melted), add milk and bring to a boil. Reduce heat to low and cook six more minutes, stirring occasionally. Remove from heat and add chocolate chips and chopped nuts. Stir until fudge begins to form. Quickly add vanilla flavoring. Drop fudge on wax paper with a teaspoon. Let cool. Store in an airtight container.

I am going to try this using butterscotch chips for our son who cannot eat chocolate. Will let you know the results.
