

BUSY SUMMER – AND IT'S ONLY HALF OVER !

Well here we are right in the middle of the fire season and so far it has been a rather busy one. At the least it has been busier than normal, so far this summer we have had more wild land fires than we have had in the past three summers. I hope this trend does not continue, as it will be just a matter of time when one does start and takes off burning up everything it can. Fortunately, we have had great responses from the Volunteer Fire Fighters on the fires we have had, they have been right on them getting them out before they get too large.

One of the fires we had was at the east end of Dyer Lake. It was started by a lawn mower at 10:30 in the morning. Apparently the blade hit a rock and that created enough of a spark to ignite the grass. Normally at this time of the year in the morning mowing grass will not start a fire but this summer conditions are extremely dry. About two minutes after our fire started another one started in the Coloma area. I gave a report to our Dispatch of a fire with a rapid rate of spread and structures threatened in about ten minutes. What reassured me on this fire was that Battalion 4512 the CDF chief for the north part of the county stated our fire was a priority and all aircraft and resources will be diverted to it. That made me feel much better, but then I realized that the Swansboro Pilots Association were having a fly-in and were having lunch at Dyer Lake. The big worry here was the planes coming and going from the airport and the CDF aircraft coming in from Grass Valley and a Forest Service helicopter responding from Big Hill. I was concerned about a lot of aircraft in a small airspace at the same time, especially the helicopter as he is normally here in about 9 minutes and he would be coming in to Trout Lake to get water for bucket drops. Fortunately, we were able to get a wet line around the head of the fire and calm it down real quickly. I canceled the aircraft and they were diverted to the fire in Coloma and suddenly the airspace was not quite as crowded.

Just the other day at five in the afternoon we were dispatched for a wild land fire on Mosquito Road just north of the river. Now, this kind of fire is my biggest nightmare. This is a fire that if it has any size or opportunity is one that we probably will not be able to put out until it goes to the top of the canyon wall. That canyon wall, especially at the bridge is too steep to put fire fighters on and the fuel is so thick that a fire fighters safety is put at risk. Fortunately, it turned out to be a false call. I think someone coming up the road got in a bad situation at the first switch back after the bridge and just burned a bunch of rubber off their tires filling the canyon with some smoke. Someone then coming along a few minutes later saw the smoke and called it in on 911. Now, I am grateful they called it in; being cautious is a wise thing to be.

One thing that did come out of this was the dispatch response that was given our District. Resources for a wild land fire are dispatched based on weather conditions, temperature, humidity, time of the day, resource availability and the number of fires in the region. So it is possible to have a fire dispatched as a wild land fire low, or wildland fire medium, or as a wild land fire high. In this case the dispatch was as a wild land fire high and resulted in a dispatch that consisted of Battalion 4512, me, all our equipment, two helicopters, two air tankers, airco (the guy who runs the air show), one CDF prevention officer, two battalion chiefs from County Fire, five local engines, ten CDF engines, one ambulance, two hand crews, one dozer, one helitender, two USFS engines, one USFS Division Chief, and one USFS patrol unit. All in all we had about half the world coming this direction. This kind of a response definitely increases my comfort level.

We have just gone through one of the driest springs in 80 years. The grass and brush are as dry

as they would normally be in September. Please be careful out there. Enjoy the summer but be wise.

SCPOA REPORT

Our maintenance work continues with Johnathan working on brush removal, he is waiting for a delivery of cutback so that he can continue the process of filling potholes. He is in the process of purchasing the welder/cutter that was approved last month for tractor maintenance and picnic table fabrication as well as looking into the proper doors that need to be purchased and installed on the bathrooms. At this point the vandalism of the bathrooms seems to have decreased but the plan to install lockable doors will be implemented.

There is a significant increase in building up here this year, there are at least 7 houses under construction with one new set of plans to be reviewed. There are 3 houses that have received permits without architectural committee review and letters will be sent out to the owners.

The budget and long range committee will have its first meeting on July 22, please contact Tee through the SCPOA secretary (621-0309) if you are interested in participating. If you have concerns about how the money is spent in this community this is the best way to become educated on the subject as well as have input.

Dyer and Trout Lake have had their second review and treatment by Aquatic Environments and look great. The water level in Dyer was raised using the new system that EID installed and after assessing the cost we will be able to determine how full we can keep the lake and stay within our budget. We will be ordering sand for the beaches but due to an almost 50% increase in price this year, we will only be able to get 2 transferees. Since Dyer is used by the most people we will concentrate on that first with the pavilion area being the priority.

For those of you who drive to the Lakes we would like to ask that you please not park in front of the chained access areas. Last month when a fire broke out at Dyer Lake the fire engines had a difficult time due to a car parked in front of the chain, please leave this space open in case access is needed.

A proposal was suggested and passed that we move our payroll services from Wells Fargo to Paychecks. Wells Fargo has the work done outside the USA and Paychecks does it within as well as offers direct deposit for the same price.

Another suggestion was made to separate our operational and reserve funds into two different banks, Wells Fargo and El Dorado Savings. The reserve funds can be placed in CD's that are timed to when we need them, this way we can get the maximum interest for the time that the funds a sitting.

The airport and road committees are waiting for bids for the work to be done this year from the three companies selected. As soon as we have the bids we will determine who will do the work, we will publish the name in the Byte so that anyone wishing to have driveway or other work done can also get a bid and hopefully get a better price since they will already be here.

We are still looking for people interested in running for the board next year, we will have four vacancies. Next meeting is August 14th, please plan to attend and get involved with your community.

EVACUATION ROUTE BRUSHING TO BEGIN

Mr. David Gonfiotti, doing business as Gonfiotti Brush Removal and Tree Service, was the successful bidder on our Operations Contract for this year. Mr. Gonfiotti has worked for several residents of Mosquito, with good results. His bid is well below any of the other three received. He plans to begin operations in Segment 1 (Mosquito Road from Swansboro Rd. to Lupin Ln., and Lupin Ln. from Mosquito Rd. to Stope Drive) on Monday July 26. If you live in this segment, please be sure that trees within 50 feet of the road edge are blue-flagged, if you want to reserve them.

Segment 2 (Stope Dr. from Lupin Ln. to Log Cabin Ln., to Maidu, and Maidu from Dogwood Ln. to Stope Drive) will probably be done in September. More on the schedule in the next issue of the *Byte*.

The work will begin early in the morning, around 6:00 AM, in order to take advantage of the coolest daylight hours, when fire safety is highest, and to maximize production with a small crew. Any inconvenience or annoyance is regretted. We put up with many noises, and few of them are beneficial to our safety as these will be. Please try to think of it as the sound of fire safety.

If you have not yet sent in your Landowner Agreement, and your property is in any of Segments 1-5, your signed Agreement can still be considered for work under this contract. Please send it to Lynda Lima, 3814 Stope Dr. and she will add your property to the "pending" file in the database. We may not have enough funds for everyone who wants to participate, so we'll take them "first come, first served" basis.


HOUSEHOLD TRASH
