GROWTH IN THE DISTRICT

In an attempt to keep up with some of the happenings in the District I try to drive around at least twice a week. By doing so I look for new homes that have gone in, the condition of driveways, the amount of brush around some of the homes, things like that. One thing that I have noticed in the District is all the new homes that have been built in just the past year. Driving around twice a week is not enough; I may have to start doing it four times a week just to keep up with all the new growth.

The Buckboard and Gold Trail area as well as Log Cabin Lane have seen a great deal of growth. I was counting just recently that there are only about 8 lots that are available to have a house built on them on Buckboard. Used to be I could look through that area and only see grass, a few trees, deer and many turkeys. Now the predominate thing to see is homes.

Up off of Log Cabin Lane and Stope Drive there are more homes going in then can be seen from the roads. They are tucked way back with long narrow driveways with brush out front to hide them.

Just the other day two highway patrol officers, a lead car, and a huge manufactured home, with another lead car, and a highway patrol officer following went past the fire station. After a couple of hours just for kicks I went looking for where this half of a large house went. I haven't found it yet. It either went up to somewhere on Dogwood, and then I heard it may have gone to Ponderosa Grove and the latest information was that it went to One Eye Creek. In time I will find it especially now that on the following day the other half with the full escort went past the station. For something this large I am having a hard time finding it, but I shall.

With the growth taking place I thought I would get some information on how much the Mosquito District is worth, that is valued as the County Tax Assessor sees it. Seems that in the fiscal year of 2003/04 the

entire District had an assessed value of \$79,339,000 and in fiscal 2004/05 that value jumped to \$87,134,000. The estimate I am now getting from the County is that for fiscal 2005/06 the value will be around \$105,000,000. That is a rather good increase in just three years, around 24%. A lot of that is not only the many homes that have been built but also the fact that the median price for a house in our district is now around \$400,000. That just baffles my poor mind, as I recall paying \$14,000 for 20 acres when I first moved here in 1974. Kind of makes me wish I had the money at that time to buy up as much land as possible, but as usual foresight makes a genius out of all us while money can prove it.

With all this new growth the traffic on Mosquito Road has greatly increased and I am completely surprised by the fact that we have not had an increase in vehicle accidents. With the majority of people driving as close to being out of control as possible I do not understand why we are not pulling out of the station at least once a day to an accident. Guess people are getting real good at dodging each other and knowing exactly what bank they can go up when someone is driving down the middle of the road.

Well so much on what is quite obvious, Mosquito is finally starting to grow. But then we should all know that will happen, because it is a great place to live.

Be careful out there. We have already had a couple of rather large wild land fires. They were caused by escaped control burns by people with the best of intentions. Make sure you have a burn permit, so you have the right information on how to burn and the correct burn day information phone number. And if you do have a problem with a fire that gets away from you, please do not hesitate to call 911 and we will be right up to put it out.

You can acquire a burn permit at the fire station; we try to be there seven days a week from 8:00 in the morning to 5:00 in the evening. There are times tough when we are not because of business in the District and in town. Again, be careful and take advantage of the next month to get the ground fuels removed from around you home.

SCPOA REPORT

Our April meeting had a very small turnout but we would like to thank those who were able to attend. We had one board member resign so we will be looking for a replacement, anyone who is interested please contact the SCPOA secretary at 621-0309. We will also be needing three candidates for next year.

Our maintenance worker Johnathan is continuing to keep our community looking great. New fencing has been ordered and should arrive shortly. Road patching will continue as the ground dries out, the very wet winter has been hard on the roads and lots of soft spots have developed. We will be ordering sand for the beaches as we near the end of the rainy season and having the lakes evaluated for treatment.

A new issue was brought up about horses around Dyer Lake. Johnathan has had to clean up manure piles from inside the pavilion as well as fill deep holes in the grass. Riding around Dyer Lake is a pleasure but please be considerate of everyone else. If the ground is still soft stay off the grass so you don't leave deep holes which could injure another horse or person. Having a horse in the pavilion on the cement is not the safest footing and if your horse leaves a mess please find a way to clean it up so others won't have to. **This is a picnic area.**

One of our members will be having his model sailing club racing at Dyer Lake on May 15th. Anyone who is interested is welcome to watch. Some of the boats are up to 6 ft in length, they are radio controlled and will be racing around a course. One class will consist of America's cup models.

A reminder that you have until April 30th to pay your assessment for this year. After that date late fees will start to be applied. With property mergers that are in process we will be down to 701 parcels this year.

The architectural committee has been busy, they approved three sets of plans last month and another three are on hold awaiting additional information.

The budget and long range planning committee plans to hold a meeting this month. If you are interested in participating please contact the secretary so she can put you in touch with them.

We have lots of road work to do this year and are in the process of updating the bids from last year and adding in work planned for this year. We still have the two companies that submitted bids last year and will contact the third one to see if they are interested in bidding this year.

Lots of time and energy was spent by the airport committee trying to resolve the tree problem with the one remaining homeowner who had not cleared trees next to the runway. The runway has been reopened and there were a few additional items that CALTRANS wanted to have done as soon as possible, most have already been taken care of by volunteers. The cement poles at the west end of the runway will need to be removed and replaced with single rail vinyl fencing. The poles can then be relocated and placed around the hole on Swansboro Road at the base of the Dyer Lake damn.

The web site committee would like to get the web site updated. Due to some confusion regarding what is currently on the site a suggestion was made to get copies of the DC&R's from the county and scan them in. A revised resolution regarding recording of meetings was reviewed and passed.

The only person allowed to record a meeting is the secretary for purposes of minutes. This was done to be sure that everyone is able to express their opinions and ideas free of possible intimidation.

A new problem was brought to our attention by a member who recently moved here and had his house broken into. Our fire Chief Leo Chaloux stated that there has been a recent problem with people in trucks that look like contractors breaking into houses and stealing large amounts sometimes in multiple trips. In this case they broke in the front door to a house that is in a busy area and nobody noticed. With all of the construction going on we see lots of work trucks everywhere so we need to keep an eye out for anything that looks suspicious.

Our next meeting will be May 14th at 10:00 AM at the firehouse, we hope you will join us.

TRIED AND TRUE RECIPE

Old-Fashioned Green Beans and Bacon

- ¾ lb. fresh green beans, cut, cooked and drained
- 8 slices bacon, diced
- 2 medium sized potatoes, peeled and cut into ½ inch pieces
- 1 small onion, sliced thin
- ¼ cup water
- ½ tsp salt

1. While beans are cooking, fry bacon until crisp.
2. Add potatoes, green beans, and remaining ingredients to bacon and fat. Cook covered about 15 minutes, or until potatoes are tender. About 4 servings. If you think there is too much fat, drain some and stir a couple of times to make sure nothing sticks

YOUR PET QUESTIONS

Q: Every time I call the vet for advice He wants me to bring my dog in for an exam. Can't you just answer simple questions without having to see the animal?

A: Yes, no, maybe, sometimes. When you call your vet, he/she may not be available to talk to you and the support staff is instructed to set aside time for your pet to be evaluated in the office. If you are able to speak directly to him/her, the questions asked and answers given may alert your vet to a problem that needs further attention. Over the phone the veterinarian can not see the "picture" that you are describing and wishes to err on the side of caution and have the animal brought in for an exam.

We have seen enough cases of "a little sick/hurt" that end up qualifying as a major illness/trauma or "on death's door" being a simple toenail bleed that we feel to best serve you and your animals, they should be brought in for an exam. If the questions you ask can not be answered by the support staff and you are concerned--then your vet is also concerned and wants to see your pets.

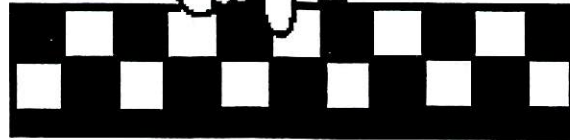
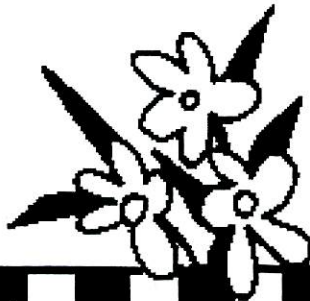
