Chief's Corner

My article in the Byte a couple of months ago announced that I would have some additional information regarding the new State Law requiring 100 feet of clearance around all structures. This new requirement went into effect on January 1st of this year. Its purpose is to provide a defensible space around a building or structure. In our District, the inspecting and enforcement agency for this requirement is the California Division of Forestry and Fire Protection. So do not be surprised if you see CDF&FP personnel during the spring inspecting Mosquito/Swansboro properties for compliance.

From a fire fighting and structure defense stand point this new 100 feet of clearance makes a great deal of sense. The old 30 feet of clearance was put into effect about 50 years ago, not to protect structures from an advancing wild land fire but to protect the wild land from a structure fire. However, with the large numbers of people moving into the wild land areas, what we now call the urban interface, the tactics and emphasis on wild land fire fighting has changed.

Back in the old days a wild land fire called for an aggressive attack made on the fire front and continuing until control and suppression were achieved. Today, we are almost immediately put into the position of using our resources to defend structures from the wild land fire and thereby limiting our suppression activity on the fire. Thus, the wild land fire continues to grow larger threatening more structures, requiring more resources for defense and so on. With the large number of structures lost to wild land fires in the past several years, the State realized that the 30 feet of clearance was simply not enough to adequately and safely protect a house.

Please understand that this new regulation does not mean you have to clear-cut everything around your house for 100 feet. The majority of us live up here because of the trees and what they offer to us.

However, there are many things that can be done to minimize the impact that a wild land fire might have on your land and the threat to your house. If you have any questions, or would desire to have an "informal" inspection of your house to see how you are doing meeting this new requirement please contact me or Devery at the fire station (626.9017) and we will be glad to come out. Following is the defensible space criteria set forth in the Public Resources Code.

14 CCR, Division 1.5, Chapter 7 Fire Protection, Subchapter 3.

Defensible Space Regulations, Section 1299.

The intent of this regulation is to provide guidance for implementing the defensible space criteria of Public Resources Code 4291 (a) and (b) and minimize the spread of fire within a 100 foot zone around a building or structure.

- (a) A person that owns, leases, controls, operates, or maintains a building or structure in, upon, or adjoining any mountainous area, forest-covered lands, brush-covered lands, grass-covered lands, or any land that is covered with flammable material, and is within State Responsibility Area, shall do the following:
 - (1.) Within 30 feet from each building or structure maintain a firebreak by removing and clearing away all flammable vegetation and other combustible growth pursuant to PRC section 4291 (a).
 - (2.) Within the 30 feet to 100 feet zone (Reduced Fuel Zone) from each building or structure (or to the property line, whichever is nearer to the structure), provide a fuel break by disrupting the vertical and/or horizontal continuity of flammable and combustible vegetation with the goal of reducing fire intensity, inhibiting fire in the crowns of trees, reducing the rate of fire spread, and providing a safer environment for

firefighters to suppress wildfire.

- (b) Any vegetative fuels identified as a fire hazard by the fire inspecting official of the authority having jurisdiction, shall be removed or modified provided it is required by subsection (a) (1) & (a) (2).
- (c) Within the intent of the regulations, the fire inspection official of the authority having jurisdiction may approve alternative practices which provide for the same practical effects as the stated guidelines.
- (d) Guidance for implementation of this regulation shall be consistent with procedures contained in the publication: "General Guidelines to Implement Performance Based Defensible Space Regulations under PRC 4291" as adopted by the Board of Forestry and Fire Protection.

Note: Authority cited: Section 4102, 4291, 4125-4128.5, Public Resource Code. Reference: 4291. Public Resource Code.

Mosquito Road Closure Update

Kris Payne, Supervising Civil Engineer from El Dorado County Department of Transportation provided the following information for the Byte on January 19th.

Aerial photos of the site were completed on January 17th. Drilling and soil sampling was finished on January 17th. Soil samples were sent to the Lab for analysis on January 18th.

Exploration of soil competency for foundation repair has begun. Soil profiling, which helps to determine the sub structure of soil began on January 19th. That information will be used to determine the type of repair that is needed. Engineering solutions are just beginning.

Mr. Payne also reported that DOT Maintenance has completed the placement of the guide markers on Rock Creek Road and placed sand bags in the slide area on Mosquito Road to divert water away from the damaged areas during future rains.

The brush clearing along Dogwood has started thanks to the Fire Safe Council's work. Johnathan, our maintenance person is taking advantage of their efforts to help improve drainage and do some road repair. The section of Dogwood Lane between

Mosquito Road and Stope Drive will be closed periodically for safety while the work is being done.

The issue of which fencing SCPOA is obligated to maintain was brought up at the January meeting. This particular issue has been addressed by a prior board, however it was felt that further information was needed before a decision could be made.

Our treasurer gave account updates. A question was raised as to why SCPOA uses Wells Fargo Bank for our checking account when they charge us so many fees. This will be looked into with the new fiscal year for possible changes.

Once again with the start of the new Board terms, the budget and long range planning meetings will begin. Anyone who is interested in working on these committees are encouraged to let our secretary know so you can be included.

The architectural committee had a slower month. Three plans are pending and a letter will be going out to a property owner who received a permit but hasn't submitted plans for review.

As we all know Mosquito Road will be closed for an unknown amount of time while repairs are planned and executed. This puts all of us on Rock Creek Road which is constantly busy in both directions. Please give yourself extra travel time so you can proceed slowly. There is room for two vehicles on the road if everyone stays on their side and

maintains a safe speed. Lets all have some patience and keep it safe.

Our next meeting will be the annual meeting at which time we will be voting for new board members. It will be held on Saturday February 11th at 10:00 AM at the fire station.
