Chief's Corner by Chief Leo Chaloux

Finally we got some decent weather. I sure was getting tired of having it rain every Monday for the past seven weeks, after all that is my day off and it was sure hard to do anything outside. Looking forward to some decent weather and hopefully an opportunity to burn some of the brush I have cut over the past couple of months. Seems that getting brush burned is getting harder and harder to do, between bad weather and air quality control it is almost impossible.

One other thing about nice weather this time of the year is what it does to the vegetation, especially after a wet spring like the one we have just had. It sure makes it grow fast and tall. In driving around and looking at the fuel reduction areas along the sides of the roads in the Swansboro area it is real evident how fast the vegetation can grow. Especially the Madrone, it is really coming up fast. I strongly encourage everyone who benefitted from the fuel reduction grants we have obtained to remove the young sprouts and shoots that are coming up. If not, within a few years the fire danger will be right back and a great deal of money will have been wasted.

Talking about fuel reduction grants we have managed to obtain a second Proposition 40 Watershed protection grant. I applied for an additional \$137,000 to complete the entire community according to our strategic plan but, unfortunately I was only able to obtain another \$53,975. Now, I am not complaining and I sure do not want to be ungrateful. However, instead of getting everything done at once it will have to be strung out over a longer period of time. So some of you who have been waiting for fuel reduction work to take place on your property please be patient. Our goal is to get everything our plan calls for completed, it is simply a matter of time.

These latest rounds of grants are designed to protect and defend watershed areas. Since our District is a

severe threat to a large portion of the South Fork of the American River watershed it was possible for us to qualify for this money. Unfortunately, these grants are a little more restrictive than the first US Forest Service Grant we received. The State wants us to cut more fuel and trees off the properties that want to participate and also no fuel can be removed within 100 feet of someone's house. Seems the State thinks that since that is a property owner's responsibility the State should not have to fund it. My only concern is that these new demands will eliminate a lot of property owners who do not want to participate. At the least we will address the problems as they arise and work toward eliminating as much fuel as possible from the sides of the main roads.

The new clearance requirement of 100 feet or to the property line around a structure is on the books and will be enforced. The California Division of Forestry and Fire Protection will be attempting to inspect all houses in the area for the proper 100 feet of clearance. So do not be surprised if you see someone from the CDF&FP up here this spring walking around your house. Now is the time to cut all ground fuels to meet this new requirement. There is no need to clear-cut everything around your house, just the ground fuels. There is also no need to rake every bit of vegetation down to raw dirt either. What needs to be done is to eliminate any fuels that can allow a fire to burn up into the higher trees causing more fire and heat and a direct exposure to your house.

Also, look at your driveway and ask yourself this question. Can I get a \$200,000 motor home down my driveway without tearing it up? If you can honestly say that you can't, than you need to start working on it. What we need is a driveway at least 10 feet wide with a good asphalt or gravel surface and all fuel removed at least five feet from both sides. As far as height goes there should be no limbs or any other overhangs for at least 15 feet. Those Code 3 light bars on top of our fire equipment cost about \$2000 apiece and it is rough on the budget when they get ripped off. Try to remember

that if a wild land fire is coming towards your house we want to be able to get a fire engine to your house as quickly and safely as possible and then be able to get out again without anyone getting hurt. One other thing about driveways, we also have to be able to get to you if you have a medical need at any time under the worst of conditions.

Believe it our not the bad weather we have had in the past two months will be ending soon and we will be in the middle of summer. Prepare your house now so that it can be defended if there is a fire coming towards it. Hopefully that will never happen, but being prepared if it does could save a house or possibly a life.

Fire Safe Council by Debbie Rood

Hello sunshine! Only 3 days of sun and it looks like spring all over. It's so beautiful. A year ago all I had to do was enjoy watching everything grow. This year I am President of the FSC so I have to look past all the green and realize the danger that lies ahead. Last year we had far less rain and pretty much skipped spring and went straight to summer. We have no way of knowing how long spring will last but one thing we do know is that because of all the rain this year the grass and brush will be growing out of control before we know it. This will obviously result in an EXTREMELY HIGH FIRE DANGER this year. So beware and be aware! Please pay attention to your surroundings. When you notice the grass needs to be cut - cut it. When you tell yourself "it can wait until next week", remember last year. If we go straight to 100 degrees again, one week is all it takes to go from green to brown, then it's too late! One spark from a lawnmower, tractor, chainsaw or motorcycle is all it takes and dry grass can burn faster than most of us can run/especially when it comes from behind.

The evacuation drill will be held Saturday June 17th from 11 to 2. This is such an important event especially since Mosquito Road is currently closed and Rock Creek will be closed except for use by emergency vehicles ONLY in case of a fire. Depending on where the fire is, it is possible there will be no way off the mountain. So please mark your calendars and plan to attend this event. You will receive valuable information that could be critical to your survival.

Remember the only one responsible for your safety is YOU! Hope to see you there. The May FSC meeting is cancelled due to Memorial Day weekend.

SCPOA Report

One of the most important issues for our May meeting is the condition of our roads and the work that is to be done on them. Our problem has always been that we do not have enough money to do all the work our roads require. This last winter, the increase in traffic, heavy trucks and lots of rain have taken a significant toll on our roads and we are seeing failures even in places that had been in decent shape. Our current budget, which is an accumulation of the last three years, will only allow for repair of approximately 3 3/4 of the 21 miles of roads we have. The cost increase of road work over the past 5 years has been running about 23% with a potential of a greater increase this year. The road committee is looking for ways to do the needed work within budget and if necessary how to finance the additional work needed. This will be discussed at the next meeting when we have some estimates of all that needs to be done.

The budget and long range planning committee will begin meeting in June, this is an important committee and anyone with an interest is encouraged to attend.

The architectural committee approved 2 more plans last month with 2 more pending.

We need to emphasize the importance of maintaining the area cleared by the fire safe grant as well as the areas around our property and houses. SCPOA will be hiring a professional to do the growth control for the common areas that have been cleared.

There was a suggestion from the floor made to start discussions with DOT about changing the designation of our airport in the hopes of getting night operations back. This change could allow for a limited number of operations by owners only and might allow us to keep some of the trees that are currently a problem.

The midyear packet will be coming out in June and several items will be added such as: a form that members can fill out if they are interested in running for the SCPOA board and information about controlling plant growth.

Our next meeting will be May 13th at 10:00 AM at the firehouse, an important discussion about road repair is on the agenda. We encourage everyone to attend.
