Chief Chaloux to Retire

After 30 years of dedicated service to the Mosquito Fire Protection District and the community, Chief Leo Chaloux announced his plans to retire effective January 14, 2007. Chief Chaloux informed the District Board of his intentions at the June Board Meeting, saying that he has had an exciting and fulfilling career but now wants to spend more time with Chris and his grandchildren (number two will be here by then). Leo also said that he and Chris have no plans to "move off the hill" and he will remain active with the District as a volunteer.

The Board thanked Leo for his service to the District and the community noting that he has been such a stabilizing force for so long that his departure will certainly be a significant loss. But, we are fortunate that he will still be around to help out if the need arises.

Speaking of help, would you like to help the Fire Protection District Board select the new Fire Chief? Since this is a matter of great concern to all of the residents in this community, the District Board would like to have community input into the hiring of Leo's replacement. The Board is establishing a "Screening Panel" made up of 1 Board Member, 1 Volunteer Firefighter, 1 Support Group member and 2 members of the community-at-large. The panel's role will be to "screen the applications and hold initial interviews with applicants". Then identify, for the Board, the 2-3 best qualified candidates. Chief's Corner

Two years ago the Fire District developed an Evacuation Plan. The basic concept of the plan is, in the event of a major emergency, to be able to get people from the scene of the emergency to a temporary safe haven. Some of the problems we foresaw were the lack of an immediate response from the Sheriffs Office, long response times for responding mutual aid resources and the potential lack of safe roads people can use to travel on. One advantage that we do have is a safe place people can evacuate to, that being the Swansboro runway.

The major threat we face in our District is from a wildland fire. If an evacuation is determined necessary in the event of a large or quickly moving wildland fire the evacuation responsibility rests with of the El Dorado County Sheriffs Office. We Fire Firefighters do not have the legal authority to order

anyone to evacuate. State law gives that authority to law enforcement. A problem with this for us is how long it takes law enforcement to get up here, notify people of the threat and then get everyone organized and moving out. Therefore, the Fire District determined that the best thing to do was to prepare an evacuation plan, establish a safe shelter in place location, make the major evacuation routes as safe as possible, place signs throughout the area showing the evacuation route, and then test the whole process.

What we have done over the past couple of years is develop in writing an evacuation plan. This plan was mailed to ever property owner in the District and is available here at the station if anyone needs one. Several grants were also obtained that made it possible to clear 50 feet of brush off the major evacuation routes, and 25 feet off the secondary routes. Signs were also placed at every intersection in the district with arrows pointing to the evacuation

center. Then working with the Swansboro Pilots Association, the runway and several hangers were set up to shelter those who were evacuated. The sheltering of people at the runway is designed to be only for a short time period of 4 to 8 hours. At some time in this process the Sheriffs Office has to make a determination of where is the best place to shelter people if the evacuation order is for a long period of time.

On June the 17th with the help of the Mosquito Fire Safe Council, the phone tree volunteers and the Swansboro Pilots Association a practice drill was conducted. The phone tree was activated and they in turn called everyone in the district that has a phone number listed in the Mosquito phone book. (If you do not have your phone number in the local phone book and you want to be called in the event of an evacuation, please call us to have your number added). People were told that a drill was taking place and were asked to evacuate to the runway. The Pilots Association had the runway and hangers set up ready to start accepting those who came down. They then passed out information and more important free hot dogs and sodas.

The purpose of this drill was to test the phone tree to determine what notification problems popped up, to see how people would respond to the runway, and to determine how the facilities at the run way could meet the needs of those being evacuated. As in any drill some problems were discovered which is a good thing, for now they can be addressed and solved. All in all I think the drill went very well as it was conducted in as a realistic a format as possible. The American Red Cross was there with their \$450,000 communications truck and their emergency services van. In fact it is estimated that approximately 200 people arrived at the runway. Not bad for a short notice on a Saturday with the Fair going on.

For every one who planned, organized, implemented and participated in this drill I want to thank you. Special thanks to Debbie Rood who planned, organized and implemented the entire drill. Thank you to the phone tree volunteers for your time and the great job they did making the phone calls. Special thanks to Tom Atkins and the Swansboro Pilots Association who did a great deal of planning and organizing the evacuation center at the hangers and the runway and for providing the hot dogs and drinks for lunch. Thank you to Dick and Darlene

Rood who very graciously opened their hanger to all who attended.

Be safe. I hope the drill that just occurred is the only time we have to utilize the evacuation process. But yet, be prepared and know that an emergency does not always happen to the next guy, it can happen here.

We've got a new name!

When we were a small community with very few changes in residents each year, everyone knew and understood the difference between the "Mosquito Volunteer Fire Department" and the "Mosquito Fire Protection District". Chief Chaloux wrote an excellent article in the April, 2006 Byte explaining the purposes of the two organizations. As Leo put it, " I guess a good way to put it would simply be that the folks involved in a medical aid or fire suppression activity are representing the Mosquito Fire Protection District. The folks (even though they are often the same faces) putting on the pancake breakfast, selling crafts, hosting a Christmas Pot Luck or maintaining the Finnon campgrounds and property are doing so as representatives of the Mosquito Volunteer Fire Department organization." Well to help further the clarification we, the former Mosquito Volunteer Fire Department, have changed our name to the "**Mosquito Volunteer Fire Association.**" Same community support role but just with a different name.

The evacuation drill was a success thanks to the generous amount of concerned residents that took the time to attend on such a hot day. The FSC and the Mosquito residents can't thank the Swansboro Pilots Association enough for their willingness, commitment, dedication and all their efforts involved in supplying us a safe and organized evacuation site. The free hot dogs were a special treat! It was an impressive site and brought comfort and security to all those who attended and we can all rest a little easier knowing where to go and what assistance will be there when the fire comes. Thank you pilots for being such a big part of this community and caring so much about our safety!

The Red Cross delivered outstanding support by bringing an Emergency Response Vehicle [ERV] complete with free water, juice, fruit and snacks. There was also a communications vehicle that was very impressive. There are only ten of these vehicles in the U.S. and we were lucky enough to have one for our drill. We received an informative demonstration of a job they know and do very well. I was told that several of their best volunteers are right here in Mosquito. Our thanks to all of them for their dedication to what they do. Thank you Sally Bozeman for helping with the evacuation drill. This is money well spent, as they are the people who will take care of us when a fire is causing us to leave our homes.

El Dorado Fire Safe Council representatives Penny Humphrey and Vicki Yorty were there with valuable

fire safe information and a current newsletter on the 100ft clearance law. You will find a copy of this letter with your Mosquito Byte. This will give you the information you need in order to pass the inspections that will be done later this year. We can't stress enough how Mosquito is an EXTREME FIRE DANGER AREA and these standards will be enforced for every ones safety. BE SMART - DO YOUR PART! There are Residential Clearance Evaluation forms available at the Fire Station if you would like to do your own self evaluation. There are also Evacuation Plans for Mosquito available for those who do not already have one. Don't forget about the FREE chipper program and green waste vouchers also available at the Fire Station.

We would also like to thank ALL the phone tree volunteers, this was a big job with very short notice and because of your participation we were able to identify some problems that need to be addressed. We need more volunteers! The people that were making the phone calls reported that it took 45 minutes to 1hour to make the calls. This is just not acceptable. There are far to many people living here for this to happen. The idea is to work half as hard to go twice as far! So please if you can volunteer 30 minutes of your time maybe 4 times a year contact either Pat Matheny at 295.5578 or Kelly Hem at 295.9165 and tell them you would like to sign up for the phone tree. If we get enough new helpers we will only need about 15 minutes of your time about 4 times a year! There were several calls to the Fire Station wanting to know why they were not called. If your phone number is not in the Mosquito Phone Book we cannot call you! Please watch for the phone book update in the Byte and have your numbers added to the book. Another major concern was the amount of people who were called and indicated that they were unable to leave their home without assistance. If you are disabled or will need assistance in an evacuation situation and have not done so already, call Chief Leo at the Fire Station so that he is able to put you on the list of homes to be visited first. This will save valuable time and ensure your safety.

The only other issue that came up was the need to clarify the horse evacuation plan. There is property available for horses but you cannot just drop them off for obvious health and safety reasons [they will fight]. Horses must be self contained and managed by their owners.

All in all it was a great day going in the right direction of being a fire safe community. We are a great example here in Mosquito and all of El Dorado County is watching. We have come a long way so lets not turn back now, please do your part and maintain the fuel reduction areas and know that your decision to do so WILL save lives.

The budget and long range planning committee will begin holding their meetings also on the second Saturday following the regular SCPOA meeting and road meeting. We encourage your involvement.

Recipe of the Month

Fudgy Mint Cookies (and variations)

1 pkg (18 1/4 ounces) devil's food cake mix
 1/2 cup butter or margerine, softened
 1 T water
 2 eggs
 2 T powdered sugar
 2 pkgs (5 oz each) chocolate-covered thin mints
 (Andy's are what I used)

In a large mixing bowl, combine the cake mix, butter and water. Add eggs; mix well. Shape into 1-inch balls; roll in the confectioners' sugar. Place 2-inches apart on ungreased baking sheets. Bake at 375 degrees for 8 to 10 minutes or untill set. Immediately press a mint into the center of each cookie. Cool for 2 minute before removing to wire racks to cool completely. Yield: about 3 dozen

Variation: I used carrot cake and omitted the powdered sugar and mint. I made the chocolate ones (along with 6 or 7 other kinds) for Christmas last year. They were a big hit. The carrot cake ones I made again this week and it didn't take long for some of them to disappear. Try any cake mix. Yummy! Have a good summer, everyone.
