# **SCPOA**

Our December meeting again consisted of a small group of owners who contributed their input. The board greatly appreciates their contributions and hopes that more will attend.

Our maintenance person, Johnathan, has continued road patching and drainage improvements when the weather allows along brush clearing, removal and burning. The drainage problem on Highgrade has been fixed. Johnathan used the tractor to dig a ditch to keep the water alongside the road instead of on it. The problem was caused by an inadequate drainage ditch that was put in after construction was done on a house just outside the association.

Our treasurer, Tee, reports that we still have some funds with Wells Fargo but that they will be transferred to American River shortly and this will complete the bank changing process. The budget for next year has been approved by the board. There will be a 20% increase in the dues next year bringing them to \$631. There are still a few delinquent accounts that total just under \$3,000.Two others will be paid at the close of escrow.

Things are still slow with the architectural committee, with only one set of plans approved and waiting on the submission of another set. There have been multiple requests for the owner to submit them but so far they have not complied, the next step will be a letter from the associations attorney. There are still several open complaints that relate to building structures without permits, these have been referred to code enforcement with the county.

We are still looking for people who are interested in running for the SCPOA Board. There will be several openings for next year. You can still volunteer but it's too late to get your name on the ballet, however you can always be a write in candidate.

There will be a new airport information sheet sent out in the Annual Packet. The one that is currently in use is very out of date. A group of pilots reviewed and updated the information. This will go out to all members for comment and then be voted on at the February meeting. Once approved it will be placed on the SCPOA and pilots group web sites.

Another resolution that was sent out with the June packet was approved. This resolution states that no board members immediate family may be employed by the association. This resolution was at the suggestion of our attorney to protect the association.

We have a date change for our next meeting, it will be the third Saturday **January 20th** at 10:00 AM. so that we don't conflict with the party for Leo's retirement. We hope to see you there and look forward to your input and ideas.

\*MSSP (Multipurpose Senior Services Program) - ongoing case management to identify what will enhance your ability to remain safely in your home and avoid premature placement. (Medi-Cal recipient - no share of cost; age 65+/and level of need) at 621-6369.

\*Family Caregiver Support Program - provides assistance to persons caring for an older (60+) adult, or to an older (60+) adult who is raising a grandchild at 621-6151.

\*Senior Legal Services - legal services to assist seniors (60+) prepare basic documents and resolve matters that do not require representation in court at 621-6154.

**Sweet Potato Biscuits** 

2 1/2 cups biscuit/baking mix

1 1/2 cups canned sweet potatoes

6 T milk

1/3 cup butter or margarine, melted

Place biscuit mix in a large bowl. In a small bowl, mash sweet potatoes; stir in milk and butter. Stir into biscuit mix just until moistened.

Drop by a heaping tablespoon, 2 inches apart onto a greased baking sheet. Bake at 425 degrees for about 8-10 minutes or until golden brown. Serve warm. Makes about 1 dozen.
