This winter is turning out to be one of the strangest and driest winters in a long time. We received some precipitation during the first part of February but we need much more. I sure hope the next few months bring us much more precipitation. Even a little snow might be nice for those of us whom don't mind it. It sure can make our area look really majestic with a blanket of snow.

With this being a dry winter we need to take extra precautions when we are burning our leaves and brush. Be watchful of the small winds that blow your hot ash from your burn pile to near by debris. With average amounts of precipitation we don't normally have to worry about the hot ash as much because the debris has high moisture content. Since we have a lack of precipitation, the nearby debris will not have the high moisture content and will burn much easier. With the right wind, your small control burn could turn into much more.

The U.S. Forest Service has been and will continue, weather permitting, to burn off large slash piles from their fuel reduction projects just outside our community. Don't be surprised to see several large piles burning in the evening hours on your way home.

If anyone you know might be interested in becoming a fire fighter by joining our Volunteer Fire Association, now is the perfect time. Our EMT1 class is scheduled to begin on March 8th. All of our fire fighters go through this medical training to be prepared for medical calls. Next spring we will be sending all new fire fighters through the fire academy. If anyone is interested then I urge them to come down and see if it would be something they would like to do. We have trainings every Tuesday night starting at 1900 hours (7:00 PM) and observers are welcomed!

SCPOA

Due to changes made by the state legislature our voting procedure has changed and starting this year is no longer done at the Annual Meeting, instead it will be done by secret ballot. We had a large number of members in attendance and used the meeting to summarize the last year and have a community discussion on various issues. Our new supervisor Ron Briggs was kind enough to attend. He listened

intently to the issues we have and volunteered to help out with those that he can. He was quick to hand out his number and encouraged people to contact him, he said he will follow up on any inquiries and provide any available assistance.

The architectural committee approved 18 plans over the past year, this was a decrease over the prior year.

The budget committee chairman Tee Steirwalt reports that we have started repayment of the loan that was taken to cover the road project that was completed last year. Some good news is that our legal budget has decreased to \$35,000 which is still high but lower than it has been in the past. The committee has done a great job over the last year with a very tight budget and some big projects but the work is never done. They have been meeting after the monthly SCPOA meetings following the road meeting. If you have any interest please contact our secretary at 621.0309 so you can be advised of the meetings.

The number of complaints that we had last year has also decreased but we still have a few active ones that have been very difficult to resolve. The problem on Gold Trail has been through the county and is with the DA's office. The building department is still trying to figure out the property lines on Morton Court.

We will have four openings for the board this year and for the first time in a very long time we have a choice of who to vote for since we have six candidates. Those who have placed their name on the ballot are, Barbara Beachman, Tee Stierwalt, Tom Schmidt, Kim Purcell, John Cory and Don Lee. Tee Stierwalt, Tom Schmidt, Kim Purcell, John Cory are current Board Members and are running for re-election. Barbara Beachman is a new member of the community and is ready to get involved. The mention of the name Don Lee elicited many questions at the meeting. We were asked if he still has any law suites with the association? Answer, yes he does. Has he repaid any of the judgements against him awarded to the association? Answer, he hasn't. How can someone who has cost the association so much money with law suites and still owes the association money due to court judgements still run for the board? Answer, the SCPOA bylaws are written in such a way that anyone can run for the board, it is

up to the members to decide who they think will do a good job. It was also pointed out that any member of the community can submit a statement of community interest that would also be sent out with candidate statements.

The road committee reports that the road work done looks good but there is much more to do. They will be starting a project of taking video of all roads to better document their condition as well as any damage done to them. They will continue to work on the ten year plan which will have all roads in the association done to the same standard as well as a maintenance plan. There were questions about how we could hold people who damage the road especially during the building process accountable for the damage. Unfortunately this can be difficult but by documenting the state of the road prior to damage being done it will put us in a better position to prove when the damage occurred.

The airport is looking very good, there are a few weeds coming up in the areas where no petromat was applied but they are being taken care of by volunteers. In December we had a rash of vandalism by two individuals who live in the community. They were arrested and have multiple Federal and State charges pending against them.

We are still in need of someone to help out with the SCPOA web site, we would love to find someone who can work with it to make it something much more usable for the community, if you have any interest please contact our secretary Lynda at 621.0309.

As is the tradition, certificates of appreciation were handed out to all outgoing board members as well as other members of the community who have put in extra time to help all of us out. We wanted to thank our secretary Lynda and our maintenance worker Johnathan for all the work they do to keep the association going and looking good as well as the extra time they put in to help out. Tee Steirwalt and Tom Schmidt put in many hours including using vacation time to get the loan in place and the work on our roads done, Joe Lima also put in many hours on the road project. Thank you to Neil and Pat Matheny and Sharon Hern for their help in the past election process, Barbara Mikel for her work on the budget committee and Rob Kirkpatrick for his work on the web site. We also wanted to thank the

Swansboro pilots group and the Sacramento chapter of the 99's (the women's pilots group) for the hundreds of hours of volunteer work in the prep and painting of the runway which saved the association thousands of dollars.

We also had a special meeting the following Saturday to address the three resolutions that had been sent out for review. The first was to accept the new voting rules outlined by the state, the second was the updated airport guidelines and the third was the common area use and fishing regulations. All were unanimously approved. The biggest change will be that there is now a curfew for the common areas. It is hoped that this will help to cut down on some of the vandalism that has been occurring since it seems to occur late at night.

Ballots will be mailed out shortly, so please read the new instructions and either mail them in or drop them off at the approved drop box inside the fire station before the April 12th deadline. Remember you will not be able to bring your ballots to the April meeting. We would like to thank everyone who took the time to come to both meetings to share their ideas and hope to see you at the next meeting which will be March 10th at 10:00 AM at the fire station.

Supervisor Briggs Forms District IV Committee Applicants Sought

El Dorado County Supervisor Ron Briggs, District IV, has announced the formation of a District IV Communities Advisory Committee. District IV is the second largest district in the county and includes the communities of the Georgetown Divide, Coloma, Lotus, Mosquito/Swansboro, and areas of Placerville, Rescue, Cameron Park, Shingle Springs and El Dorado Hills.

"I feel this is a major step forward that will offer representation and input for the citizens of our district," said Briggs.

Since taking office in January, Briggs said his office has been diligently working to appoint members to the various county commissions and committees that represent District IV. Additionally, Supervisor Briggs is now accepting applications to sit on the newly formed District IV Communities Advisory Committee. Supervisor Briggs encourages District IV citizens to apply for the member seat on the Civil Service Commission, Fish and Game Committee, Library Commission, Placerville Airport Advisory Committee, Commission on Aging, and Kelsey Cemetery District, as well as the District IV Communities Advisory Committee. Current county commission members whose term has expired are encouraged to re-apply.

"I am looking forward to listening to my constituents. Together, we will work to improve the quality of life for their families and communities," said Briggs.

"To accomplish this, I have requested that the District IV Communities Advisory Committee schedule monthly, public meetings, at various locations throughout District IV.

Briggs concluded, "I want to emphasize that the District IV Communities Advisory Committee is to be that wider link that will report and advise my office regarding general issues and those needs facing the residents and communities of District IV, not specifically addressed by existing local community advisory committees or organizations."

Items "not" accepted:

Electronic waste, Household appliances, Radioactive materials, Infectious medical waste, Explosives, Compressed gas cylinders.

Please limit materials to 5 gallons or 50 pounds; however, you may transport up to 20 gallons of used oil or latex paint with no single container larger than 5 gallons. Please use original or disposable containers that are labeled with contents.
