Chief's Corner

It appears that summer is upon us with the days getting longer and warmer. That also means that the "fire season" also appears to be here a little bit early. We have been lucky that there hasn't been any large fire's in our district but listening to the dispatch radio, that is not the case in other parts of the county. There has been several fires all over El Dorado County but thanks to the great response that we receive from the fire departments in this county, not many have gotten too large.

The Mosquito Fire Protection District is in the process of getting two new pieces of fire apparatus to aid in our response and ability to tackle the on coming fire season. We are scheduled to take delivery of our new 3000 gallon water tender sometime near the end of June. With the addition of the new water tender to our fleet, we will have 6000 gallons of rolling water that we can use in the non-hydrant areas in our district. This will greatly enhance our abilities to fight fires in these areas.

The second fire apparatus is a new Type I/III fire engine that we are expecting to have in late July. The new fire engine is the perfect solution to our urban interface that we have in our district. The new engine will be able to aggressively attack vegetation fires as well as being able to address vehicle and structure fires with it's 1000GPM pumping capabilities.

CDF has officially declared the start of the 2007 fire season - about two weeks early this year! Although the date has not been formally announce, all burn permits will be suspended shortly, most likely for the rest of the summer. That means there is no outdoor burning allowed once the burning is suspended. If you smell or see smoke please call 911 so that we will be dispatched to check it out. We do not mind responding; it could mean the difference between just putting out a small fire or having to deal with a major problem!

SCPOA

Spring is here and Johnathan, our maintenance person, has been doing an outstanding job keeping our common areas looking great! Lots of mowing and weed eating as well as road patching where needed. We have had the ponds evaluated by Aquatic Environments and are waiting for their written report and recommendations so that the Board can design a treatment plan for this year.

We received our delivery of vinyl fencing and will begin to replace the old wooden fence along the north side of Rock Creek Road as time and workload permits.

We have received two applications so far for the maintenance helper job and will be setting up interviews so that we can get the helper started by the end of the month if not sooner..

Our secretary, Lynda, reports that we still have 71 owners who have not paid their Annual Assessment for 2007 and 3 from last year. The "third notice" will be going out this month.

Our Treasurer Tee states that they will be moving most of the money in our business checking account to a money market where it can earn more interest. We will move money back into checking as needed for expenses.

We still have several active complaints regarding illegal structures in the development. They were referred to the El Dorado County Code Enforcement for action some time ago. At our last meeting a letter was drafted to Supervisor Briggs asking for his assistance in the matter. We received a response outlining what actions Code Enforcement has taken. In general, a "Notice to Correct" had been sent to the violators. We will continue to follow up with this problem.

The June packet will be coming out next month and

one of the items in it will be a self nomination form for the board of directors. Please consider getting involved with the board. We will have three openings next year and would like to encourage anyone with interest to fill out the nomination form.

Also in the June packet will be another form that anyone interested in high speed internet can fill out. ATT is apparently planning to upgrade our phone lines in the future and if we can get a large response from the community requesting access to high speed internet now, we may be able to get them to speed up the upgrade process. Getting these upgrades will require a big community effort and this will be just one of the ways planned to get signatures requesting the upgrade.

Our insurance carrier is charging SCPOA an additional \$100.00 for the Community's Annual Picnic at Dyer Lake. It was unanimously approved by the board and members in attendance that SCPOA pick up that expense.

We would also like to remind everyone that summer is almost here and there's the potential for this to be a bad fire season! So please clear the brush on your property. Many of the areas that were cleared in the last couple of years are growing back and will create just as bad, if not a worse, fire hazard. The chipping program is still in place, pick up the forms at the fire station follow the directions. This is a great Free program that is available to all of us so please take advantage of it!

Our next SCPOA meeting will be Saturday June 9th at 10:00 AM at the Fire Station. We hope to see you there.

Recipe of the Month

Chicken Chana

4- Boneless Chicken Breast Butterflied And Tenderized

4- ounces seasoned flour

2 ounces olive oil

12-ounces mushroom buttons Quartered

2-teaspoons minced garlic

6-ounces Broccoli Florets

2 ounces Dijon Mustard

4 ounces Brandy

12 ounces heavy cream

3-ounces Shredded Parmesan Cheese

16 ounces cooked Penne Pasta

Butterfly the chicken breast and place between two pieces of plastic wrap and with a meat mallet gently pound the chicken but do not tear the chicken, dredge the chicken in the flour and set aside.

In a medium saucepan bring some salted water to a boil; blanch off the broccoli until tender (about 2 minutes) pull from the water and place in a ice bath to cool, set aside.

In a large sauté pan over a low flame, heat up the olive oil, place the chicken breasts in the pan and sauté for 3-minutes, add the mushrooms, turn the chicken over and sauté for 3-more minutes, watch the bottom of the pan so it does not burn. Add the garlic, broccoli florets, add the Dijon mustard, sauté for 1-minute, add the brandy and cook for 3-minutes or until the brandy reduces. Add the Heavy Cream and let reduce until thickens add the Parmesan cheese and pasta, let simmer for 2-minutes. Divide the pasta on to 4 plates and lay the chicken on top and garnish with chopped tomatoes and fresh basil. Sprinkle some Parmesan cheese over the top.

A little something about Chicken Chana

This is a pasta dish that I give credit to my daughter Chana, One night I made a simple chicken Dijon at home, my daughter just loved it but told me that it would be better if I added Broccoli to it and so the dish Chicken Chana was born and has become one of my favorite pasta dishes to make. I hope that you enjoy the dish as much as I do and that you will

come out to the restaurant to give it a try. I look forward to sharing some of my favorite recipes. I am always looking for new recipes so please feel free to share any of your favorite recipes and I will try them out at the restaurant.
