Chief's Corner

All burn permits have been suspended for the rest of the summer as of 0800 hours on Monday, June 18th. That means there is no outdoor burning of any type allowed. If you smell or see smoke please do not hesitate to call 911 so that we can be dispatched to check it out. We would rather get the equipment rolling early as it could mean the difference between just putting out a small fire or having to deal with a major event!

I urge everyone to use caution when trying to create the 100 foot defensible space, now required by law, around your house. In clearing dry weeds and brush around use extreme caution with power tools as they should be used only **early** in the morning or **late** in the evening to avoid sending sparks into dry grass.

Why the 100 ft. requirement? Because proper clearance dramatically increases the chance of your house surviving a wildfire. Here's some other things that will improve your home's chances of surviving. Make sure your roof and gutters are clean so that sparks or embers don't have a fuel source should any land on your roof. Remove any limbs that might be hanging down on the house. Make sure your driveway is cleared enough to make it possible for a fire engine to get to your house. I can't stress the importance of this one! Remember your little SUV or compact car may be able to access your driveway but can a 16-ton fire engine or water tender do it? Take the time to look at your driveway and see if a cement truck or a moderate sized U-haul truck can go down it without tearing its self up.

The fuel reduction grant projects have now been completed. The last sections included La Paz Road, Highgrade Street, Pecos Court and Highgrade Court. These roads look awesome and will provide for a safe evacuation route if the need should arise. I strongly urge the home owners who have had work on their property completed this year (and the years past) to maintain it so that all community members

can have a safe evacuation route if needed. If these areas are not maintained then we will be back in the same situation we had. These areas also allow for us to stop or hold fires from becoming larger.

I hope we all have a fun, safe and fire free 4th of July!

SCPOA

We enjoyed our June meeting sitting in the shade outside the firehouse and had a good size group of members participate. The roads meeting followed the regular meeting and will continue to do so each month to make it easier for everyone to attend.

The June information packet is being prepared for distribution. The process of finding an independent CPA to do the financial review has been difficult but our treasurer, Tee, again came through and was able to find one. A motion was made and approved to accept the CPA's proposal and pay the \$1350 fee.

Our secretary reports that we still have 39 delinquent accounts for this year. Additionally, she requested approval to place liens on two properties that are two or more years delinquent. The request was approved.

It was a slow month for the Architectural Committee. No new plans were submitted for review and only one re-approval. There's still the one non-compliant owner. A letter was sent from the association attorney to that member stating that he must submit plans for review or face legal action.

The Board continues to pursue several ongoing complaints regarding illegal buildings with the county Building Department. The County has finally taken some action. One was prosecuted by the DA and had a judgement against them and the other was sent a "Notice to Correct".

Another active complaint relates to barking dogs, animal control is the appropriate agency to handle this problem. If you have a problem dog and can

identify its location and the owner is uncooperative about keeping it quiet you need to contact animal control and they will "officially" contact the owner. And, if you own dogs, please be courteous to your neighbors and keep them quiet at night so everyone can enjoy the cool evenings with their windows open.

Johnathan has been working hard mowing and weed eating in the common areas. He now has a helper! There were 3 applicants for the Summer Assistant position and Tammy Moore was selected. They will be out mowing, patching roads and, when the ground softens up again, replacing fencing. Johnathan also suggested that we order more sand for the beaches at both Dyer and Catfish Lakes, this will be done as soon as possible.

We received the report from Aquatic Environments regarding treatment of our lakes and after reviewing the report, a motion was made and passed to treat Dyer, Trout and Catfish Lakes according to their recommendations.

The road committee reports that this year will be a very quiet year for work due to the limited funds available but there is lots of planning to be done for the next several years. Tom would like to get volunteers from each unit to join the road committee to provide input on road conditions and needs in each area. Road meetings are held after the regular SCPOA meeting each month.

The Swansboro Pilots Group will complete painting the rest of the markings on the runway this month. These volunteers are also be taking care of the weeds that have grown along the edges freeing up Johnathan and Tammy to work on other common area projects. Delta construction, who did the resurfacing of the runway, has offered to loan us their blower (they call it Katrina) to remove the loose rocks from the runway surface.

An agenda item at the meeting called for discussing the idea of revising the DC & R's and separating the airport from the other common areas so that only those who use it pay for it. This idea seems to come up every few years with the same results, our current DC&R's have everyone paying for all common areas and roads regardless of how much you use them. Members pointed out that some people never use the lakes and those that live on Rock Creek or Mosquito may never use other roads in the

association that they pay such a significant amount for. It was brought up that the budget documents show that the average cost per lot it is only around \$15 per year for the airport., Yet it's presence is a huge asset to the community. There were many who stated that when they bought up here it was for the "whole package" including the airport, lakes and roads, it makes no sense to try to single out one area for a specific group to pay for. To some extent, our DC&R's are inconsistent among the Units and a little out dated. This has been an item that was regularly discussed over the years. But the issue has always been dropped due to many difficulties; the expense to rewrite the DC &R's and the expense of defending legal challenges to the new ones, the potential issues of being able to retain our non profit status, and our historic inability to get the necessary 75% voter participation of all of the property owners needed to approve any changes. A change was attempted in the 80"s with a resulting 40% response from the property owners. This was after the Association expended all the funds to have a new one prepared. Considering all these factors, the Board tabled the issue.

Recipe of the Month

"Moms Meatloaf"

Here is a recipe that was passed on to me by one of the greatest cooks I ever met, one who truly taught me to love the art of cooking, my mother.

3-Lbs Hamburger

1-lbs Bulk Italian Sausage

1-Tablespoons minced garlic (fresh)

½ teaspoon onion powder

1-cup breadcrumbs

1/4 cup Parmesan cheese

2-Tablespoons chopped parsley

1½ teaspoon salt

1½ teaspoon ground black pepper

3-whole eggs

1/2 Cup heavy cream

34 Cup ketchup

Combine all ingredients together until well mixed. divide in half and form into loafs. Place in a baking dish cover with plastic wrap and aluminum foil. Bake in oven at 350 degrees until internal temperature reaches 165 degrees around 30 minutes, drain off excess oil and drippings and pour the sauce over the meatloaf and cook for another 10 minutes. Makes 6 servings.

Sauce

1-cup ketchup 1-cup brown sugar 1/4 cup honey 1/4 cup Worcestershire sauce

2 tablespoons horseradish

Combine all ingredients for the sauce in a small sauce pan and cook for 10 minutes on low heat.
