This fire season is one of the driest I have ever seen. The potential for a large devastating fire is scary. My concern is that if we do have an ignition start in the wild land that it will immediately take off and be out of control. There are times when no matter how fast you get to a fire, how much equipment and personnel you have there is nothing you can do about it. So please be careful with all outdoor activities. If you are going to do any grass or weed cutting or using gasoline powered tools of any kind please do it early in the morning before 10 am or late in the evening.

Remember that the worst part of the fire season is coming up. August and September are usually the months that burn up El Dorado County. That's when the fuels are at their driest, the weather starts to change and we get more wind. So for the next couple of months everyone needs to be cautious with out door activities and think fire prevention.

We finally got the call that our new water tender was ready and it's now at the Station. The 2005 Kenworth water tender holds 3000 gallons of water which will bring our total water tender capabilities to 6000 gallons of water rolling to fire calls. This greatly enhances our fire fighting capabilities in non-hydrant areas.

You should have received your June packet by now and in it you will see a pink questionnaire about high speed Internet interest. Please, answer the questions and drop the survey off in the boxes located at the Rock Creek Café, the Mosquito Fire Station or drop it in the SCPOA mail box at Rock Creek & Sluice. These will be submitted to AT&T in hopes of becoming a priority for an upgrade in the equipment needed for high speed Internet in our community.

Also in the packet was a page with reminders to everyone to keep their dogs quiet and that motorcycles driven on our roads must be street legal and have a licensed rider on them. These two issues become a large problem in the summer with animal control and law enforcement becoming involved.

All three lakes have been treated by Aquatic environments now and are looking great. Dyer is getting low so we will be adding some water, unfortunately our budget will only allow us to add a small amount. New sand has been spread at both Dyer and Catfish lakes. We also had the lakes tested for coliform and all tested within acceptable limits with subscription to the BYTE. You can also check out the Dyer having a very low count. A reminder to those with horses that if you take them to the beach or picnic areas be prepared to clean up after them when they leave a mess, don't spoil it for everyone!

The issue of extensive weed growth along our roads and common areas was once again brought up and a suggestion was made that we come up with a comprehensive plan to deal with the issue. The plan would have to include chemical spraying by a licensed applicator as well a homeowner education so that homeowners would maintain their properties along roads. This issue will be difficult since there are individuals who do not want chemical application and others who refuse to even allow any brush clearing near their property. It's not going to be an easy issue to deal with but it needs to be addressed and a solution found.

There is still a problem with some properties not having appropriate drainage systems in place where their driveways connect with our roads. This drainage problem our damages our roads. Letters are being sent to homeowners letting them know they must install appropriate drainage systems before the rains start this year. If you see a drainage created problem or any other road issue, please contact out secretary to let her know at 621.0309. Remember, our roads are by far the largest expense SCPOA has so anything we can do to help prevent road damage and the associated extra expense helps out.

There will be remote control sail boat races at Trout lake on August 25th, these will be west coast championship races so there will be some good competition and it should be wonderful weather. If you haven't seen these in the past they are great fun to watch so stop by and check them out.



Mosquito Road Etiquette

(Editor's Note: I have received several calls and letters from subscribers with concerns of unsafe driving practices on Mosquito Road. Space and content guidelines precludes publishing all of the letters. Instead here is a reprint of an article from SCPOA.)

We have all noticed the increase in traffic on Mosquito Road over the last several years; it seems like a good idea to remind everyone of the guidelines that have been used in the past to keep everyone happy. We all drive at different speeds on the road so if you have someone come up behind you please pull over at the next safe available area. If you are the one who comes up behind someone give them time to pull over, immediately pulling in close on someone's bumper makes it difficult for them to let you go by. The road is narrow and some of the vehicles on it now are guite large so everyone needs to stay on the right side of the road, if you keep drifting out to the middle you're probably driving too fast. It is very unpleasant and expensive to be run off the side, some of the edges are sharp and will damage or destroy tires. When heading into town at the bottom of the hill prior to the bridge pull over just prior to the bridge when you need to let someone go the opposite direction by. If you stop at the top of the hill it makes it difficult to impossible for the car going up the hill to get by since they may need to take the corner wide to make the turn. The most important guideline is to smile and wave at the other cars weather you know them or not, this helps keep everyone in a good mood even if you've had a bad day!
