Chief's Corner

As I drive down Mosquito Road I have noticed a lot more traffic driving at faster than normal speeds. Some of your neighbors have noticed this as well and have taken the liberty to let me know just how many "bad" drivers we have up here. Even with the increased amount of traffic and the higher speeds there is one question that keeps popping up, why is there not more accidents on Mosquito Road? The only answer I can come up with - and granted it's not a very intelligent one - is "I have no idea". Seems with all the cars going up and down the road and the way some people are driving we should be pulling out of the station at least once a day to deal with a vehicle accident. But fortunately that is not the case and in fact we haven't been dispatched for a car accident involving two vehicles on Mosquito in several months

And then there is the work tide, that continuous inflow and outflow of traffic with the ritual of going like a "bat out of hell" to work in the morning and then coming home like a "horse hauling butt back to the barn" in the evenings. The great thing about Mosquito Road is no matter how fast the person behind you wants to go after you let them pass, they always end up right along with you at the stop sign at Hwy 50.

So PLEASE slow down and stay on your side of the road for your own safety and everyone else who is sharing the road with you!

There is a section of the road however that seems to be attracting a lot of visitors. This section is in the newly paved portion of the road just 300 feet or so down past the gate that closes the road. So far since the new pavement has been in place we have been dispatched on several vehicles over the edge of the road and I have noticed marks on the road that indicate there have been others that were not

reported. Luckily there have been no injuries from the vehicles leaving the paved area of the road but it just a matter of time before there's a serious incident.

I'm meeting with Tom Celio, County DOT, about getting a new guard rail put in place at this location to help drivers keep their vehicles on the road way. He seems agreeable and if he can fit it into the budget we might soon have it in place to aid those drivers having difficulties in this area of the road.

Just as a reminder to everyone who uses Mosquito Road that NO TRAILERS are allowed on the bridge regardless of their size! Tom Celio explained that anything that is attached to your bumper and being pulled by your vehicle is considered a trailer and is not allowed. The white signs posted on the road are in fact regulatory and not just advisory signs which means crossing the bridge with something attached to your bumper is a Vehicle Code violation and subject to a penalty.

CALSTAR Air Ambulance Membership

Hopefully none of us will ever need the service, but if a medical condition warrants, a Paramedic or Fire Officer might direct that a patient be transported to a hospital that specializes in a particular type of trauma - head injury, burn, infant, etc. If this occurs, the transportation is usually by Helicopter instead of an ambulance. While the rapid transport is necessary to the patient's health, it can also be very costly - often more than a person's insurance policy will cover. Since 2000, CALSTAR Air Ambulance has offered a "membership" program (\$50 per year for a family) whereby if a member needs the service, CALSTAR will accept what the member's insurance carrier pays

a payment in full. If you are interested, Membership applications and more information can be found at the Fire Station.
