Finnon Lake Dam Update by Bob Davis

The Mosquito Volunteer Fire Association continues to work on the Finnon Dam restoration project with the hope of returning it to its past glory. Mark Egbert, Manager of the El Dorado County & Georgetown Divide Resource Conservation District, is proving to be an invaluable asset in keeping the project visible and gaining support from the many players involved in getting the project completed. With his help we are currently working on finalizing the sixth, and hopefully last, permit.

One of the proverbial thorns in our side is that the dam remains under the jurisdiction of the Division of

Dam Safety. Although we maintain the level of the water below the jurisdictional cutoff level of 49 acre feet, the dam still has the potential of holding much more water. Because of this potential the Dam requires annual inspections that currently have an accompanying fee of approximately \$6000. The MVFA for several years has unsuccessfully attempted to get the State to waive these fees. During that time we have accumulated a \$25,000 liability in past due fees. We have been informed that the liability could keep us from starting the dam project once we secure funding. We are working to establish a workable payment plan to bring the balance current.

We are also actively looking for ways to modify the dam so it won't require the annual inspection and still not negatively impact the permitting and funding progress we have made so far. We have approached Mark with two ideas. The first is to breach the dam so the level of the lake will stay below 49 acre feet. The breached area would function as a spillway and still permit vehicle accesses the campground. The second idea is to build a coffer dam to hold back less then 49 acre feet of water and then open the drain gate for the existing dam and weld it in the open position thus removing it from Division of Dam Safety's jurisdiction. As you can imagine there is no simple answer.

Funding remains our biggest obstacle. The estimated cost of the Dam rebuild project is between \$450,000 and \$650,000. We continue to work on several fronts to gain funding for the project.

Swansboro Country POA

Summer is a busy time so I missed getting a SCPOA report done last month, so here is the summary for both August and September. To date this year we still have 13 owners who have not paid assessments. Liens have been placed on properties and one will be started in the foreclosure process soon.

The budget committee will be starting the process of putting the budget together for next year. We have received a copy of the reserve study but the company providing the service has had a problem correctly anticipating the costs involved in repairing our roads. This is important since budget and reserve funding must be based on this study and if done on their current projections we will not have adequate funding for our roads. Tee, our treasurer and Tom the road committee chairman are working to correct this problem. Please plan to attend the next budget meeting which follows the regular SCPOA meeting each month.

Water was added to Dyer lake in August, it ran for two weeks and produced a total of a 2 inch rise, this didn't seem like much but it was the amount budgeted for the year. Hopefully we will have a good wet winter to replenish the water in all of our ponds.

Johnathan and Tammy have continued their work on the roads, cleaning up the sides for improved drainage and patching holes. If you see a problem area on any SCPOA roads, please contact our secretary at 621.0309 so that the problem can addressed prior to the rainy season.

We are still receiving complaints about motorcycles and barking dogs. If you see a problem motorcycle, attempt to get the address where it originates from and note the time and location and call CHP. Even if you don't know where the motorcycle came from, call CHP anyway with a description since it is probably one that has been reported prior. If you have a dog please control its barking day or night. It seems to be just a handful that are creating the problems.

We are still looking for individuals who are interested in running for the board of directors. Only one nomination has been received so far with 3 openings to fill.

The roads and the runway that were done last year were swept of all the loose rocks that had accumulated on them. The loose gravel was making slippery spots on the roads and causing nicks in props on the runway. Both look great after the sweeping. The windsock near midfield on the runway will be reinstalled, at no expense to the association.

The website committee has had a meeting and come up with lots of great suggestions to make our website more useful. Some of the improvements suggested include complaint and architectural forms that can be completed online and submitted, a search function. improved links and community calendar. Another suggestion is to move the server to a different provider for a lower cost and redesign the logo to one that is less busy and easier to look at. The final suggestion made was to look into doing our own payroll with a computer program instead of paying an outside agency and using online bill paying, which still requires verification by two board members but would eliminate all the time and mileage required by our secretary tracking down signatures on checks. Both of these suggestions could save us money each month. This discussion will continue in October.

Our next SCPOA meeting will be Saturday October 13th at 10:00 AM at the Fire Station followed by a budget and road meeting, we hope you will attend and provide your input.

Recipe of the Month

Since a number of you have asked for my Country Gravy recipe here it is.........

- 1 cup beef fat drippings (beef fat trimmings rendered down, I use the drippings from my prime ribs)
- 8 ounces of diced raw bacon
- 6 ounces of sausage (uncooked)
- 4 ounces of small diced ham
- 12 ounces flour
- 1 Tablespoon chicken base
- 1 1/2 teaspoon black pepper
- 4 cups milk (if you like it richer use heavy cream)

In a large sauté pan brown the bacon add the beef drippings and the other meats, cook until the sausage is done. Add the flour and over a low flame cook for about 10 minutes, add the chicken base and pepper and cook for 2 more minutes. Add the milk and cook until it thickens if you like thinner gravy add more milk or some water. Makes about 6 cups.

I do hope you enjoy this recipe it is truly a heart stopper. See you around the café.
