Chief's Corner

Well it looks as though I am back for awhile. I will be filling in for a few months until a new Chief is selected. It is kind of good and yet strange to be coming back after being retired for about nine months. Time is funny, at one point it seems there are many changes that have taken place and at another point there are no changes at all. I guess all things in life are often just a matter of perspective.

Do be assured that the fire station will be open and staffed as much as possible. If there is anything you need please feel free to come down and talk to Bob, Mary or myself. And always remember in the event of an emergency just call 911 and there will be several volunteer fire fighters responding to help you.

Just recently the fire department has been able to purchase a new Kenworth water tender and a new International Engine. We expect at least twenty years of service from this new equipment and are fortunate to have been able to acquire them. This is your fire equipment so if you have an opportunity please come by and take a look at them.

So now for a little business, on October 11th the open burn suspension was lifted thus making it possible to burn once again with a valid fire permit. If you need a permit, they can be acquired at the fire station. There is no charge for the permit but you do have to listen to our speech about how and when to burn. Once you have a permit you can start the never ending process of cleaning up ground litter, trimming trees, and removing any brush that may be a threat to your house in the event of a fire. After all, the next fire season is only about 7 months away so it is really never too late to start.

The new clearance requirements established by the State and enforced by Cal Fire (formerly the California Division of Forestry and Fire Protection) went into effect in January of this year. Our fire department will be conducting inspections starting this coming January, 2008 to assist people in determining if their property meets the new requirements. Our goal is to inspect every house in the District early so that if there is a problem with your property meeting the requirements you will be able to correct them before the start of the 2008 fire season. If you do have any questions about the new 100 foot law or you would like us to come and look at your property please feel free to get a hold of us, we will be glad to come over.

Right now we need to be grateful that the 2007 fire season was a real slow one - at least for us. We only had two wild land fires in the District, one on Rock Creek Road and the second on Mosquito Road. A great response by the Volunteer Fire Fighters and the Support Group along with the help of Cal Fire and other neighboring fire departments kept them very small. However, I would like to caution everyone that even though the "fire season" might be officially over, I have seen fires take place in every month of the year. I remember one January when we had to put out about a three acre fire that was burning on top of two inches of snow. Now, it wasn't burning hot or fast but it wasn't going to go out on its own so we still had to put it out. So whenever vou are burning make sure it is on a burn day, please use caution, pay attention to the wind, and if anything goes wrong call 911.

Well, it is good to be back. Take care, and with winter coming beware of the roads, they can get slick at times.

MFPD Fights Southern California Fires by Editor

We are all very much aware of the risks associated with living in a rural, forested area. We face them every day here on "the hill". Right now some rural (and not so rural) areas of Southern California are being devastated by wild land fires. As we go to press, the Mosquito Fire Protection District has a fire engine and three firefighters in Southern California, part of a Strike Team from El Dorado County, helping fight the fires. The crew arrived at the base camp in Ramona (San Diego area) on Monday, 10/22. From what I've learned, they have been assigned to "structure protection" in various parts of the county. We are proud of our firefighters - and all fire fighters for that matter – and glad that we are in a position to help out. No idea yet on when they may return home but we keep their safety in our thoughts and prayers.

There was a nice turnout for our October meeting and we would like to thank everyone who attended and participated..

Our maintenance person Johnathan is on medical leave but Tammy has continued with brush and fencing removal. Johnathan is very anxious to return to work with the next project being the replacement of the fence along the north side of Rock Creek Road.

We still have some individuals who owe dues for the past year. Motions were made and passed to place liens on five delinquent properties.

The architectural committee has approved only one house and one garage.

The budget committee met following the SCPOA meeting and will continue to do so each month. We are still waiting for the corrected reserve study since it needs to be a part of the budget package. Since our budget and dues must be based on this study and our roads are by far our largest expense, the current study would not allow us to put the needed money into reserves to cover repairs on all of our roads.

We still have several open complaints that the county code enforcement is working on.

We are still looking for individuals who would like to run for the SCPOA Board. We have only had one form submitted and we will have several openings next year. If you have any interest, please contact Lynda if you don't have the form from the June packet.

Not much has happened with the roads or runway since the last meeting. Johnathan did a great job with the patching but the temperatures are getting too cold to work with the patching material now. There will be more major work done next year and road committee meetings will be scheduled again very soon.

The website committee is in the process of making major changes to the site to make it more useful to all SCPOA property owners. Some of the changes will be to include PDF files that can be downloaded for the DC&R'S, a search system which will enable you to find which unit an address is in, forms that can be filled out and submitted online, options for receiving your annual packets via e-mail rather than regular mail, monthly meeting agendas and a calender of events. The idea of using Pay Pal as an option for paying dues was discussed since it would be convenient, but the associated costs make it too expensive at this time.

A discussion was held on the berry bush problems on Maidu Drive near Dogwood. The bushes have created a blind corner since they grow right up to the road. A proposal was made to hire Kurt Kimm for a day to masticate the area as it would be far more efficient than having our maintenance crew do it. We will also follow up with Dustin Sears to spray the areas so that the growth doesn't return next year.

There was some damage found on Highgrade from a large tractor that was used at a new home that is being built. A decision was made to contact Delta Construction to get a bid for repairs which will be sent to the homeowner who is responsible for paying it.

Our next meeting is on Saturday November 10th at 10:00 AM at the fire station. Hope to see you there!

Bridge Closed Again

In the past three months, our bridge on Mosquito Road that crosses the South Fork of the American River has been closed for nearly 4 weeks for maintenance AND repairs. Yes, repairs! According to DOT, this last closure was necessary to repair damage that was apparently caused by overweight and/or oversized vehicles.

The Department of Transportation states that a 3/4 ton vehicle, UNLOADED is, in general, the maximum vehicle weight allowed to cross the bridge. And ALL trailers, regardless of size, are prohibited. Yet many of us see overweight vehicles, oversized vehicles and trailers crossing the bridge on a daily basis.

These violations are infractions and can (should) be reported to the California Highway Patrol. If you see an infraction please report it. If you are expecting a delivery PLEASE advise the carrier of the route to use depending on the vehicle that will be making the delivery.

We all know that Mosquito Road is a vital means of entry and exit for our community. If we don't do our part to help maintain our bridge we may someday lose this vital link to town.
