Chief's Corner by Chief Leo Chaloux

Over the past several Byte issues, Bob Davis has shared the experiences he and two of our other fire fighters had fighting the southern California fires last year. They had a continuous order; "protect as many structures from burning as possible". Often in order to do that, fire fighters have to place themselves and their equipment in dangerous and threatening positions. I hope everyone who reads those articles comes away with just one thought in their minds - that this can really happen to me up here.

So, many of us go about our daily concerns with the notion that a fire will not happen to me, it always happens to the other guy. Well, life is really the successful survival of risks on a daily basis. Living in California, besides having all the benefits, also has many risks with one of them being wild land fire. We individuals must start realizing that reality and do everything we can to lower or mitigate that risk. The idea that a fire department will be able to save every house in the event of a major wild land fire is one that is simply not true! If the fire is large enough some homes will burn and others will not.

As fire fighters, the last thing we want to see happen is someone's home burned to the ground. Watching that home go is certainly not a heroic experience but one of frustration, sadness and often anger. The anger and frustration for many reasons; not enough fire fighters, not enough fire engines, not enough aircraft, not enough water, not enough time, too much fire, too much wind, too much fuel, and then there's "the house was not defensible".

As home owners there is one thing we can do ease some of that firefighter frustration and that is to do whatever it takes to **make your house defensible**. Many simply do not know how to do this due to lack of awareness, lack of understanding of what a fire can do and lack of education about their role in strengthening their home's against a wild land fire.

With the help and support of Chief Davis, the Mosquito Fire Safe Council, under the direction of Walter Graves, will become more active in providing education and awareness to every home owner in the Mosquito area in 2008. But, Chief Davis and Walter need your help! We need people to contact the fire department (626.9017) who are willing to volunteer to work a few hours on a program that will help make our community a fire safe one.

In the meantime please ask yourself this one question. What can I do to make my house a safer and a more defensible place to live? Please contact us at the station and let us know what your answer or solution is.

Mosquito FPD in Southern California Inferno by Battalion Chief Bob Davis

[Editor's Note: On October 21st Bat. Chief Bob Davis, Engineer Floyd Baumgartner and Fire Fighter Dave Erdman on Mosquito Engine 275 were part of a Strike Team from El Dorado County sent to southern California to help combat the many fires raging in the area. During their assignment, they found themselves involved in protecting houses and fighting all kinds of fires. This is the last article in the series by Bob describing some of his experiences.]

I left off last month just as we finally got released to our Base Camp for some much needed rest. Let me start this last article by saying a little about "Base Camp. Base camp was like a small town. If you needed anything, it was there - you just had to go out and find it! The camp was made up of a whole lot of white tents that from the outside all looked alike. You spent most of your time sticking your head in and out of tents just trying to locate whatever it was you were looking for.

Our strike team was staged out by a ball field that was about a 10 minute walk from the main part of the camp. And, separating us from that camp "hub" was a big asphalt parking lot where they parked all of the Type-1 Engines not out on assignment. There must have been 300 engines parked in this area. Engines from everywhere in the State. They even had engines from downtown San Francisco and one had a big shinny bell on the front bumper. (I'd sure hate to be the guy who had to ring the bell from the bumper.) So, there we were, resting, looking at this mass of fire engines and watching the grass grow on the ball field for the next 12 hours, waiting for the next assignment. (Remember from the last article that we were the only Type 3 Strike Team available and had to remain close to our engines even while on R&R)

The next day we were sent to an Indian Reservation to mop up hot spots from the fire that had burned through earlier. Fairly routine work and we had become accustomed to doing this. When evening arrived, our strike team leader had a treat for us. He had arranged with a local casino for us to go there for dinner before we had to go and find a place to camp for the night. The food was greatly appreciated!! Afterwards, our strike team leader staged us at a location overlooking the town and the casino. It was a site to behold that night with the stars above and the town lights below. The darkness did a lot to mask the scars and destruction from the fire that had raged through the area days earlier.

The next morning we were relieved and we returned to base camp to await another assignment. It wasn't long in coming and soon we then sent to another location for "mop up". After that it was back to base camp and then out to another mop up assignment and then back to base camp. This became our routine for the next couple of days.

After 9 days on the line, the "decision makers" were starting to release some strike teams. We were "hoping" but they were hesitant to let us go home because we were the only Type-3 strike team available. Our strike team leaders, however, pulled some strings and got us a conditional release. We could start on our way home but we would have to stop in Madera and "stage" just in case they needed us to come back south. So we sort of started for home.

As we pulled into our staging in Madera we began to hold our breath that we didn't get that call. After checking in, the strike team leaders surprised us again when they came out and told us they had motel rooms

for us. This was the first real bed and hot shower we had in 9 days! So what if they hold onto us for one more day, Madera was sure a lot closer to Mosquito than where we had been for the last week and a half.

The "return down south" call never came and the next day we were up, rested, <u>clean</u> and all of us in great moods as we started our trek the rest of the way home.

For me, this was an experience of a lifetime; challenging, sometimes downright scary, fulfilling when you saved a stranger's home and a tremendous course in professional development. I would like to thank Floyd Baumgartner and Dave Erdman for sharing it with me. The Fire District is very fortunate to have a community that backs the department in a way that enables us to go out and help other communities when needed. God forbid, but if our community was ever in need like those folks down south, we know that these other Fire Departments would be here helping us.

Items Accepted are: Motor oil/oil filters, Household cleaners, Pool/photo chemicals, Paint, stains, varnishes & thinners, Automotive products, Solvents, Removers, Aerosol cans, Adhesives/sealant, Pesticides, Herbicides, Batteries, Vapor & sodium lamps, 5-gallon propane tanks, Fluorescent light tubes, Mercury switches/thermostats and most products labeled "Caution", "Danger" or "Poison".

Items "not" accepted: Electronic waste, Appliances, Radioactive materials, Infectious medical waste, Explosives, Compressed gas cylinders.

Please limit materials to 5 gallons or 50 pounds; however, you may transport up to 20 gallons of used oil or latex paint with no single container larger than 5 gallons. Recipe of the Month

White Chocolate Crème Brulee

5 large Egg yolks

1/2 cup Sugar

2 cups whipping cream

3 ounces White imported chocolate -- finely chopped

1/4 teaspoon Vanilla extract

2 tablespoons sugar

Position rack in center of oven and preheat to 300F. Whisk egg yolks and 1/4 cup sugar in medium bowl. Bring cream and remaining 1/4 cup sugar to simmer in heavy medium saucepan. Reduce heat to low. Gradually add chopped chocolate to cream mixture and whisk until smooth.

Gradually whisk hot chocolate mixture into yolk mixture. Mix in vanilla. Ladle custard into four 10-ounce custard cups (or crème Brulee cups). Place cups in large baking pan. Add enough hot water to pan to come halfway up sides of cups.

Bake until custards are set in center, about 1 hour. Remove custards from water and cool. Cover and refrigerate overnight. Preheat broiler. Sprinkle 1/2 tablespoon sugar over each custard. Broil until sugar caramelizes, watching carefully, about 2 minutes. Serve hot, or refrigerate up to 1 hour and serve cold.
