### Chief's Corner by Chief Bob Davis

"CAUTION" Things may not be what they seem .... Don't let the rain that we had and the cool weather fool you. We are still in a HIGH FIRE DANGER time

of the year!

Having said that, I do have to say that the prospects are looking better for us to get through another summer without a large wildland fire in the District. We still have the warm Indian Summer but the weather has definitely been turning toward fall and the coming winter. Personally, I've found the cooler mornings, the leaves turning color and the days getting shorter to be a refreshing change. But of course, reality then sets in and I realize that this is also the time of year when we need to start planning for the upcoming winter.

Recently I had an interesting conversation with one of our volunteer fire fighters. He asked me why we don't have as many chimney fires in the fall and winter as we use to have "back in the old days". After giving it some thought I told him that I didn't know for sure but I would venture a guess that it has to do with the fact that about 80% of the homes up here are now heated with propane and wood is just not the fuel of choice anymore. But then I told him that economic conditions could certainly change that statistic. If the estimates are correct and propane costs this winter increase by as much as 22% over last winter we could easily see a resurgence of wood stoves as a desirable heat source again.

So that brings me to my first winter prep suggestion. If you are going to use a wood stove for home heating or for just plain "ambiance" this winter, please make sure your chimney is inspected and cleaned. I reccomend that it be done by a professional chimney sweep because not only do they do a thorough cleaning but they also know what common problems to look for and the best way to get

them fixed.

Winter will also bring about a change in driving conditions. When the first few rains of the season hit us the roads are going to be real slippery until the oils that have risen to the surface during the summer are washed off. That brings me to my next winter prep suggestion. A good way to prepare for our winter driving is to make sure you have winter tires on your vehicle that are in good condition. BUT, the very best thing to do is to slow down!!! Four-wheeled drive and winter tires might offer some help but believe me they are nothing compared to the value of SLOWING DOWN.

### **SCPOA Report**

Many of you have seen Johnathan working on Dyer lake over the past month. He has been taking advantage of the dry year to clean as much of the silt from the bottom of the lake as possible. And, as you have seen it has been a significant amount. This will give us a healthier lake as it refills and don't worry the cat tails will return; they are already starting to regrow even without the water. If you're interested in getting some of the silt from the lake for your garden let Johnathan know and he will work with you to set up a day to load your vehicle.

Our search for a bookkeeper has lasted several months. After reviewing all of the applications, we are pleased to announce that Barbara Beacham was chosen to fill the position. We would also like to thank Barbara for all the time and effort she put in while on the board of directors, she resigned her position on the board in order to take the bookkeeping position. This leaves the board short one member so if anyone is interested in stepping in please let us know.

We still have 36 members who have not paid their dues assessment for this year. This leaves us with just over a \$33,000 shortfall. Our secretary continues to work with those who need to make payments and as we go forward we want to emphasize that you can start prepaying your dues assessment anytime rather than leaving it until the due date. If you are interested in starting payments please contact Lynda at 621-0309, she will be happy to assist you.

Johnathan has been working with EID to properly fix the patches that had been made to our roads when cutting across them to put in water lines. Several have already been taken care of and the work will continue until the project is completed.

The board contacted Tom Ceilio from the county DOT about adding stop lines and wording to the road at Mosquito Road and Highgrade Street. After speaking with him, it was determined that we can do this and will be looking into the cost of materials. The condition of Mosquito and Rock Creek Roads was also brought up and the lack of maintenance on them. The county has the responsibility to maintain these roads and we need to encourage our members to let DOT know that we want repairs done. Tom Ceilio is the person to contact, his number is 642-4905. Please make your call to request maintenance on these roads.

Letters have been sent to homeowners along the runway letting them know that they need to maintain the area of 125ft from the centerline clear of any obstacles. Some have allowed vegetation growth to return and we hope to have it clear again as soon as possible. A question was asked about having guests fly into our airport and if they needed to check in with anyone. Our airport has a few interesting quirks so we would suggest contacting our secretary Lynda who will provide the number of one of our active pilots so that your guest can get the pertinent information. The runway is available to all members and their quests for landings, take offs and parking. The website committee had a busy session last meeting attempting to repair the website after it was hacked into. Mario from Bosnia managed to get in and put banners with his name on them on the site, it has been repaired and security measures have been taken. If anyone has any suggestions for additions to the site we would like to hear from you.

A discussion was held concerning providing a swing set and play structure at Dyer Lake. Preliminary information is that it would add a small increase to our insurance each year and the cost to purchase the set could be up to \$9,000. A concern was brought up about spending money on a new project when we are having to look at a dues increase again. It was suggested that we move the existing swings from Catfish Lake to Dyer Lake. The issue will be addressed further at a future meeting so if you have input please come to our next meetings.

There have been many questions regarding costs of the airport and why we can't just turn it over to the pilots. The airport is a common area and belongs to everyone, we can't separate it from the association just like we can't separate any of our lakes from the association. There is a misconception about the cost of the airport. Averaging the cost of the work we have done over the expected life of the runway surface is about \$23.00 per parcel per year and we expect it to exceed it's life span. Needless to say even if we could separate it the cost savings would be pretty insignificant especially when compared to it's value to the community.

The issue of dues has become more important as they increase, especially in this difficult economy. We had several members at our last budget meeting and spent time explaining our responsibilities to comply with Davis Stirling regarding reserve funding as well as State law. We will try to communicate these responsibilities more fully, but we also need to encourage anyone with questions to ask them and come to the meetings. We will need to have a vote on our budget and dues possibly at our next meeting so now is time to be involved and attend the monthly SCPOA meeting. Having had some positive feedback about our weekday meeting, we will try it again for November.

Our next regular meeting will be **Monday November 10th at 6:30 PM** at the fire station. We may be ready to vote on the dues so please plan to attend.
