Chief's Corner

Ooops! When I was giving out all of the "thank you's" last month, I forgot to mention the Fire District Board (and believe me, they let me know the error of my ways!) So, let me start 2009 by saying, "Thank you Mosquito Fire District Board of Directors for all the help and support you've given me!."

Here's a little more reflection on 2008. This year has been a busy one with most of our fires happening in the early part of the fire season. The summer certainly had the potential for being a busy and devastating one for not only our community but for all of El Dorado County. Fortunately, we were able to get on those wildland fires that we did have before they had an opportunity to take off. But we did get some wildland fire fighting experience: the Lighting Complex Fires to our north and the Telegraph Fire and Tea Fire to our south. We spent a total of four weeks on mutual aid strike teams. It's pretty obvious that the State is utilizing strike teams more now then they did in the past and I'm sure this trend will continue. One of the benefits to the District from our participation in these strike teams is that the fire fighters get some terrific experience and the District even gets paid for it.

As I said, we were busy this year compared to the past. We had 29 structure/wildland responses. On the wildland fires, a quick response combined with our volunteer firefighters' skill enabled us to control them before they spread. However, they each had great potential and we were fortunate to have had several volunteers available when the fires occurred. The same can be said for our structure calls. The availability of our volunteers along with their skill and our quick response kept damage to a minimum on most of the fires. We did have one structure fire resulting in about a 30% loss. That fire occurred in an unoccupied house at about 10:30 pm. Luckily a neighbor happened to lock outside and spotted the fire. Gratefully, there were no serious injuries from our fires this year..

This year we also "proved" the nation-wide fact that the majority of what today's fire departments do is respond to non-fire related calls for service; medical aid, vehicle accidents and public assists. In our District, as it is with the other districts in the county, about 80% of our calls fall into this category. This year we were dispatched to 88 of these non-fire related calls. The medical aid calls and public assist calls can occur anytime but many of the vehicle accidents occurred in bad weather with people going way to fast for the conditions. There were a few injuries but fortunately there were no fatalities.

All in all this past year was a relatively good one for us and hopefully 2009 will have us responding to fewer calls.

Drive Safe!!! Now that we have had our first taste of winter snow you have an idea of the hazardous road conditions that we can get up here.

Have a great, fire safe 2009.

This year I hope every one has an opportunity to come down and visit Finnon Lake. Camping, picnicking or just a brisk walk around our perimeter trail are all available - come check us out.

If you heard Carl Weiland's briefing at the Christmas Pot Luck, you know that we are still being considered for a grant to help repair Finnon Dam. Hopefully we will have a "yes" or "no" by the end of March. If we are selected for the grant there will be lots for everyone to do in order to prepare for the first scoop of dirt to be moved.

Please join us for our first board meeting in 2009 on January 1st at 7 pm at the fire station; yes, it's New Years Day evening. What better way to start a new year off right.

May this year be one of great joy for everyone and may we all spend time bringing our community together as one so that we can enjoy this great place "Mosquito".

SCPOA Report

"Thank You" to those members who attended our December meeting. We had hoped for a bigger turnout since it was the meeting where we needed to make a decision on the budget and any dues increases for the next year.

Johnathan has been hard at work doing maintenance on equipment and burning the piles of cleared brush as time and burn conditions allow. Fencing replacement will probably start in the spring and road patching will continue as weather permits. We are still accepting applications for a maintenance assistant to start work in early spring so if anyone is interested, please contact our secretary, Lynda, at 621-0309.

We are hopping that Mother Nature will provide some substantial amounts of rain this winter to start refilling Dyer Lake. Just in case this doesn't happen, we have also significantly increased the budget allocation for water to bring the lake level up for next summer.

The budget committee has had many meetings over the last couple of months to get a budget together. Unlike our state government, we can't spend more then we take in. This has been a difficult process considering that our delinquent rate has increased significantly; we have over \$30,000 in uncollected dues for 2008. We really appreciated the number of members who took the time to participate and learn how the process works. We even had our CPA come to two of the meetings to review our budget and offer suggestions. He noted that it was about the leanest budget he had seen for an association our size. Our new bookkeeper and past board member. Barb Beacham, spent many hours bringing our books up to date and treasurer Tee Stierwalt worked out multiple budget scenarios on spreadsheets for us to review. We really want to thank Barb and Wayne Mikel for stepping up and getting involved to present more options which ultimately led to our final budget. Thanks to lots of hard work, we were able to present and pass a budget on time that met all the legal requirements without a dues increase for this year.

We realize that our assessments are due at a rather difficult time of year so we will be starting an education campaign to let everyone know that you don't need to wait until March to pay them. We want to encourage anyone who is interested, to start making payments on the following years dues as soon after March as practical, obviously the more months it is spread over the less impact it will have each month. There are a number of members doing this now and we would like to encourage anyone who has questions to contact Lynda at 621-0309 or come to a meeting.

The road committee will start having meetings next month in preparation for getting a bid package ready to go out in March, 2009. Our chairman, Tom Schmidt, suggested that we make an attempt to secure asphalt grindings from the work to be done on highway 50 starting this month. A motion was made and passed to commit the unused road budget from this year to get as much of the material as we can in order to do as many courts as we could. This product would allow us to provide a better then chip seal like surface for a fraction of the cost. It would be finished by rolling and applying a layer of oil in the summer. Unfortunately this project will now be on hold since the paid state legislature seems to be incapable of putting together a balanced budget and the highway project has been stopped for now. We will continue to pursue this option when it becomes available again.

We have been alternating our monthly meetings between Mondays and Saturdays to see if one is more convenient then the other for most people. We have had good turnouts on Mondays so for this next year we will try having monthly meetings on the second Monday of the month at 6:00 PM. Our next meeting will be on **Monday, January 12th at 6:00 PM** at the fire station.

Recipe of the Month by Rock Creek Café

Ginger-marinated grilled Portobello Mushrooms

Because of their larger size and firmer texture, Portobello mushrooms are good candidates for stuffing or grilling. They have a satisfying taste and texture with virtually no fat or sodium. This recipe will serve 4.

Ingredients:

4 large Portobello mushrooms
1/4 cup balsamic vinegar
½ cup pineapple juice
2 tablespoons chopped fresh ginger, peeled
1 tablespoon chopped fresh basil

Directions

Clean mushrooms with a damp cloth and remove their stems. Place in a glass dish; stem less (gill) side up.

To prepare the marinade, in a small bowl whisk together the vinegar, pineapple juice and ginger. Drizzle the marinade over the mushrooms. Cover and let marinate in the refrigerator for about 1 hour, turning mushrooms once.

Prepare a hot fire in a charcoal grill or heat a gas grill or broiler. Away from the heat source, lightly coat the grill rack or broiler pan with cooking spray. Position the cooking rack 4 to 6 inches from the heat source.

Grill or broil the mushrooms on medium heat, turning often, until tender, about 5 minutes on each side. Baste with marinade to keep from drying out. Using tongs, transfer the mushrooms to a serving platter. Garnish with basil and serve immediately.
