Chief's Corner by Chief Bob Davis

WOW!, can you believe the weather we have had? When I call my parents down in the valley, it's nice to brag about the sunshine up here "on the hill". However, the cold and rainy weather is not over. We are only half way through the winter and those of us who have been using wood stoves and fireplaces to heat our houses need to clean the chimneys to avoid having a chimney fire.

I have had several people ask me how they will know if they are having a chimney fire. Well, the answer is not "cut and dried". Sometimes you may not even be aware of the fire as they are often somewhat minor. And, if the chimney was constructed or installed correctly and has not suffered damage from a previous chimney fire things will most likely be all right and the chimney can contain the fire. However, if your chimney has not been cleaned for some time and/or you have been burning your stove with a partially closed damper, there may be enough of creosote that has built up on the chimney interior that it can start a serious burn. In this case the fire will probably be very intense, with a great deal of noise and vibration coming from the chimney flue, The smell is similar to that of burning paint and there could be some vibrations coming from the stove doors or dampers. Outside there may be a great deal of flame visible from the chimney cap and possibly extending several feet above. It is also possible for creosote to be pushed out of the chimney and onto the roof.

An intense chimney fire is a bad thing that could result in extensive damage, or someone getting seriously hurt. If the fire is intense enough the chimney could fail and then the fire will extend into the attic and/or onto the roof resulting in major structural damage. So, if you suspect there is a fire in your chimney, call 911 immediately. We will then be dispatched and on our way to your house to check

for any fire extension and do everything possible to put it out. Do not hesitate, make that call!

Congratulations to the EMT class of 2008. The class started last September and ended on December 27<sup>th</sup>. This year we decided to give the class in the fall and ran into some obstacles with the fires down south. Some of the students were temporarily pulled out for strikes team assignments but the class was completed and all passed. A big thank-you to Leo Chaloux for teaching the class again.

Johnathan has been busy doing much needed maintenance on the tractor, the water pump has been replaced and the radiator fixed. He will continue to do road work as temperatures allow; it takes a number of warm days in a row to soften the patch material enough to work with so he will use it when he can.

We still have a significant number of delinquent accounts from last year and, unfortunately, a number of them are associated with foreclosures. Our secretary, Lynda, has been working very hard attempting to get the banks to pay. At this point we have just over \$38,000 in outstanding dues. We know how difficult it can be to come up with a large single payment once a year so we would like to encourage our members to think about our dues "prepay program" which is now available. Dyer Lake is still quite low due to our lack of rain and the Board does understand how important and popular this common area is to the community. We have significantly increased our water budget for next year to fill the lake in the spring if we do not get enough rain.

Many companies have no work planned so it is hoped that we will get some very competitive bids by getting it in early. We will be having a road meeting, which will include looking at the road work tentatively planned for 2009, on Thursday January 29th at 8:00 AM at the fire station. Tom will be taking a day off to do this so it would be great to have a lot of community involvement. We will have signs out and in case a change is made or you can contact Lynda at 621-1049 for any possible changes.

Speaking of roads, we are still hoping to get some road grindings to use on our courts as well and other less traveled areas, This product will allow us to address some less used areas for a very significant savings. The big holdup is that our state doesn't have a budget and the project on Hwy 50 is on hold. When the project resumes, we will do our best to secure some of this product.

We are also pricing some new signs to be posted on Dogwood Lane in an attempt to stop trucks from using it as a throughway. This is causing increased damage to a road not designed for routine usage by big trucks. We are also looking at a sign to let people, unfamiliar with the area, know that East Highgrade is not a through street. This will help reduce destruction of the end of the road by vehicles having to turn around.

We would like to thank everyone who attended the January meeting! We appreciate the input and information provided. Our next meeting is our annual meeting on Saturday February 14th at 10:00 AM at the fire station. Hope to see you all there.

#### **Recipe of the Month**

#### **BREAD PUDDING WITH WHISKEY SAUCE**

Yields 6 servings

#### **BREAD PUDDING**

3 1/2 cups Sugar

2 tsp. Ground Cinnamon

1 tsp. of Nutmeg

6 Medium Eggs

1 cup Heavy Cream

4 cups Milk

1 tsp. Vanilla

French Bread (approx. 18" in length), Sliced thin

#### WHISKEY SAUCE

1 cup Heavy Cream

2 cups Whole milk

1 Tbsp. Corn Starch

1 Tbsp. Water

6 Tbsp. Sugar

1/4 cup Bourbon

To make the bread pudding, preheat oven to 300 degrees. Grease an 8" square baking pan. Combine sugar, cinnamon, and nutmeg in a large bowl. Beat in the eggs until smooth, add the milk then work in the heavy cream. Add the vanilla, Arrange the bread slices in the pan pour the mixture over the bread. Allow bread to soak up the custard. Cover with plastic wrap and foil then place pan in a water bath. Bake for approximately 45-60 minutes, uncover the pudding and bake until the pudding has a golden brown color and is firm to the touch. If a toothpick inserted in the pudding comes out clean, it is done. The mixture of pudding should be nice and moist, not runny or dry. Serve warm.

To make the whiskey sauce, place the cream and milk in a small saucepan over medium heat, and bring to a boil. Whisk corn starch and water together, and add to cream while whisking. Bring to a boil.

Whisk and let simmer for a few seconds, taking care not to burn the mixture on the bottom. Remove from heat. Stir in the sugar and the bourbon. Taste to make sure the sauce has a thick consistency, a sufficiently sweet taste, and a good bourbon flavor. Pour over the Bread Pudding
