Chief's Corner by Chief Bob Davis

SNOW... and lots of it! That's what we got in mid February. But all in all we didn't do too badly. Snow-slick roads led to a few vehicle accidents but no serious injuries. We had a power outage but it was short lived compared to some that we have had recently and we had trees down here and there. Winter's not over so take the knowledge you gained from this storm to prepare for the next one.

As you have probably heard and/or read in the newspaper, the Board of Supervisors is considering stopping the payment of "augmentation funds" to eight fire districts in the county. Mosquito is one of those districts. We receive around \$35,000 annually from this funding source. Let me try to briefly explain what the "augmentation funding" is, how it came about and what its loss will mean to us.

When a special district is formed, the Board of Supervisors determines how much of the property tax that they collect will go back to the new district for the services they provide. When our fire district was formed in 1977, the Supervisors determined that we could function financially on about 10 cents of every dollar collected. There's no magic formula for determining what percentage will be allocated to a new district and as other fire districts were formed. the funding was not consistent. Right now it ranges from about 6% to 22%. In the early 1990's, the Fire Chiefs Association went to the Board of Supervisors and pointed out the inequity in funding. Why were some districts expected to provide fire services on 6% while other districts got as much as 22%. The Supervisors agreed that there were inequities and determined that 13% was an acceptable average rate. So those 8 districts that received less than 13% were given "augmentation funding" to bring their allocation up to the average level. (Those agencies that were getting more than the 13% average didn't change. They continued to get the amount allocated at their formation.) Since there is no legal mandate to continue paying these supplemental funds, it's one of the budget cuts the Board of Supervisors is considering as they deal with the county's fiscal shortfall.

How will the loss of these funds impact us? Right now and for the last 7 or so years we have used this augmentation funding to make our annual payment on the new fire apparatus that we have purchased. We make one payment a year and it is just at \$35,000. So if we lose that funding, we will have to cut our operating budget in other places to come up with the \$35,000 for the payment at least for another five years until our newest engine is paid off.

It's not all gloom, however. The Supervisors haven't as yet voted to end augmentation payments so we <u>might</u> still get it in FY 2009-2010. And, our Fire District Board of Directors established a reserve account a few years ago which currently has enough in it to make one year's payment. So we might be good for a couple of years. But the following years will require some serious budget cuts to come up with the \$35,000.

The purpose of the augmentation funding was to right a wrong. That condition still exists and I personally think that the augmentation funding is fair and necessary. Our Supervisor, Ron Briggs, has stated that he supports the continuation of the augmentation funding fire departments. But as with all those in political positions, nothing is really important until the voters start "talking." So a phone call or email to Supervisor Briggs, letting him know that you do not want to see the \$35,000 we have been receiving from the County as "Augmentation Funding" go away couldn't hurt.

Hi, I'm Kelly Hern and I'm the "Phone Tree Coordinator" for our community. I would like to introduce our new residents (and reacquaint some of our old residents) to the Phone Tree. First off, what's the Phone Tree, you ask? Well it's one of the ways that we get the word out when there's an event that warrants wide spread notification to our residents. These "events" are generally emergency in nature; a wild land fire, a road closure or a pending evacuation, but it could also be simply letting the community know about a special meeting which would be of general interest to our residents. Some examples of these types of meetings (events) would be the updates given by DOT when our bridge was closed, a "Town Hall" meeting held by our District 4 Supervisor or the meetings held by the Forest Service to let us know about pending operations or activities in the National Forest.

Who are the Phone Tree callers? They are a group of community members who have volunteered to make these calls when the Phone Tree is activated by either the Fire Department or the Mosquito Volunteer Fire Association. And.... we could use your help because we need a few more volunteer callers. If you are interested in becoming a Phone Tree caller give me a call at 295-9165

Will I be called if the Phone Tree is activated? If you are listed in the new 2009 Mosquito Phone Book you will be called. If you're not in the Phone Book but would still like to be on the Phone Tree call list give me a call and I will see that you are added to the list. Our Phone Tree lists are not public and are only accessed by our callers so your privacy will not be

compromised by being placed on the Phone Tree call list.

Fire Protection for Common Areas by Deanna Snyder

Dogwood Lane is a very narrow road that runs between Mosquito and Stope. A good portion of the land along the west side of the Lane makes up the Dogwood Common Area. It is a very heavily treed and brushy area for fire protection equipment to access safely. The area was "brushed" a couple of years ago during the fuel reduction program and then sprayed by Sears Weed Control to keep new growth in check. But, a lot of debris has accumulated over the last two winters and some community volunteers are working get it burned and cleaned before the summer fire season.

The Lane has changed over the last 18 years. A horseback riding and walking trail was established so that people could safely enjoy the area without having to use the narrow pavement. Jonathan has widened the lane in a few spots where two cars can now pass safely. New signs have been posted to keep large, heavy trucks off of the roadway. So now it's our turn to do our part. If your property is on Dogwood Lane between Mosquito Road and Stope Drive or backs up to the common area you may want to participate in the clean up because fire usually burns up the hill, not down. If you like to run, jog, walk, bicycle, do bird watching, ride your horse, take pictures or just like to use Dogwood to pass thru for sight seeing you might want to join in. There are a large number of people who use the Lane and the trail daily, we see them from our home on Dogwood.

We will be having our first official work day on March 14, 2009 at 9:00 am. We will meet on the Lane about midway. The fire department will be on hand for water supply as we do our burning. If it's not be a burn day we can still get the piles ready for the next burn day. So, if you can help please bring your clippers, hand pruners, shovels, gloves, chainsaws, gas powered

weed eaters, drinking water, etc. There are a few large trees that have fallen also and the wood will be available to those that help. In the meantime, you may see small work parties already working on the trail as time and weather permits. If you decide to work on a common area in and around your own home, remember to contact the SCPOA secretary, Lynda Lima, and obtain the insurance forms before you begin. If we don't see you on the lane for cleanup, please continue to use the trail for your exercise and enjoyment. Thanks in advance and you can contact Joe or Deanna at 626-5278 if you have any questions.

As a Board member of the El Dorado County Fire Safe Council it was brought to my attention that in the near future there will be the possibility of acquiring federal grants that could be utilized for the protection of communities from wild fire. The recently passed stimulus bill signed by the President will have available large amounts of monies specifically established to provide fuel reduction, wild fire awareness, and public education programs. A large portion of these monies will be assigned to communities in the western states where wild fire is a major threat. In order to obtain top consideration for any of these funds it is necessary for a community to be recognized as a Firewise Community. Currently, Mosquito has been recognized as a Fire Safe Community through the El Dorado County Fire Safe Council, but a great deal of work has to be done in order to become a Firewise Community. gained support from the Mosquito Volunteer Fire Association to help in the effort of becoming a Firewise Community.
