Chief's Corner by Chief Bob Davis

Boy Mother Nature can't make up her mind! A month ago we had 80 degree weather, then cold and snow. Now we're back into the warm weather again. I wish that we could have the green grass year around like they have back east. Anyway spring is coming and the grass is really growing. You still have an opportunity to clear some of the brush off your land and more important get that 30 feet of Lean, Clean, Green Zone along with the 100 foot Defensible Space around your home as required by State law.

Starting in May, burn permits will be required in order to do any yard burning. Currently burn permits can be acquired at the fire station or at any CDF station in the county. There is no charge for a permit and if you get one at the fire station all you have to do is put up with our little speech on what is required to get and use the permit.

Permits are for the burning of yard trash. That is defined as leaves, pine needles, and small piles of cut brush. A burn pile can only be 4 feet in diameter and when you are burning you must be in attendance and a water supply such as a garden hose or a five gallon bucket of water must be available for quick use. Only vegetation can be burned. Basically if an item is man made it cannot be burned.

Make sure you call Burn Day Information number (621-5897) right before you burn as restrictions can change during the day. When you call you will get a recorded message that starts out with a liability and responsibility lawyer driven statement. Such as if your burn project escapes and gets on the property

of another you can be held responsible for suppression charges and damages. You will also be told if it is a burn day (go for it), it is not a burn day (don't go for it), and the last is that it is a burn day with a permit between the hours of such and such. Just pay attention and do what the recording says. If you have any questions please call the fire station (626-9017) and we will do our best to answer them.

Also, if you would like we will come out and look at your property to give you some pointers on what should be done to make your house more survivable in the event of a wild land fire. Above all, if you are burning and it gets away from you please call 911 and we will be dispatched, Chief Officer and all to put it out. Don't wait for the fire to get to be two acres before you call us, at that point it will probably be on your neighbors property. That gets rough, remember the "lawyer driven" statement at the start of the burn information day recording.

As you read the Byte, you'll notice a few references to "Fire Station Face Lift". What's that all about? Well our Fire Station is approaching it's 30th birthday and as you might have noticed it's age is starting to show. Some of the siding is deteriorating, there's signs of dry rot in the roof, the windows are single pane, the kitchen needs some remodeling and the remaining asphalt areas are in bad need of replacing. All of that work equals \$\$\$\$. Unfortunately our District budget for next year wont support all of these needs so with help from the Firefighters and MVFA, there's going to be a "Fund Raiser" event at Dyer Lake on May 16th (See the Notice on Page 3) Hope you can make it and participate.

Be careful and let's have a fire safe spring.

Recipe for the Month by Chef Frank

Homemade Focaccia Bread Serves 12

INGREDIENTS:

- 3 1/2 cups all-purpose flour
- 1 teaspoon white sugar
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1 tablespoon active dry yeast
- 1 cup water
- 2 tablespoons vegetable oil
- 1 eac
- 3 tablespoons olive oil
- 1 teaspoon dried rosemary, crushed

DIRECTIONS:

Combine 1 cup flour, sugar, salt, and yeast. Mix well. Heat water and vegetable oil until warm, and add to yeast mixture along with the egg. Blend with an electric mixer at low speed until moistened. Beat for 2 additional minutes. Stir in 1 3/4 cup flour while beating, until dough pulls away from side of bowl.

Knead in 3/4 cup flour on floured surface. Cover dough with a bowl, and let sit for 5 minutes. Place dough on a greased baking sheet. Roll out to 12 inch circle. Cover with greased plastic wrap and a cloth towel. Place in a warm place for 30 minutes.

Uncover dough, and poke holes in it with a spoon handle at 1 inch intervals. Drizzle olive oil on dough, and sprinkle with crushed rosemary. Bake at 400 degrees F (205 degrees C) for 17 to 27 minutes, until just golden. Remove from baking sheet, and cool on rack.
