

Chief's Corner

WELL, Mother Nature just cannot make up her mind, we had sun, then rain, then sun and lighting with a little rain. Just when I thought I was done weed-eating it rains again. Looks like I'll be at it again. The lighting reminds me of last year when we had all the dry lightening strikes up north in June without the rain. The fires started by this phenomenon were devastating and cost the state over 50 million dollars to fight.

I know you've heard this before but our local wild land fire problem is not a unique one. So, I would like once more to write about what to do when a fire does start in or near our community. Notice I did not say "if" a fire starts but "when". It is simply a matter of time when either Mother Nature, an accident, or an arson fire will start.

Since wild land fires are generally a function of people's activities and movements, the odds are that a fire will either start on Rock Creek Road in the vicinity of the Rock Creek Bridge, on Mosquito Road at the swinging bridge or at Slab Creek Reservoir. In either of these cases, that fire will originate in a deep

canyon with steep walls and a great deal of fuel. This type of fire will start easy and accelerate quickly burning up the canyon walls to the top. Once at the top depending on weather conditions the fire will spread out and most likely be fuel driven. From a suppression stand point the best opportunity to put such a fire out is when it just hits the top and does not have a chance to spread out. That suppression is often a result of weather conditions, the type of fuel burning and resources available to carry out the suppression activity.

Although our primary responsibility is to protect the lives and property (structures) of the people of our community, when a wild land fire does occur in our community we are among the first Departments dispatched. And, obviously we are generally the first to arrive on the scene. We are very aggressive when it comes to fighting wild land fires as we know that the best way to save structures is to put out the fire before it gets any size to it. So when we arrive we consider three priorities; fire fighter safety, the safety of those people in our community and then property. Those three priorities are what we consider when we respond to a wild land fire. Is there an obvious danger to human life? Do we aggressively attack the fire? Or do we dedicate our

few resources to protect a house. We always do everything possible to protect the house but only after someone's life is not being threatened or a fire fighters safety is not being jeopardized.

So when this big fire does come along what can you as a member of this community do? **First off by making sure good clearances are maintained around your house** you will greatly increase our ability to save your house. Making sure your driveway is cleared enough to make it possible for a fire engine to get to your house. Remember your little Toyota may be able to access your driveway but can a 16-ton fire engine do it. Take the time to look at your driveway and see if a cement truck or a moderate sized U-haul truck can go down it without hitting trees, brush or other obstacles. Make sure your roof and gutters are clean and any hanging limbs are removed. Be aware of how your house fits in the wild land and see if it can be saved. If you are not sure give Floyd or myself a call at 626-9017 and we will set up an appointment for an evaluation of your house and check it out for you.

Other things you can do to lessen the impact of a large fire is to make sure important papers and documents are stored in a safe place or are ready to be moved with you in the event of an evacuation. Make sure all members in your family know what to do if there is a fire. Where they are to meet, whom they can stay with, what they can do to help each other, and what they need to get by for several days. Each family should have a plan developed and reviewed so that each member knows what to do. A little planning in the beginning could be a lifesaver.

One thing to take into consideration during a fire is that there are only three ways in and out of our community. Either west on Rock Creek Road, south on Mosquito Road or north on Mosquito Road through the National Forest which is all dirt and can be a difficult ride depending on the vehicle you are driving. To keep anyone from getting hurt during an event and keep the roads clear for the emergency vehicles, the roads that are in the area of the fire are blocked off. To help solve these problems the Fire Department Support Group and members of the Pilots Association who own hangers have developed plans to evacuate to the airport if it becomes necessary. Often it is better to evacuate people to a safe and nearby location like the airport then having them drive down long dangerous roads to get out of

the area. Several of the owners of hangers at the Swansboro Runway have graciously stated they will open their hangers to the community in the event an evacuation is necessary. This evacuation effort most likely start off with a reverse 911 call from the Sheriff's office notifying that you need to evacuate. Working with the Mosquito Fire Department Support Group and the American Red Cross. An area for animals has also been established for evacuation and will be controlled by the El Dorado County Animal Control and the Support Group.

I don't want to scare anyone, but I want you to realize that we live in a world of risk. Fires are a part of living in the state of California and especially in the foothills. Therefore we have to be ready, do some planning with your family, get important personnel papers together, rely on common sense thinking and above all, be safe.

SCPOA Report

Our big issue the last couple of months has been determining the road work to be done, putting together a bid package and reviewing the bids that came in. We are pleased to announce that we received some very competitive bids and have chosen Delta Construction to do the work for us. They are the same company that did our last road and runway work and apparently really like working up here since they ended up being the lowest bid this time around. The bonus of the low bid will be that we can do more work than we planned, at this point the roads that will be done are: Swansboro road from Claim to the end, Stope from E Highgrade to Maidu, Maidu near Dogwood to the intersection of Log Cabin and then out log cabin as far as our funds will take it. The costs for road work are the lowest by far that they have been in a long while so we are going to try to catch up on as much as possible. If you are interested in getting a quote on your own project while Delta is up here you can contact them at 916-364-0292 to see if they can assist you. We do not have a schedule when the work will start yet but as soon as we do it will be announced in the Byte.

Johnathan and Kevin have been busy prepping, cleaning and brushing along the roads that will be worked on so they'll be ready when the contractor is, they will resume other road work when all the prep work is done. Johnathan also wanted to look into the possible purchase of an older dump truck that he

could use for hauling brush and dirt from ditching, costs will be looked into and then a decision can be made.

Dyer Lake is looking great with the expanded beaches on both sides and a good water level thanks to all of the rain this spring, which has so far remained at a nice level. We will be adding water to the lake at a constant flow for the next month to see the effects on the level while monitoring the expense.

The budget committee has been reviewing our current financial's and Browning Reserve in order to determine our options as far as potentially paying down some of our loan as well as doing more road work. Thank you to Barb Mikels who has been a huge asset in helping us understand the reserve study and making suggestions of some possible options. We are still in the process of renegotiating our loan and have been offered a decent proposal but are continuing to see if we can do better. We will be having more meetings so if you are interested in learning more or would like to participate watch for the signs announcing the meetings and please come join us.

Last month I forgot to give an update on some news regarding law suits brought by an individual who, in the past, has been a significant expense for our Association. Many of you probably remember Don Lee and his seemingly endless lawsuits against SCPOA. One suit was about his dogs in which, with the assistance of animal control, SCPOA was successful in getting them declared potentially dangerous animals. These are the same dogs that have led to the criminal charges he now faces after they allegedly attacked an elderly lady in Pollock Pines. In the last case that Mr. Lee brought against SCPOA, the judge finally ruled in our favor issuing a judgement against Mr. Lee. SCPOA was awarded costs and the issue ended. Unfortunately, SCPOA will see no money from this judgement. Any money that might be collected will go back to the insurance company who paid the bills during the trial process. But again it will finalize another judgement against Mr. Lee.

Our next meeting will be Monday July 13th, at 6:00 PM at the Fire Station, we hope to see you.

Mosquito Prevention by Front Yard Nursery

If you were plagued by mosquitoes this spring (and still are), here are a few facts to help you learn more about these pesky bloodsuckers.

Mosquito Facts

- Only female mosquitoes bite. They require a "blood meal" in order to develop eggs. Most females lay their eggs on standing water (even a few tablespoons of water in a flower pot will work).
- After the eggs hatch, they become swimming larvae, and then mature into adults. Mosquito larvae are an important source of food for some fish, birds, and bats.
- Twenty-four hours after hatching, the females fly off in search of a meal. They are attracted to body warmth, odor, moisture, and the carbon dioxide we exhale.
- When the female bites, she injects a bit of saliva that slows coagulation so blood flows freely. Your body's allergic reaction cause the itchy bite later on.

What you can do:

- Look for places where rainwater collects and stands. Fill all holes and depressions. Drain flower pots, children's pools and toys. Flush birdbaths weekly. Clean gutters and drains, and cover cesspools. Remove debris like cans, bottles, and old car tires.
- When you can't flush or drain stagnant areas, use a Bt product like Mosquito Dunks. Bt is a live bacteria that is deadly to mosquito larvae but harmless to other living things. It is also available in granular form by Bayer for numerous wet areas .
- Stock ponds with fish. Goldfish and freshwater minnows will eat mosquito larvae.
- Mosquitoes can carry canine heartworm so make sure your dogs get a heartworm pill once a month.
