Chief's Corner

Wow! What a difference replacing the asphalt has made in the appearance of the station. Now water will run away from the station to the road instead of pooling in the middle of the parking lot or around the kitchen. I'm a little sad about losing that small oak tree in front of the kitchen but the paving contractor couldn't get a proper grade (to guarantee their work) if the tree remained. The next step of the face lift is to complete the wood replacement on the walls. If all goes as planned, we'll get a few courses of brick work on the front too. Then comes the roof, gutters and energy efficient windows. The last task will be painting the entire station exterior.

On the morning of the 13th, I received a call from the County Strike Team coordinator, Bruce Lacher, requesting that we staff an engine to respond to the Lockheed Fire as part of a county task force. By 1:00 pm Engine 275 with Leo Chaloux, Chris Johns and Tom Stuart on board, was on it's way to El Dorado Hills Station 85 to meet up with the rest of the strike team Engines. If the fire containment progress continues, the crew should be back home by Sunday the 23rd.

During a recent Support Group discussion about their role in an ordered "evacuation". They asked how they could identify those resident in the District who, due to medical condition or disability, might need some extra assistance to comply with an evacuation order. As the discussion progressed, we realized that we no longer had an up-to-date list of those people. So, to help us generate a new, updated list I would encourage any resident who might need assistance getting themselves evacuated to please call the station and have Mary, Floyd or I put your name on the list

Since I have put the word out that the Fire District has some openings for Volunteer Fire Fighters, I've had some inquiries about exactly what is involved in becoming a volunteer. Well, the short answer is "a lot". Back in the good ole days, about 10 years ago, being a volunteer fire fighter was not nearly as demanding as it is now. Back then we did not require a fire fighter to attend a basic fire fighter academy, be an Emergency Medical Technician with Automatic Defibrillator and Combitube certificates, or acquire a Class B drivers license. But, way back then we did not offer the higher level of service that we do now.

So what go into being a volunteer fire fighter?

First off there's the "fire" training. Volunteers commit to 2 hours of training on most Tuesday evenings throughout the year. Usually during the first training night they are outfitted with a complete set of structure and complete set of wildland protective equipment. This process alone is often intimidating but is actually fun as it is the first opportunity someone gets to discover exactly what a fire fighter has to wear just to safely do their job. Next, they come to training where they meet the other fire fighters - they are an ugly bunch and love having new people to joke with but they are truly some of the finest people on the hill! The new volunteer begins to learn how we fight fires and how we use the equipment that we have. It's generally "hands on" training requiring the volunteer to put on the proper protective equipment, ride on a fire engine or water tender and participate with whatever training is scheduled for the evening. When there is a Regional Fire Academy - usually every even year - and become a certified basic fire fighter.

In January of every odd year the "medical" training causes the commitment level to ratchet up a notch or two. That's when the new volunteer stops the Tuesday night training with the fire fighters and begins

an Emergency Medical Technician (EMT) class held on Tuesday and Thursday evenings. This training goes on for about four months, and once completed an EMT-1A certificate is earned. And, somewhere along the way we have to squeeze in a CPR class, a Combitude certification class and an Automatic Defibrillator class.

So to answer the question asked above, **HARD WORK** and **COMMITMENT!** But the personal rewards and satisfaction attained are "priceless"!!!

Think you might want to become a volunteer... stop by the station and talk with me.

The road project for the year has been completed by Delta construction! They had a one day delay due to the weird weather and threat of rain but were able to finish the job in just about a week and they also did a great job in minimizing any traffic delays. The areas worked on included Swansboro Rd., Claim St., Stope, Maidu and Log cabin. This was a leveling course which in a couple of years will be followed by the double chip mat to complete the surface.

Johnathan and Kevin had their hands full trying to get all the areas prepped ahead of the road work but they managed. Now they will be back to work on pot hole repair as well as brushing and improving drainage along the roads.

The loan we have had for the past several years from prior road work has been re negotiated, it is now secured with CD's at a rate of 2.4% over the CD rate, this will save us at least \$40,000 over the next three years compared to the 9% we were paying and even more if completed in two years.

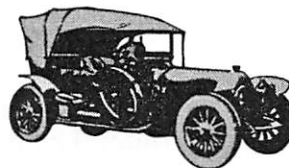

Barbecued Bean Salad**Ingredients:**

16 oz can Pinto Beans
16 oz can Kidney Beans
16 oz can Garbanzo Beans
16 oz can Cut Green Beans
½ cup Bar-B- Que Sauce
½ cup Apple Cider Vinegar
½ cup Olive Oil
2 tablespoons Worcestershire Sauce
6 tablespoons Brown Sugar – packed
1 tablespoon Chili Powder
1 teaspoon Ground Cumin
1 teaspoon Salt
½ teaspoon Pepper
3 tablespoons Dijon-style Mustard
1 Med Red Bell Pepper -- diced
1 Med Gr. Bell Pepper -- diced
1 Med White Onion – minced
1 Med Tomato - diced
½ cup Chopped Cilantro

Drain and rinse beans.

Dressing: In 1-quart non- aluminum saucepan combine Bar-B-Que sauce, Vinegar, Olive Oil, Worcestershire Sauce, Brown Sugar, Chili Powder, Cumin, Salt & Pepper. Bring to boil, reduce heat to low and simmer 10 minutes. Remove from heat, whisk in mustard and set aside.

To assemble salad: In large bowl combine Beans, Bell Peppers, Onion and Tomato and the dressing mix with the chopped cilantro.

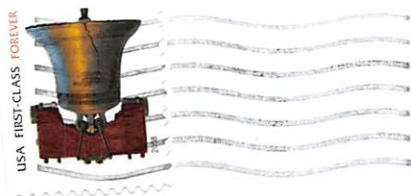
