Chief's Corner by Chief Bob Davis

Fire Station "Face Lift" Update: The windows have been upgraded to dual pane and the brick & Hardi-Board sidings are being added to the North and West exterior walls of the Station. In our search for apparatus room floor paint, we know we cannot go out and buy just *any* floor paint. We had to find one that would hold up to the snow chains we install on our vehicles in the winter. We think we now have a vendor and hope to paint the floor in October.

We got some unexpected rain recently. The Weather folks said "chance of rain" but I didn't believe them. Should have listened I guess because I found myself running around in the rain throwing tarp's on everything that I had not put away. It happens every year and it seems I just have to wait to the last minute to get ready for winter.

But, as nice as it was to have the rain, it is also a bit deceiving. As soon as the sun comes out everything will dry out and we will be right back in the wild land fire season. So even though there has been some rain, it's just not been enough yet to lessen the fire danger. So everyone still needs to exercise caution. September, October and even November are high fire danger months making it seem that the fire season is getting longer. I think it was last year we were on a strike team assignment in the middle of November. So don't let your guard down.

The greatest hazard we face up here is a wild land fire. During such an event there's going to be a great deal of confusion, noise, limited visibility and danger. I would like to remind everyone that we have a District Evacuation Plan. Evacuation signs are at every intersection which, if followed, will lead you to the Swansboro Airport. With Rock Creek Road on one side of the hangars and the runway on the other side plus the fact that there's very little fuel in that area, the airport hangar area is probably the safest place in our District during a wild land fire.

The Sheriffs Department (not the Fire Department) is

responsible for ordering and carrying out an evacuation. They are also responsible for designating out of the area sites for long term shelter. The problem we face, however, is how to evacuate people down the hill safely. Sending a large number of "unescorted" cars down Mosquito Road is risky if the fire is anywhere in the canyon. All it would take is one vehicle accident and the road is completely blocked. Evacuating down Rock Creek Road is also very risky as fire equipment and other resources will be using that road. That's why our evacuation process is referred to as "shelter in place". In short, that means that people move to a safe location in the area (the airport) for a short period of time (3-4 hours) while the Sheriff readies a long term evacuation location out of the danger area and develops a plan to safely move evacuees off the hill.

As I mentioned last month in my article, we are developing a list of people who, in case of a big event, might need some extra assistance to physically comply with an evacuation order. Our intent would be to provide this list to the Sheriffs Department to make them aware of the need. So, if you know someone who would require assistance in evacuating, please give us call down at the Station. We will need NAME, ADDRESS, PHONE NUMBER AND ANY SPECIAL NEEDS, AND INFORMATION FOR EVACUATING THEM (MEDICINE, OXYGEN, WHO TO NOTIFY etc.)

As far as the animals, it would be helpful if you left us a note at the front door letting us know the kinds and numbers of pets that are in the house so we could let them out if needed. For large animals we'll open gates or pens.

I hope these evacuation routes never have to be used. But just as the Byte was going to press, we had a "wake up call" - a wildland fire in the canyon area off of Deer Canyon Court. Thanks to the swift action by our volunteers and a USFS Helicopter crew it was controlled quickly. So please be aware of and familiar with the evacuation routes. It could save your life!

Be Safe and have a great Fall season.

# Some History & Fun Facts about Pumpkins Nathan & Melissa Kuhuski

The word pumpkin comes from the Greek pepon for a large melon. The English termed it pumpion or pompion. This term dates back to 1547, yet it did not make an appearance in print until 1647.

The pumpkin was one of the many foods used by the Native American Indians in the new world and was a welcome discovery by the Pilgrims. Native Americans called pumpkins "isqoutm squash." The Indians pounded strips of pumpkin flat, dried them, and wove them into mats for trading. They also dried pumpkin for food and used the seeds for food and medicine.

The new Americans heartily embraced the sweet, multi-purpose fruit which became a traditional Thanksgiving food. The colonists used pumpkin not only as a side dish and dessert, but also in soups and even beer In making the pies, the pumpkins were used as an ingredient for the crust, not the filling. The colonists also learned that the flowers are edible as well as the pumpkin itself.

Pumpkins are popular at Halloween when they are carved into Jack-o'-lanterns. The practice was brought to the United States by Irish immigrants who originally carved turnips into Jack-o'-lanterns. In America, pumpkins were more plentiful and cheaper than turnips, and so came about the switch from turnips to pumpkins. See:

- Pumpkins contain potassium and Vitamin A.
- The largest pumpkin pie ever made was over five feet in diameter and weighed over 350 pounds. It used 80 pounds of cooked pumpkin, 36 pounds of sugar, 12 dozen eggs and took six hours to bake.
- Pumpkins were once recommended for removing freckles and curing snake bites.
- The largest pumpkin ever grown weighed 1,140 pounds.
- The Connecticut field variety is the traditional American pumpkin.
- Pumpkins are 90 percent water.
- Eighty percent of the pumpkin supply in the United States is available in October.

# **Driving Mosquito Road** by Barb Beacham

There have been numerous articles in the three years that I have lived here about driving Mosquito Road. They have primarily been about the etiquette of the road. This is not another article about that, but

an article on safety. If you follow the rules of the road, than you will be a safe driver and not put anyone else in jeopardy.

Today, I came within a millimeter of losing my life. Why, because someone did not follow the rules of the road. This is what I have seen in three years:

- People driving down the center of the road, even around blind corners
- Uphill drivers stopping for those going downhill because the person going downhill did not stop
- Drivers passing other cars on blind corners
- People that ride on your bumper the whole way down to town
- Driver's leaving the scene of an accident
- Dogs loose on the roadway

Please follow these basic laws that are part of the vehicle code which you had to know in order to pass the DMV tests:

- Stay in your lane
- Uphill traffic has the right of way
- Do not pass a car on a blind corner
- Make sure that you have one car length for every 10 miles of speed between you and the car in front of you
- Follow the basic safe speed law and give yourself adequate time to get to your destination
- Remain at the scene of an accident
- Keep your dogs penned in on your property or on a leash

If you do not follow these basic laws then your act, by law is punishable.

Remember, if you can get the license plate number of someone who has put your life, or that of another person in jeopardy, do so and then file a report in person with the CHP. You might be one of many who have suffered at the expense of that particular driver and the number of reports collected by the CHP on a particular driver will make a difference. Your's could be the report that makes the CHP take action to get that driver off the road!

All I ask on behalf of myself, my loved ones and the other members of our community, is that all who use Mosquito Road be considerate of the others on the road.

1/2 tsp minced fresh jalapeño
1 tbsp Dijon mustard


