Seen the Fire Station lately? If you have then you'll agree that we are almost there with our "facelift" endeavor. The new asphalt is in place. The exterior has been repaired, updated and painted. New energy efficient windows have been installed. The apparatus room floor has a new covering. And the kitchen has had some refinements. There's still a few "finishing touches" that we need to do but all in all the project is nearly complete. I want to take this opportunity to thank the community for their generosity in helping us reach this point. In addition to the Fire District's funding of approximately \$40,000, the community through donations and fund raising events - provided an additional \$3,700 to enable us to do just a little more than we had originally planned. The people in this community are AWESOME!!!

Speaking of the community, we have several new volunteer firefighters who have joined our ranks. These folks are training hard and will be a great asset to our community. If you have ever thought about joining our volunteer department, there's still room on the rooster for a few more people. Stop by the Fire Station and talk to me if your interested.

In past articles, I have written about how the County has been providing "supplemental" funding to some Fire Districts as an attempt to offset the disparity in tax revenues allocated when the Districts were formed. Our supplement was approximately \$35,000. The county ended this process with the 2009-2010 fiscal year. However, they also retained a consulting firm, Citygate Group, to conduct a study to determine the net effect that ending the supplemental funding will have on service delivery. Citygate's report is due in January so you'll most likely start to see newspaper articles soon. If you want to know more about this issue, come to one of the MFPD Board meetings held the 2nd Thursday of each month.

Now for my "pep talk" and "admonition"! Yes, the summer fire season has officially ended. But there's still danger out there. The vegetation will still burn! Just look at all of the "burn day" activity taking place. So please be careful with your burning. AND, it's getting colder and fireplaces are being used. So please make sure your fireplace or stove is inspected and safe, your chimney is cleaned and your ashes and embers are disposed of properly.

Have a safe and fire free holiday season and best wishes from all of us at the Station.

A Lesson For Us All (Part 1 of 2) by Chief Bob Davis

Recently the Fire Department was involved in an incident that, while not "routine", could easily happen to any of us living in our rural area. While the gentleman involved was recovering from his ordeal, he wrote a letter to the Fire Department about his experience. The letter is a testimony to how our beautiful canyon can make us feel so small. His thoughts and experience will appear in the January Byte but this month, I'll tell you about what took place before the rescue.

Around 8:30 pm on Saturday, October 10 several of us were just finishing cleaning up the Fire Station after the Bunco fund raiser. A lady stopped at the Station to report that her neighbor "might" to be missing. She was told by the neighbor's sons that he had gone for a walk around 5:00 pm and had not returned. His sons had become concerned and started looking for him around 6:00 pm but had not been able to locate him. I asked if she could take me to the location and while enroute I began to plan a search. I met up with the sons and they confirmed that their Dad had left around 5pm and had left his wallet, cell phone and car keys on the kitchen table. The house is located on the canyon's edge and since the front gate was locked, the sons thought he may

have hiked down into the canyon towards the river.

The sons and the other neighbors had been searching the immediate area for a couple of hours to no avail. Since it was already getting dark, my concern was that he had gone down into the canyon and perhaps had gotten injured or became lost In either case, it would be a long night in the canyon.

After assessing all that had been done, I notified the Sheriff's Department who has primary responsibility for Search and Rescue operations in the county. They responded to my location and after being briefed they initiated their operation. But due to darkness and the steep, rough terrain a thorough search of the canyon was not possible. The next morning as I was getting ready to call out the Volunteers and Support Group to assist the Sheriff, I was notified that the person was found by a CHP helicopter

This was one incident that had a happy ending and while this gentleman was fortunate to have the skills to keep himself safe during his ordeal, his experience serves as a reminder to us all of how vulnerable we can be in a rural area. Please be safe while out hiking, riding and even just walking.

SCPOA Report

Thank you to everyone who attended the last meeting. I'm sure many were interested in budget issues specifically and what are dues are going to be. Some corrections still need to be made in our reserve study and until those are completed we don't have a complete picture of where we are. We did have a meeting with Browning, the people who put together our reserve study, and are in the process of gathering the additional information that was required. We hope to have what we need for the December meeting so a final decision can be made.

Johnathan and Kevin have completed clearing out the area on the dam and behind Trout lake. They have also been removing brush along the roads as well as clearing the ditches for drainage. They will finish the fencing along Rock Creek Road once we get more rain and the ground softens as well as work on potholes as the temperatures permit. If a hole gets bad enough they will use a torch to heat the fill material enough to get it into the hole, otherwise the work will be deferred until we have better temperatures.

The board is working on a resolution to be distributed in the December packet that would allow for quarterly payment of dues, a one time fee will apply as well as interest for those who might choose this option once it is approved. In the mean time you can always start prepaying dues anytime and we really want to encourage this since we know that the timing on when dues are payable is defiantly not the best.

Another letter was sent out to the membership to solicit candidates for the board of directors. This letter was included in the June packet, however we have not received any forms back. We will have 3 openings on the board this year and 4 next year, so we need to motivate members to get involved. We also need feedback about meeting days and times, we switched to Monday evenings but this may not be the best so please let us know your preferences. It has come to our attention that many people living up here are unaware of a signal used in this community, in an emergency. If you are driving and see a vehicle driving with their emergency flashers on and they seem to be in a hurry, please pull over and let them pass.

The Volunteer Firefighters and Support Group members are very seldom at the fire station when an incident happens, therefore they need to get there quickly when their pagers go off. Hence they drive with their emergency flashers on. If you are driving, please pull over and let them pass. The family member, house, or friend they are rushing to save, could be yours.

Even after an incident is in motion, there are firefighters, and support group members, bringing any additional supplies such as oxygen, hoses, additional fire fighters, food and water to the incident. Time is of the essence. Please help all concerned and pull over for these emergencies.

Another responsibility of the Support Group is manning a road advisory post in the event of a need to keep traffic from interfering with the work of the fire fighters and their equipment. In the event that you should happen upon a road advisory, please follow the instructions given. This is for the safety of all concerned.

Recipe of the Month

by Chef Frank

Prime Rib with Au Jus

10 to 12 pound roast Rib Rub

Rosemary 5 sprigs

Whole Garlic 1 cup

Cracked Black Pepper 1/4 cup

Onion Powder 1/4 cup

Garlic Powder 1/4 cup

Kosher Salt 3/4 cup

Olive oil 1 cup

Chop ingredients in food processor or blender.

Should be paste like. Rub on Prime Rib.

To cook the Rib:

Celery 1 stalk chopped coarsely

Onions 2 each chopped coarsely

Carrots 3 each chopped coarsely

Bay leaves 4 each

Place veggies in roasting pan with bay leaves, set rubbed roast on top.

Pre heat the oven to 375 degrees, roast the Rib for 45 minutes. Turn oven down to 225 degrees roast (20 minutes per pound.)

Check with thermometer. Rare is 110 degrees. This is a good time to pull out the roast and set it aside so you can make the Au Jus.

Au Jus

Take roast out of the pan and leave the Veggies. On the stove top turn on heat and add 2 cups of red wine (your choice) to deglaze the pan. Reduce liquid by 2/3. Add ½ gallon of water and cook for 20-30 minutes. Strain and skim the fat out before you serve. Enjoy!
