Chief's Corner by Chief Bob Davis

Even though we are still very much in the winter season, now is the perfect time to be thinking about cleaning up around our houses to get ready for the summer and the usual threat of a wild land fire. It seems that I am always harping on people to cut the brush around their homes. Not only is it the prudent thing to do when you live in an area that has a high risk for a wild land fire but it is also a state law. I thought I would take this opportunity to "publish" this law so that all of us know just what the State expects. The following comes from the California State Public Resources Code Section 4291.

Any person that owns, leases, controls, operates, or maintains any building or structure in, upon, or adjoining any mountainous area of forest-covered lands, brush-covered lands, or grass-covered lands, or any land which is covered with flammable material, shall at all times do all of the following:

- Maintain around and adjacent to such building or structure a firebreak made by removing and clearing away, for a distance of not less than 30 feet (this was revised by state law to 100 feet that went into effect on January 1, 2005) on each side thereof or to the property line, whichever is nearer, all flammable vegetation or other combustible growth. This subdivision does not apply to single specimens of trees, ornamental shrubbery, or similar plants, which are used as ground cover, if they do not form a means of rapidly transmitting, fire from the native growth to any building or structure.
- Maintain around and adjacent to any such building or structure additional fire protection or firebreak made by removing all brush, flammable vegetation, or combustible growth which is located from 30 feet to 100 feet from such building or structure or to the property

line, whichever is nearer, as may be required by the director if he finds that, because of extra hazardous conditions, a firebreak of only 30 feet around such building or structure is not sufficient to provide reasonable fire safety. Grass and other vegetation located more than 30 feet from such building or structure and less that 18 inches in height above the ground may be maintained where necessary to stabilize the soil and prevent erosion.

- Remove that portion of any tree, which extends within 10 feet of the outlet of any chimney or stovepipe.
- Maintain any tree adjacent to or overhanging any building free of dead or dying wood.
- Maintain the roof an any structure free of leaves, needles, or other dead vegetative growth.
- Provide and maintain at all times a screen over the outlet of every chimney or stovepipe that is attached to any fireplace, stove, or other device that burns any solid or liquid fuel. The screen shall be constructed of nonflammable material with an opening of not more that onehalf inch in size.
- Except as provided in Section 18930 of the Health and Safety Code, the director may adopt regulations exempting structures with exteriors constructed entirely of nonflammable materials, or conditioned upon the contents and composition of same, he may vary the requirements respecting the removing or clearing away of flammable vegetation or other combustible growth with respect to the area surrounding said structures.
- No such exemption or variance shall apply unless and until the occupant thereof, or if there be no occupant, then the owner thereof, files with the department, in such form as the director shall prescribe, a written consent to the inspection of the interior and contents of such structure to ascertain whether the provisions hereof and the regulations adopted

hereunder are complied with at all times.

There you go! The nuts and bolts along with all of the legalize on why we have to clear around our structures. Any violation of Code Section 4291 is seen as an infraction by the courts and results in a fine. The law specifies what the fine is and under what conditions it applies. Since this is a State law, it is the States responsibility to enforce it and that has been given to the California Division of Forestry and Fire Protection.

I consider Code Section 4291 to be a good law as it establishes a basis for common sense, that being if you live in this kind of area you should make your house as safe as possible. If you follow the requirements of 4291 then it does not have any impact on you as you are exercising good judgment. If you do not, then 4291 can be considered a pain in the wallet. If you do not adhere to the requirements then you can be found guilty of an infraction and fined, then you still have to clean up your property. Take the next couple of months, cut some brush, trim some trees and enjoy living in the country. In the meantime it is still winter and the roads can get you, so be careful and be safe.

Recipe of the Month

Southwestern Tortilla Soup (a repeat by request) This will put a little warmth in you on those cold winter evenings

6-inch corn tortillas cut in strips

- 2 ounces corn oil
- 3 cloves garlic minced
- 1 fresh jalapeño minced (Add a little more if you like it hotter)
- 1/4 cup chopped cilantro
- 16 ounces chopped tomatoes (canned)
- 16 ounces vegetable or chicken stock
- 8 ounces tomato juice
- ½ teaspoon cumin
- ½ teaspoon light chili powder
- 1 tablespoon lime juice
- 2 ounces cream

In a medium sauce pot, heat the corn oil, add the tortilla strips and cook until crisp but not brown. Add all of the other ingredients (except the cream) simmer for 15 to 20 minutes. Place in a food processor or blender (be very careful the liquid is

going to be extremely hot) and blend until smooth, add the cream.

May be garnished with grated cheese or grilled chicken and avocado

Helpful Hints

HOW TO WHITEN LINENS WITH LEMONS

Damask napkins, linens, even white socks can be whitened on the stove: Fill a pot with water and a few slices of fresh lemon, and bring to a boil. Turn off heat, add linens, and let soak for up to an hour, launder as usual. For extra brightening, spread them out in the sunlight to dry.

HOW TO STORE CANDLES

Candles should be kept in a dark, cool, dry place. Why? Light can cause the colors to fade, heat can cause the candles to warp, and moisture can make the wicks difficult to light.

INFORMATION ABOUT CLOTHES DRYERS

(This was sent in by a Byte subscriber)

The heating unit went out on my dryer! The gentleman that fixes things around the house for us said that he wanted to show us something and he went over to the dryer and pulled out the lint filter. It was clean. (I always clean the lint from the filter after every load of clothes.) But that was not what he wanted to show us. He took the filter over to the sink and ran hot water over it. The lint filter is made of a mesh material - I'm sure you know what your dryer's lint filter looks like. WELL...the hot water just sat on top of the mesh! It didn't go through it at all! He told us that dryer sheets can cause a film to form over the mesh and that's what burns out the heating unit. You can't SEE the film but it's there. It's what is in the dryer sheets to make your clothes soft and static free - that nice fragrance too, you know how they can feel waxy when you take them out of the box, well this stuff builds up on your clothes and on your lint screen. This is also what causes dryer units to catch fire & potentially burn your house down with it! He said the best way to keep your dryer working for a very long time (and to keep your electric bill lower) is to take that filter out and wash it with hot, soapy water and an old toothbrush (or other brush) at least every six months.

He said that makes the life of the dryer at least twice as long!

How about that? Learn something new every day! I certainly didn't know dryer sheets would do that. So, I thought I'd share! Note: I went to my dryer and tested my screen by running water on it. The water ran through a little bit but mostly collected all the water in the mesh screen. I washed it with warm soapy water and a nylon brush. I had it done in 30 seconds. When when I rinsed it, the water ran right thru the screen! There wasn't any puddling at all! That repairman knew what he was talking about!
