Chief's Corner by Chief Bob Davis

Well, it's starting. Last month, we had two escape control burns. The first one occurred when the property owner had a large burn pile in what they thought was a safe location. Their property is located on top of a ridge where by afternoon, the air warms in the canyon and when air warms, it rises which creates what fire fighters call uphill wind. As the property was on top of the ridge with a large burn pile....this was not a good combination. The wind came up, which pushed the flames into a pine tree that caught on fire, which in turn caught manzanita bushes around the tree on fire, which caught the ground fuel on fire. Now we had an escape control burn. The owners thought they could handle it, but when the fire started to spread downhill, they decided to go for help. They came down and called from the 911 call box in front of the station. Dispatch sent out a call for a wildland fire located at the intersection of Trail Gulch and Plumfield. I arrived on scene, but could not see any smoke. Normally you could see a column of smoke but the wind had laid the smoke down and it was not visible. I called dispatch to ask for a better location, but Camino did not have an address or location.

So the hunt was on. Knowing that there are about five homes in the area, I started a process of elimination. I went to the first house, but no one was home and there was no fire. I went to the second house and there was a man outside. I asked if he had called in a fire and he stated that he had not. As I was heading back to the main road, a man came up on an ATV and said he knew where the fire was and to follow him. Once on the main road, we pulled onto another driveway. Halfway up the driveway, the man on the ATV stopped and pointed uphill to a road that looked like a logger's skid trail. I noticed truck tire tracks going uphill and then I noticed Engine-75 and the fire. I notified Dispatch that I was on scene.

Apparently, the property owner was at the station when Engine-75 pulled out and the property owner led Engine-75 to where the fire was. The fire ended up being about ¼ acre.

Our second escape control burn call went out about 9:30 at night for a smoke check. Once on scene, the smoke check turned out to be an escape control burn. The property owner was burning brush and had left the burn pile unattended. He came back later to find that the fire had spread and had ignited some tires that were buried in the ground which caused the fire to spread even more from the heat that the burning tires created. Now we had a toxic escape control burn. The area burn was about 30' X 30'.

Again, be aware of your location and the size of your burn pile as this can help keep your burn pile under control.

At the Chief's meeting I attend each month, Cal-Fire announced they have hired 5 Home Defensible Space Inspectors. I have asked Battalion Chief Brian Estes, who is in charge of our area, to set up a meeting between me and our area inspector to learn this year's process.

In my monthly Byte article, I try to reinforce how important a Defensible Space is to improve your home survivability in a big fire. Next month, we will begin Home Evaluations. So now is the time to start clearing around the home, cleaning off the roof, trimming back the tree branches, raking up the dead leaves and pine needles. 

Recipe for the Month

Grilled New Orleans-Style Shrimp (this is a repeat request)

Ingredients

- 1 ½ pounds large shrimp (21 to 25 per lb)
- 2 tablespoons olive oil
- 3 medium garlic cloves, minced
- 3/4 teaspoon salt
- 6 tablespoons unsalted butter
- 2 teaspoons chili powder
- 2 teaspoons black pepper
- 4 teaspoons Worcestershire sauce
- 1 tablespoon fresh lemon juice

Baquette

Lemon wedges

Cooking Directions

Snip shells of shrimp with scissors down middle of back, leaving tail and first segment of shell intact. Make an incision along length of back where shells are cut and de-vein, leaving shells in place. (Shells

will prevent shrimp from becoming tough on outside when grilled.) Toss shrimp with oil, garlic, and ½ teaspoon salt and marinate at cool room temperature 15 minutes.

While shrimp marinate, prepare grill for cooking. If using a charcoal grill, open vents on bottom of grill, then light charcoal. Charcoal fire is medium-hot when you can hold your hand 5 inches above rack for 3 to 4 seconds. If using a gas grill, preheat burners on high, covered, 10 minutes, and then reduce heat to moderately high.

Heat butter, chili powder, pepper, Worcestershire sauce, and remaining 1/4 teaspoon salt in a small heavy saucepan over moderately low heat, stirring, until butter is melted, then remove from heat and stir in lemon juice.

Thread 4 or 5 shrimp onto each skewer and grill, covered only if using a gas grill, turning over once, until just cooked through, 3 to 4 minutes total. Push shrimp off skewers into a bowl, then pour butter mixture over them and toss to combine well. Yield: 4 servings
