They say, "winter isn't over until it snows on the Dogwood". So after three or four snowfalls on the Dogwood this winter wouldn't you think it's time for summer? With more than usual rain, snow and lower temperatures, our prep time for fire season will be shorter. Soon the temperature will be hovering around 100 degrees and the tall grasses and brush will dry out quickly bringing us right into fire season. Now is the time to be clearing grass and other ground fuels around your house along with trimming up all trees.

On May 14th 2010, we had two volunteer firefighters, Justin Williams and Ben Langhout, graduate from the Georgetown Divide Fire Academy. These fine individuals worked hard and dedicated themselves to learning in order to benefit not only themselves, but our community. For this, they deserve the upmost recognition. Being a volunteer firefighter is a very rewarding experience resulting in a great sense of accomplishment and camaraderie. We welcome Justin and Ben and look forward to their serving our community alongside our other great volunteers.

It is training that keeps our firefighters the best in the county. We have training sessions every Tuesday evening from 7:00 to 9:00 P.M. There are also those special Saturday training periods that last four hours and focus on specific training needs. Then there is the classes required to learn CPR and to become a Medical First Responder, EMT. Once the basic training criteria have been met there are re-certification requirements, updating and new standards that also require training. That is why our Volunteer Firefighters are the BEST!

Training is just part of being a volunteer firefighter. The training allows someone to function as a firefighter in an effective and safe manner. Just think about it. How many people are willing to work their lives around a pager? When the thing goes off because something has gone wrong for someone so you stop doing what ever it is you are doing and you respond. At all times

under all kinds of conditions you simply go and do your best at solving one of the many problems that often faces a firefighter. While doing this you are at times putting your life and health at risk. As a volunteer there is no financial reward, just a satisfaction of knowing you are helping someone. Sometimes that person is a neighbor or a friend but most often it is someone you do not know but yet you still go and help. It takes a very special person to be a volunteer fire fighter in the first place and an extraordinary individual.

If this sounds interesting to you, come to our open house Sunday June 13th. We will have free hotdogs and drinks, balloons for the kids. We will have demonstrations, check out the fire trucks, fire fighting equipment, and be there to answer any questions that you might have.

HAZARDOUS WASTE FROM 9:00 AM TO Noon

The El Dorado County Environmental Management Department will also be on hand accepting household **Hazardous Waste** from 9:00 am to noon.

Items Accepted are: Motor oil/oil filters, Household cleaners, Pool/photo chemicals, Paint, stains, varnishes & thinners, Automotive products, Solvents, Removers, Aerosol cans, Adhesives/sealant, Pesticides, Herbicides, Batteries, Vapor & sodium lamps, 10-gallon or less propane tanks, Fluorescent light tubes, Mercury switches/thermostats and most products labeled "Caution", "Danger" or "Poison".

Items "not" accepted: Electronic waste, Appliances, Radioactive materials, Infectious medical waste, Explosives, Compressed gas cylinders and tires.

Please limit materials to 5 gal or 50 lbs; however, you may transport up to 20 gallons of used oil or latex paint with no single container larger than 5 gallons.
