# Chief's Corner by Chief Bob Davis

Once again, the Big Boy Toy Show was a huge success. I want to thank MVFA, Support Group, Crafters, Dee Harris for the great signs, Fire Fighters and all others for volunteering their time and hard work.

I don't know about anyone else but I'm tired of "weed eating"! I've weeded around my place 3 times already. Because of the heavy rain in May and cool nights, there's still a lot of green grass around the District. But as you can see the hot weather is rapidly turning the grass brown and dry.

Cal-Fire has announced that all burning will stop on July 1st. That means NO MORE BURN PILES.

Many homeowners assume that, if a fire does threaten their community, a firefighting crew will magically materialize in their driveway and prevent the fire from touching their house. Don't count on it. During the 2007 California Firestorm, firefighting resources-even on the fringes of a major metropolitan area like San Bernardino-where inadequate to provide protection to many homes within the city's outlying districts. Even with the addition of thousands of firefighters from all over the U.S. most were scattered along the hills in a vain effort to halt the advance of the fire. With embers and flaming debris being carried for miles on the gusting winds, there simply weren't enough fire crews to protect every home. Added to this equation is the fact that firefighters know they are stretched thin and will be unable to defend every home in their area. As a result, they assess how defensible the properties in their area are and then write off the homes that are clearly indefensible.

This raises the question:

Do you want your home to be written off as a lost cause or have the additional protection of firefighters who feel there's a chance to save it?

Another factor is how hot the fire is burning. There is a general rule of thumb that fire crews use to determine

what level of response they need to stop a fire. Fires with flames of four feet or less height can be contained by hand crews with hoses and hand tools. Fires with flames between four and eleven feet in height require heavy equipment and maybe even retardant-dropping aircraft. Fires with flames larger than this require prayer, because barring a miracle, nothing man can devise will stop the fire-except, perhaps,

# "Having a defensible perimeter already in place."

Our wildland fire problem is not a unique one as you have seen on the news. Many acres and homes can be lost to fire in a matter of minutes as seen last year in the town of Auburn. There are many reasons: weather, heavy brush and fuel loads, and the many homes in the rural areas.

I don't want to scare anyone and be the harpy of doom and gloom but I also want you to realize that we live in a world of risk. We don't have tornadoes, (most of the time), floods, hurricanes, earthquakes (most of the time) but we do have wild land fires. They are a part of living in the state of California and especially in the foothills. Therefore we have to be ready, do some planning with your family, get important personnel papers together, rely on common sense thinking and above all; BE SAFE!

# SCPOA Report

Johnathan and Kevin have been busy trying to keep up with all the new growth around the lakes. Thanks to a very generous donation from one of our members, mowing is now twice as efficient due to the addition of a second riding mower. Additionally, the weather has warmed enough to permit road patching, so that has begun. The potholes are in progress of being filled as are other road repairs. Repairs are also planned for the bench at Dyer lake and the crack in the floor of the pavilion at Dyer Lake.

There's just over \$30,000 in still delinquent accounts for this year. Some people are making payments and

others are just not responding. Liens will be placed on properties that owe back dues, if you are an owner who has not paid please contact Lynda at 621-0309 and discuss your options with her. Remember, we are all part of SCPOA and those who do not pay only place a greater burden on the rest of us.

Road bids are due and decisions will be made about which roads will be done based on cost, funds available, conditions of various roads and their use level. We had four very good companies come up to look at the work which needs to be done, they made suggestions and the bid package was revised to reflect these. A decision will be made at a special meeting which will be posted for all to attend as well as announced in next months Byte.

A reminder to all, the runway surface is not a place to be walking or riding a bicycle, if you wish to be out at the airport you need to be off the side of the pavement. When you see or hear a plane moving you need to move as far off the side as possible, stop and watch so the pilot knows you are paying attention.

A request was made to educate drivers on the dangers of speeding along our roads, there are no posted speed limit signs but for safety 30 mph should probably be the maximum. There are lots of kids and animals in our community and some houses don't have much separation from the road. So PLEASE slow down.

Last December's member packet included a survey seeking community input on a few issues. This is what we learned: (1) Monday evenings are best for the board meetings by a small margin; (2) Members are interested in using the website to see what's happening as well as using e-mail for important updates, decisions and commenting on these issues. The primary reason not to use the website was, no internet or only having dial up so it is too slow. We will be sending updates to those who requested them, these will be sent as blind copies to protect confidentiality; (3) suggestions for a location for a playground. Most wanted SCPOA to work with MVFA to place it at Finnon for the whole community, the second most popular response was no playground at either with the primary concern being expense; (4) There was a significant difference in opinions for our roads, by more then a 3 to 1 margin people wanted the less expensive method for repairing our roads.

Mosquito residents share the woods with many of our wild neighbors, including the California Black Bear. How often have you heard "What do we do if on a hike, we run into a bear? I'm afraid of bears"! We must be aware that there are NO recorded incidents of a black bear attack in California history. Grizzly Bears are a different story, but we don't have them in the Sierra Foothills.

According to Ann Bryant, Director of the Bear League, our bears are either timid or curious. They will either run away from you long before you ever see them or, if you're lucky, they might stay around and see what you're up to. To quote Ms Bryant from her quarterly newsletter..." If you see a mother bear who is accompanied by one or more cubs don't freak out. She will not attack you unless you are foolish and approach

her cubs and then only maybe, but don't do it. Black bears aren't like grizzly bears. They are actually quite tolerant of people being near their cubs, as long as you don't try to chase or touch or threaten the cubs."
