Chief's Corner by Chief Bob Davis

On Saturday the 14th we laid sod in front of the station along with river rock around the trees. The funds came from donations from the community and the events that have been held in the district.

I would like to THANK ALL OF YOU WHO DONATED AND SUPPORT THE FIRE DEPARTMENT. A special thanks to Ron Ralphs and Jim Collins for all the tractor work, the crafters, support group and others I may have forgotten for their participation and assistance in the upgrade of the station.

We have been extremely fortunate so far this summer as we have not had a large wild land fire in our district. We have not responded on an in or out of county strike team as of yet. This is a good thing meaning there are no large fires in the state. To have a piece of equipment out of the District can be a little nerve wrecking; however, that still leaves us with two engines and three water tenders, still enough equipment to handle 95% of anything that may happen. As usual, when the dispatch pagers go off for this response I receive many phone calls from the Volunteer Fire fighters telling me they are coming home early from work or they are on the hill and will come to the station immediately if they are needed. So you see that 95% potential to handle nearly any fire situation still can only happen with a sufficient amount of volunteers to operate the equipment. And especially when we have three to four volunteers out on strike team assignment our consistency and response time drops rapidly in the case of any emergency.

I have often been asked why we send equipment out of our District into another Fire District. We don't actually send equipment, so much as the equipment is requested through our Dispatch Agency by another District that has need. We have automatic aid agreements with all our neighboring Fire Districts, mutual aid agreements with the other fire districts in the county, and then we have cooperative agreements with the California Department of Forestry and Fire Protection, the Office of Emergency Services, and the United States Forest Service. It is a great benefit to us because it is always a two way street. At any time a large wild land fire or a residential fire can start and in minutes many fire engines and fire fighters are coming our way to help. When we had a fire start down in the canyon off of White Oak, we had one engine and two water tenders on structure protection. I called for a Garden Valley engine to cover our district in case a call was received they then covered the district.

To give you an idea what takes place at the onset of a wild land fire. Our Dispatch Agency which is the CAL-FIRE located in Camino utilizes a computer aided dispatch system that tells them what equipment to send our way and where the closest equipment is located. On a typical day we can expect on an immediate dispatch to anywhere in Mosquito our three engines and three water tenders, five more engines from neighboring fire districts, five Cal Fire engines, one dozer, two hand crews, airco, and two aircraft tankers. In addition from the U.S.F.S. we can receive at least two engines, one hand crew, and a helicopter. This equipment is coming our way no matter what size the initial fire is, if it is needed we keep it coming or we can make the decision to turn some of or all of it back. Now, if the day is abnormal and the humidity is lower than normal, or the wind is higher than normal then we can expect that besides the resources listed above there will automatically be five more engines coming from districts in El Dorado County.

The above is based on an assumption that there are no other fires in the County or there are no requests for County equipment to be fighting fires in other areas; however, no matter what is going on, the resources are requested and in route. Some of it may have to come from Sacramento, Lake Tahoe, or even Auburn, but it is always on the way.

Now, if we are real fortunate this summer there we won't even have to worry about all those agencies responding. I would prefer to have one of our engines go over there than to have some of theirs come here. So be careful out there as the worse part of the summer fire season is just coming up. September is the month that normally burns us up. It is the driest part of the summer, the wind starts to pick up, weather conditions become erratic, and with summer over people seem to drop their guards.

Rock Creek Café has a new roof, which was badly needed. We were so pleased with the work from Jarrod Holbert Roofing, who is also a resident on the hill. Jarrod did an excellent job and exceeded our expectations.

I am so happy to report that the Georgetown Divide Resource Conversation District (RCD) received a fully funded signed agreement from the Sierra Nevada Conservatory for the Finnon Dam Restoration Project. Yes, we are getting the Dam restored. Mark Egbert, the project administrator, anticipates construction work to begin in the spring of 2011.

Supervisor Ron Briggs on behalf of Mosquito Volunteer Fire Association and Resource Conversation Districts (RCD) requested another \$100,000 for the Finnon Dam Restoration Project from El Dorado County Water Agency. Due to Supervisor Briggs efforts we were awarded \$100,000 for restoration of 350 acre-feet of water storage, enhancement of fishery, of aquatic and wetland habitat, and securing sustainable water supply to combat wildfires.

I would like to thank all those who worked endless hours for so many years to make Finnon Dam Restoration Project become a reality. Thank you, Karl Weiland, for keeping the project alive and reporting updates to the board for years. Mark Egbert, thank you for taking on the task of finding the grants to make this project happen.

We will have more information on the Finnon Restoration Dam Project and a public meeting in the near future.

See you at the next board meeting on September 2^{nd} , 7pm at the Fire Station.

6 tablespoons Brown Sugar -- packed

1 tablespoon Chili Powder

1 teaspoon Ground Cumin

1 teaspoon Salt ½ teaspoon Pepper

3 tablespoons Dijon-style Mustard

Med Red Bell Pepper -- diced
Med Gr. Bell Pepper -- diced

1 Med White Onion – minced

1 Med Tomato Diced

½ cup Chopped Cilantro
