When I started writing this article for this month's Byte. I sat for a minute and thought, WHERE DID THE SUMMER GO! My father always said the older you get the faster time goes by. The summer has been a mild one. One week it's 90 degrees and then the next week it's in the 70's. They say it has something to do with the water temperature on the coast of California. El Nino is the correct name I believe. We haven't had any major fires in the state, nor in our area. Even with the cool weather the fire danger is still high. Remember some of the largest wildland fires in El Dorado County have taken place in October. We really do not want one of them to be in our District. Please be careful out there with anything posing a fire danger, whether it be a controlled fire itself or anything hot. We are not out of the fire season just vet!

This last weekend we unexpectedly got a little rain. The rain as nice as it is can be a bit deceiving. When the sun comes out everything will dry out and the wildland fire season has potential again to show its true colors. There has not been enough rain yet, so caution still needs to be exercised. As far as burning goes, I strongly recommend that no one do it until checking with our local burn day hotline first. If you need the number or a burn permit this upcoming year please come by the department during the hours of 8am and 5pm, Monday through Sunday.

Though the nighttime temperatures have been getting into the 50's the daytime temperatures are reaching the 80's with a low relative humidity. This makes wildland fires even more possible. Some people may be dropping their guards and belief that the fire season is over. Please stay alert because we are still dealing with serious fire potential.

One other problem we could encounter is that CAL-FIRE is looking to close their Tanker aircraft bases at Grass Valley and Columbia in October. These two bases provide a quick aircraft response into our district; a very valuable resource. We would have to rely on the large aircraft that would fly in from Chico or Hollister. We would get some aircraft, but it would take considerably longer. CAL-FIRE is also looking to start down staffing Engines and Stations, which puts a higher reliance on local fire district resources and longer a response time for CAL-FIRE.

Again I stress please do be careful out there and lets end this fire season disaster free with no easily avoided mistakes being made when we start any projects.

SCPOA

This SCPOA report covers both the August and September meetings since I was unable to complete an article last month.

Kevin and Jonathan have done a great job prepping for the roadwork, which is almost complete now. They did everything necessary for proper drainage, removal of large amounts of brush that was along the roads, and made sure that the culverts were working properly if not already installed. This was a huge job and it saved the association money by having our crew do it rather than the contractor. The road prep took time away from pothole patching but they will be getting back to it as long as the patching material lasts. If not, a new batch of material will not be ready until November so please be patient.

Another project that Kevin and Jonathan have been working on is a bridge for Trout Lake. It will be done this month and is strong enough for a horse, and wide enough to allow the lawnmower to cross.

An issue of berry bushes on a corner was brought up to be trimmed at the time the maintenance crew was focusing on prep work in the area of the upcoming road work. Many members go out and take care of these types of minor problems themselves. Some individuals take care of their whole neighborhood since our maintenance crew cannot possibly maintain all of the trim work along the roads in the association. We would need to increase our maintenance budget significantly in order to have them do this as well as hire more help. Members have been clear that they do not want to increase spending. Therefore if we all pitch in and take care of our property that boarders the roads as well as help out our neighbors who can't, it will greatly improve our community.

A motion was made and approved to purchase more signs for Dyer and Catfish lakes advising people not to fish in the beach areas. Fishhooks have been found and could cause serious, unnecessary injury to children playing on the beaches. If you see someone fishing on the beach, please ask him or her to kindly move to another area for the safety of the kids swimming.

Our insurance agent from Socher insurance, Nancy Johnson, was kind enough to come to our August meeting to answer any questions about the association insurance coverage. She explained how our coverage works, such as the different types as well as options we may want to consider. She also explained the idea of loss assessment coverage, which can be obtained by homeowners in the association. Some of us have this, but many who may not know about it will receive further information in the December packet. It's normally very inexpensive coverage that provides protection in case the association was to be sued and an award was given for more than our current coverage.

By the time this comes out, the road work for this year should be completed. Unfortunately the timing didn't turn out to be the best, but we really had no choice. The plans for this were started prior to our knowledge of the bridgework, Mosquito Road closure, and the work was scheduled when the contractor could do it, so SCPOA didn't have much of a choice. If we delayed the work until Mosquito was open we may not have had the warm temperatures needed. Plus there was no way of knowing when the bridgework would be done since they could have found problems, thereby delaying their work. So for the remainder of the time left between now and the completion of construction, lets do each other a favor and drive safely, respectfully, and maybe even leave the house a little sooner so as we won't feel rushed.

We have talked about the hope of getting asphalt grindings over the past couple of years to use on some of our courts. With the economy not doing so well, these previously useless grindings have been in demand. Thanks to our treasurer Tee we now have a commitment for some to use on an upcoming project. Our only expense is for the trucking. These will be used to form a good base on some of our courts that are in desperate need. Once compacted and oiled it will form a nice surface.

We still have a significant amount of individuals who have not paid their assessment for the past year. The rest of us must make up this difference so please contact our secretary Lynda at 621-0309. She will be happy to work with you to make payments; she will also be placing liens on the properties of those who do not make their payments.

Our next meeting will be Monday October 11th, 6:00 PM at the firehouse. Please plan on attending, as we would like ideas and suggestions for next years budget and roadwork. We look forward to seeing you.
