#### **SCPOA**

It was nice to see a good turnout for our November meeting. Too often it's only a few members giving their input and getting the current information. Next months meeting will include decisions on next year's dues, so we hope a large group can show up again to participate.

Jonathan and Kevin have started burning the brush pile created during the clearing for roadwork. Any large pieces of wood are placed by the telephone pole just past the shed on Sluice St. for anyone to cut up and take for firewood. They've also been working on the area north of the maintenance shed and dam at Dyer. Most people don't realize this is a common area, but by opening it up it's hoped that members will be able to enjoy it.

The roadwork for this year has been completed and looks good; we will soon start the planning process for next year. Jonathan and Kevin will continue to ditch along roads, remove growth, and debris both in the ditches and the road easement. In this process last summer they ran into resistance from some owners about removing young plants from ditches. These will eventually grow causing problems with drainage and potential road damage so they will need to be removed. Remember there is a road easement, so property lines do not extend to the road itself, but it's always helpful when owners do their own maintenance of the area. We obviously do not have an unlimited maintenance budget and we just as anyone don't want to increase spending.

So far this year we still have 65 members who have not paid dues. Lynda will make every effort to work with individuals, but if payment is not received, liens will be placed on the properties to protect the association. We are no longer sending delinquent accounts to a collection agency; our secretary Lynda is handling them herself, which is saving us all money.

The last meeting many members had concerns over what the dues will be next year. Unfortunately nothing can be decided until we get our biannual Browing review study back. This study looks at all of our assets and projects over 30 years what reserve funds we will need to maintain everything. The study is mandated by law and, as discussed in prior meetings, was to take place at the end of October so that we could have it in November. At our October meeting we also had a brief discussion about having Browning look at options such as various dues increasing or borrowing money for additional roadwork while prices are low to see how this would affect dues for the next 10-20 years to see if we could moderate increases. This study will be a significant part of the planning process for next year and were discussed at the budget meeting on Monday November 29th at the firehouse. The full study is fairly large, and if you are interested in obtaining a copy for review please contact Lynda at 621-0309, it has some valuable information in it. Look for the signs posted announcing budget meetings and please try to attend so that you can have a better understanding of why dues have to be where they are and why increases are necessary.

The annual packet is in the process of being prepared, at meetings we have asked for suggestions of topics members would like to have included. Some of these include a breakdown of where our dues go including how much is budgeted for delinquent accounts, additional insurance information for homeowners, description of the complaint process, and a possible calendar.

The board also needs to look at changing our meeting days. One of our board members must change his schedule to accommodate an ill coworker, and we are now looking into Thursdays as a good option. Also due to scheduling of other meetings at the firehouse. it looks like the fourth Thursday of the month will be an option. This will be discussed further at the next meeting and it is hoped that moving the meetings from Mondays may allow more members to attend. Another concern that we hear over and over as to why members don't come to meetings is that they get tired of complaints and criticism by those attending. All board members are also community members so it shouldn't be an "us vs. them" issue, but rather what is best for the community and it's far more useful when suggestions are offered.

The next regular SCPOA meeting will be held Monday December 16th, 6:00 PM at the firehouse. The budget and dues will be discussed so we hope members will attend.

### **Recipe of the Month**

#### **Prime Rib with Au Ius**

(10 to 12 pound roast)

#### **Rib Rub**

Rosemary 5 sprigs
Whole Garlic 1 cup
Cracked Black Pepper ¼ cup
Onion Powder ¼ cup
Garlic Powder ¼ cup
Kosher Salt ¾ cup
Olive oil 1 cup
Chop ingredients in food processor or blender.
Should be paste like.
Rub on Prime Rib.

To cook the Rib you will need:

Roasting Pan

Celery 1 stalk chopped coarsely

Onions 2 each chopped coarsely

Carrots 3 each chopped coarsely

Bay leaves 4 each

Place veggies in roasting pan with bay leaves, set rubbed roast on top.

Pre heat the oven to 375 degrees, roast the Rib for 45 minutes. Turn oven down to 225 degrees roast (20 minutes per pound.)

Check with thermometer. Rare is 110 degrees. This is a good time to pull out the roast and set it aside so you can make the Au Jus.

#### Au Ius

Take roast out of the pan and leave the Veggies. On the stove top turn on heat and add 2 cups of red wine (your choice) to deglaze the pan. Reduce liquid by 2/3. Add ½ gallon of water and cook for 20-30 minutes. Strain and skim the fat out before you serve.
