Finnon Dam Restoration Update

Mother Nature has decided that the Finnon Dam Restoration Project will NOT begin on April 1st as planned! The recent rain and snow has left the soil too wet for the heavy equipment to efficiently start removing the earth that forms the dam. The good news is that this slight delay gives us a little more time to get the necessary contracts signed and all parties ready to begin work during the first part of May (weather permitting, of course). Chief's Corner by Chief Bob Davis

Mother nature hasn't forgotten us. The snow in December was just the beginning! The rain and snow during these last two months has kept the Fire Department very busy. We had over twenty "public assists" during the snow.

A "public assist" can be any non-fire or non-medical service that the Department provides. With the severe weather and power outages, most of our PA's consisted of checking on vehicles that slid off the road or checking on people that the power outage might have adversely effected. A lot of the older homes in our district have electric heat and cooking stoves so a prolonged power outage during cold weather could become catastrophic to some. The Department has a list of folks who might need special attention during a power outage and if you would like to be added to that list, contact the Station (626-9017).

One of the recent snow storms resulted in a power outage up on Stope Drive which effected houses on Log Cabin, Stope, Maidu and all the way down to Highgrade, Mosquito Road and portions of Swansboro Road. PG&E's response was quick despite all the outages they had throughout the county. They were able to restore power to most of

the area rather quickly but a small block of houses in the Stope/Maidu area weren't so lucky. A crew from Seattle, WA who came down to support the local PG&E during the storm, finally got the repairs completed and ended the 3-day outage late Saturday night.

We know that with the heavy rain and snow we have received along with our propensity for mud slides, it was bound to happen. But when and where? Well as you know, it happened on Rock Creek Road at about 1:20 in the afternoon. One of our residents was on their way to town and came upon a rock-mud slide about two miles past the Rock Creek bridge. Unable to get through, they came back and stopped by the station to make sure we knew that a slide had closed the road. I informed dispatch that Rock Creek Road was blocked and then went to see where the slide was located. DOT and CHP were already on scene (on the other side). The rocks completely covered the road and my first action was to check over the edge to make sure no vehicle had been pushed over by the rocks. None had.

Driving back to the station, I began thinking about "strategies". How would we handle a Medical call, structure fire or vehicle accident with Rock Creek Road blocked. We were cut off from the additional mutual aid help that we normally would receive. Back at the Station, I contacted Camino Dispatch and El

Dorado County Fire and instituted a "contingency plan": Cal-Star could be here if needed within 15 minutes; County Fire would only dispatch one of the older Medic units that could cautiously cross Mosquito Bridge; If there was a need for Engine-25 to respond they would come down to the Mosquito bridge and our support group would meet them and transport the crew either to the incident or to Station 75 where they would respond on one of our pieces of equipment. Although not ideal, I did feel rather comfortable that even with the road blocked we would be able to continue to provide the services that the community expected.

When the snow melts - if it ever does, now's the time to start getting your home ready for the fire season. Cutting grass, trimming trees, cleaning gutters, and in general look for ways to provide as much defensible space around your house as possible. As you may have heard or read in the Mountain Democrat, the Board of Supervisors has not funded the Fire Safe Council's chipper program and the senior assist program. We still have available at the station the green vouchers that allow you to dump vegetation at the dump.—If you have any questions or need some advice please don't hesitate to call us (626-9017).

Finnon Dam Restoration Project by Neil Matheny

It's quite a conundrum. Do we hope for the rain to stop so we can get on with the dam restoration or do we hope for more rain to avoid droughts this summer! It appears that avoiding the drought is taking priority and the dam work will have to wait a while. The ribbon cutting and official "start" date has also been postponed until early or mid May.

The entire Finnon property will remain CLOSED (with the exception of the Rock Creek Café) due to several hazardous conditions. Please do not trespass on the property.

Meanwhile, the MVFA, the Steering Committee, and Mark Egbert and his colleagues continuine to make plans and, when appropriate, initiate them. Tom Harris is making improvements in the campground such as mending fences and grooming campsites so they will be ready when the facility is reopened. We are preparing to have parts of Finnon surveyed to verify the property lines. This will assure that we won't be working on neighbors' land and allow us to better utilize the property during the reconstruction process.

The drain for the lake is located about center-bottom of the dam and the control gears can be seen near the top of the dam with a large pipe connecting them. The drain is covered by a grate to help keep out larger objects when open. The restoration plan calls for this mechanism to be disassembled, refurbished

and then reused. Volunteers have removed the dirt and vegetation that covered parts of the mechanism so that an inspection and assessment of the viability for reuse can be made.

We will continue to post news updates in the box outside the restaurant front door. Thanks to Dee Harris for painting the sign for the Newsletter and to Sally Long-Johns for supplying the box. Previous copies of the Newsletter can be read inside the restaurant.

Recipe of the Month

I know it's a little late to have left-over corned beef from St. Patrick's Day but by request here's a great (in my opinion) for **Corned Beef Hash** recipe.

INGREDIENTS:

2-3 Tbsp unsalted butter

1 medium onion, finely chopped (about 1 cup)

2-3 cups finely chopped, cooked corned beef

2-3 cups chopped cooked potatoes

1whole egg

Salt and pepper

1 tablespoon Stone ground mustard

(If you have leftover cabbage from corned beef and cabbage, feel free to chop that up as well and add that to the hash).

DIRECTIONS:

- 1. Heat butter in large skillet (preferably cast iron) on medium heat. Add the onion and cook a few minutes, until translucent
- 2. Mix in the chopped corned beef and potatoes and then spread them evenly over the pan. Increase the heat to high or medium high and press down on the mixture with a metal spatula.
- 3. Don't stir the potatoes and corned beef; just let it brown. If you hear them sizzling, that's good! Use your spatula to peak underneath and see how the browning is doing. Once nicely browned, use the spatula to flip sections over so that they brown on the

other side. Press down again with the spatula. If there is too much sticking, you can add a little more butter to the pan. Continue to cook in this manner until the potatoes and the corned beef are nicely browned.

4. Remove from heat, stir in chopped parsley. Add plenty of freshly ground black pepper, and add salt to taste

Serve with fried or poached eggs for breakfast.


