Chief's Corner

I am sitting here in my office, looking out my window. Another storm is blowing through with snow falling, but not sticking. I am thinking is it ever going to warm up? In the past three weeks we have had snow from 1" to 4" on the ground. In between storms, we have had sunny and warm weather which makes you soon forget about the cold.

Many of you have either heard of or saw one of our Engines off the side of the road during our last snow storm. We were dispatched to a Medical call on Peycos Drive. As the responding engine was rounding the corner from Mosquito Road onto Highgrade Street, there was a car stopped in the middle of Highgrade Street installing chains. Not only was the installer/driver putting himself in danger by not pulling to the side, but other vehicles were placed in danger as well. The Engineer on the fire engine had to make a split decision - either hit the brakes and chance sliding into the car and installer/driver or try to go around the car. He chose to go around. Because of the snow on the ground, the engineer was unable to tell exactly where the edge of the road was and about half way past the car, the engine's wheels slipped off the edge of the pavement and that was all she wrote!. The ditch on that part of the road was very deep and muddy and once off the road there is no getting back on the pavement so a call went out for a tow truck. In the meantime, the installer/driver finished with his chains, got back into his car and drove off without even offering any assistance. Please think about your actions before you put yourself and others in danger while on our roads.

Beginning on May 1st, burn permits will be required for any outdoor yard waste burning. You can get a burn permit at the fire station or at any CDF station in the county. There is no charge for a permit, and if

you get one at the fire station all you have to do is put up with our little speech on what is required to obtain and properly use the permit.

Remember, the Permit is issued for the burning of outdoor yard waste WHICH IS DEFINED AS any vegetation that can normally be found in someone's yard such as leaves, pine needles, or small piles of cut brush. The burn pile can only be 4 feet in diameter and when you are burning, you must be in attendance with a water supply such as a garden hose or a five gallon bucket of water available for quick use. Remember, it's vegetation only so if it is man made it cannot be burned.

Also remember that a Permit doesn't let you burn anytime you want. Before you burn, you must call the Burn Day Information number (621-5897) where you will get a recorded message that will tell if it is or is not a burn day. Actually they tell you right up front if it is NOT a burn day. If it IS a burn day the recording starts out with a liability and responsibility lawyer driven statement (such as if your burn project escapes and gets on the property of another you can be held responsible for suppression charges and damages). You will also be told if it is a burn day (go for it), it is not a burn day (don't go for it), and the last is that it is a burn day with a permit between the hours of such and such. Make sure you call right before you burn as restrictions can develop during the day. Just pay attention and do what the recording says. If you have any questions, please call the fire station at 626-9017 and we will do our best to answer them. Also, if you would like, we will come out and look at your property to give you some pointers on what should be done to make your house more survivable in the event of a wild land fire. Above all, if you are burning and it gets away from you, please call 911 and we will be dispatched to put it out. Please do not wait to report an out of control fire. The sooner you call the less damage. Enjoy the spring! Be Safe

Finnon Dam Restoration Project

As the old saying goes "When It Rains, It Pours" and it's been raining a lot lately. The MVFA has recently received news that the Job Corps and the Operating Engineers have decided to NOT participate in the Finnion dam restoration project. The Job Corps appears to be having problems finding appropriate personnel as well as having some funding issues. The Resource Conservation District is now in the process of contracting the work. Initial contacts make this look like a possibility, but there are many details yet to be worked out. If everything goes well, bids from private contractors will be opened on April 29th and the bid awarded on May 3rd. The actual work start date will be determined by the successful bidder but we are "encouraging" them to start ASAP. The ribbon cutting event has also been postponed until a more appropriate time.

The entire Finnion property will remain CLOSED (with the exception of the Rock Creek Café) due to several hazardous conditions. Please do not trespass on the property.

The Finnion property line survey has been completed. It was more difficult than expected because many of the old reference markers could not be found. This required going out to the Quarter Section Monuments and working back to the actual Finnion boundaries. But now the entire property has been surveyed and the boundaries identified. We should have a copy of the record of survey in 2-3 weeks.

A survey of the contours of the lakebed has also begun. This is necessary because we are planning to re-contour the lakebed to enhance fish habitat and recreational use.

A great big THANKS to all the Mosquito residents who volunteered to help house and feed the Job Corps students. It appears unlikely at this time that we will use all of this support, however, there may be new opportunities for assistance and we may call on you again.

A very large digger pine fell in the campground during the recent storms. We would like to cut it up on the weekend of April 30. If you can volunteer chain saws (24 inch or bigger would be nice), trucks

and labor, please contact Tom Harris at 642-2333.

Restoration of lake and forest health requires us to provide fish, bird and bat habitat. We do not have details yet on what materials will be used and how much will be required, but we will be asking the community to assist in supplying materials and construction. If you are interested in fish habitat, contact Dave Angelo at 621-3688 or if your interest is in birds and bats, contact Tom Harris at 642-2333.

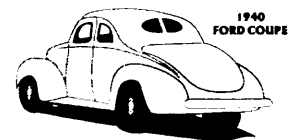

We will have our Craft Tables at the Big Boy Toy Show on May 21st

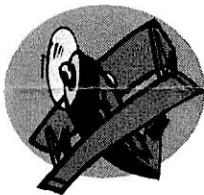

Recipe for the Month

Carrot Souffle

Ingredients:

2 ½ pounds carrots cut in chunks

1 cup butter (melted)

6 eggs, beaten

4 tablespoons flour

1 teaspoon baking powder

3/4 cup granulated sugar

1/8 teaspoon cinnamon

1/8 teaspoon nutmeg
 Topping
 ½ cups Corn Flakes
 1 cup brown sugar
 10 ounces melted butter
 ¾ cup nuts (pecans, almonds your choice)
 1 tablespoon cinnamon

Preparation:

Cook carrots in boiling salted water until tender, about 20 to 25 minutes; drain well and mash. Combine mashed carrots with remaining ingredients; pour into a buttered, 2-quart Souffle dish sprinkle topping over Souffle Bake at 350° for 15 minutes. Reduce heat to 300° and bake 45 minutes longer.

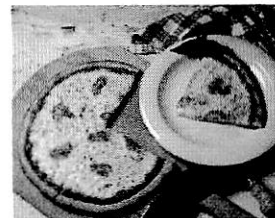
