Fannon Dam Restoration Project by Neil Matheny

Watching the Veerkamp equipment in operation is like watching a well-choreographed dance with each machine doing its job, knowing when and where to do it and staying out of the way of the others. The high moisture content of the soil has impaired the use of the scrapers and required the dirt to be removed by the excavator and dump trucks. The scrapers will be used to bring the drier dirt back to rebuild the new dam. A D-8CAT has been added to the equipment at the site.

Veerkamp has removed almost all of the dirt from the original dam near the café and spread it out to dry along the south shore of the lakebed. They have also begun spreading dirt on the north shore.

The next tasks are removing the rest of the old dam, locating and inspecting the drain that runs from the lake to the west side of Trail Gulch Road and cutting the "keyway". The keyway is a trench cut along the length of the dam that is about 24 feet wide and 5 feet deep. The keyway will show where the new center of the dam is. When the dirt is properly compacted into the keyway, it helps secure the new dam in place. Work around the rest of the facility is continuing. The Boy Scouts are assisting with the installation of bat houses and a crew from Growlersburg Conservation Camp will assist with brush and debris removal from the lakebed.

Fish get "Dumped On"

When Finnon was drained, the fish in the lake were moved to the coffer dam. With the warm July weather, the water level began to drop due to evaporation. The Fire Department, however, came to the rescue. During the wildland fire season, the Firefighters and Support Group generally train on water movement using the Water Tenders and Pump 75 so Chief Davis took the opportunity to "move" the water from the supply point to the coffer dam. The training mission was accomplished and the fish got a much needed infusion of fresh water.

SCPOA Report

By now everyone should have gotten their June packet and I would like to correct the statement that we made about the chipping program not being funded. We were given bad info, Good News-- it is funded and chipping is available so if you have brush you need chipped you can find instructions on what you need to do as well as fill out the request form on their website at <http://www.edcfiresafe.org/index.php> or contact them at 647-1700.

Johnathan and Kevin have been mowing the common areas, trimming brush and filling potholes as conditions allow. While it's been warm, much of the ground beneath the roads is still wet due to all the rain we had, some areas require more time to dry out before they can be patched. While the roads dry our crew will be working on placing asphalt grindings on some of the unimproved courts and road ends. We have been hoping to get these grindings for several years and Veerkamp Construction has come up with some for us. These will be used on our courts which have never had any thing on them before. It will form a good surface once spread and rolled for a price significantly lower then using asphalt.

As the weather warms more members are using the lakes so we ordered two transfer loads of sand to be placed at both Dyer and Catfish Lakes in the beach areas. The board also approved a plan submitted by Aquatic Environments which was within our budget, to treat Dyer, Trout, Catfish as well as Twin Ponds for

the growth in them. At this time treatments have been done and the lakes look good. The chemicals that are used for these treatments are safe for both wildlife and humans, they are specific to the plants and used in very small doses.

Our secretary Lynda has been doing her best to work with owners who still owe on their assessments, unfortunately we still have over \$100,000 still outstanding with some owners refusing to make any effort to make payments or communicate. Since all of us must make up this difference the board decided to take those members who have made no effort to pay to small claims court, initially eleven cases were approved to take to court. Liens were also approved for another 29 properties and we have one lot which will be going to a foreclosure sale by our collection agency Cimeron.

Our meetings are held on the fourth Thursday of each month starting at 6:00 PM at the Fire Station. Following the regular meeting will be Road and Budget meetings. We hope you will join us to provide your input and ideas

CCC - "Cleaning Cooking Calamities"
