Chief's Corner

We have been very fortunate!!! As we approach the end of August we find ourselves about half way through the traditional fire season and so far there has not been a single significant vegetation fire on the hill. With the hot days and dry conditions, however, the potential for a large, devastating fire is still very real and scary. As a Chief I know that there are times when no matter how fast you get to a fire, how much equipment and personnel you have on it there is nothing you can do about it. I am hoping our good fortune continues and that does not happen to us. So please be careful with all outdoor activities. If you are going to do any grass or weed cutting or going to be using gasoline powered tools of any kind please do it early in the morning before 10 am or late in the evening.

Although it's often difficult to tell the difference, there is a separation of responsibilities on a wild land fire. The California Department of Forestry (or Cal-Fire as they are called) is actually responsible for wild land fire protection. Our Department has the primary responsibility for structure protection. In reality, however, if (or when) that day comes and there is a wild land fire in the District, our Fire Department is the first dispatched. We are very aggressive when it comes to fighting wild land fires as we know the best way to save structures is to put out the fire before it gets any size to it. However, our Department's responsibility is to the lives of our community members, fire fighter safety, and structures. Those three priorities will be what guides our actions. When I respond to a wild land fire, one of the first things I do is make a decision of whether to fight the fire or

protect a house, we always do everything possible to protect the house but only after someone's life is not being threatened or a fire fighter's safety is not being jeopardized.

So what can you as a member of this community do to help out? First, make sure good clearances are maintained around your house, this one thing alone will greatly increase our ability to save your house. Make sure your driveway is clear enough to make it possible for a fire engine to get to your house. Remember, your little Toyota may be able to access your driveway but can a 16-ton fire engine do it? Take the time to look at your driveway and see if a cement truck or a moderate sized U-haul truck can go down it without tearing itself up. Make sure your roof and gutters are clean and any hanging limbs are removed. Be aware of how your house fits in the wild land and see if it can be saved. If you are not sure, give me a call at 626-9017 and we will gladly come to your house and check it out for you.

Remember that the worst part of the fire season is coming up. September and October is the usual month that burns up El Dorado County, for that is when the fuels are at their driest, the weather starts to change and we get more wind. So for the next couple of months everyone has to be cautious with outdoor activities and think fire prevention.

On Saturday the 13th of August Cal-Fire and the Mosquito Fire Department put on a training burn at Fannon Lake. We burned the east end of the lake where the proposed new camp sites will be. The burn went off without any problems. It gave our firefighters the chance to feel the heat and see fire during the training. Thanks go out to Dave Angelo and Bob Saxon for preparing lunch for all the Fire Fighters.

SCPOA

Our maintenance crew, Jonathan and Kevin, have been very busy trying to keep up with the basic maintenance items such as mowing and weed eating as well as prepping courts and applying the asphalt grindings. So far they have completed Claim St, Claim, McGuire, Polk, and Riffle Courts as well as Adams Ln. All areas were smoothed out, a culvert was placed where needed at Claim Street and then they were all rolled. It's a nice improvement to all these areas, however this depleted the first \$20,000 allocated to the project. The next areas to be

prepped are Log Cabin, Corder and Pinecone Courts as well as parts of Tummeli, Deer Park, Immerville and Nugget. Letters will be sent to the owners with adjacent properties asking them to clear their brush and any other obstacles that might interfere with the process or drainage. A motion was approved for another \$20,000 to continue this process on the above mentioned areas.

Lynda is still doing her best to work with delinquent owners to make payments, several more liens were approved to be placed on properties and two others were released due to payment. One piece of property will be going to a foreclosure sale at the end of the month.

Our maintenance crew plans to place more fencing at the end of the runway by Dyer Lake. It will be below runway level and should discourage motorcycles from getting on the runway. The pilots group purchased and will be installing new windsocks at each end of the runway. The group will also be planning a day to add more paint to the markings on the runway which has faded in the last several years, this will also be done at no cost to the community.

Our next meeting will be Thursday September 22nd at the Fire Station, starting at 6:00 PM and followed by budget and roads meetings.

Finnon Dam Restoration Project

If you haven't been going to Finnion on a regular basis, here's what you've missed:

- Eating Frank's bargain "Looky Loo" breakfast.
- Removal of all the old material from the south half of the dam and distributing it around the lake to dry.
- Cutting of the "keyway" on the south side and starting to refill it with compacted soil.

- Start of the rebuild of the dam near Trail Gulch Road.

- Cutting the trench for the new outlet for the lake.
- Installation of the new outlet pipe and the reinforcing bars around it.

By the time you read this, the outlet pipe will be encased in concrete and will probably be covered by compacted soil. This milestone signals the start of destruction of the north half of the dam while rebuilding the south half continues.

Not as apparent as the work on the dam, but equally important to the future of Finnion, is the work on the rest of the park. Brush removal, wildlife habitat development and campground renovation are all very important and continuing activities.

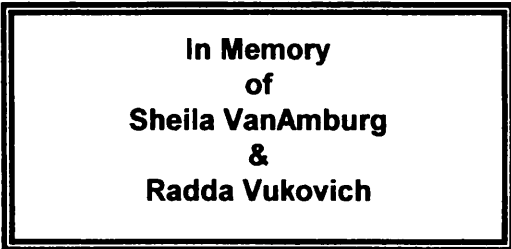
Crafters

Recipe of the Month

Barbecued Bean Salad (this recipe has been requested by many)

- 1-16 ounce can Pinto Beans
- 1-16 ounce can Kidney Beans
- 1-16 ounce can Garbanzo Beans
- 1-16 ounce can Cut Green Beans
- ½ cup Bar-B- Que Sauce
- ½ cup Apple Cider Vinegar
- ½ cup Olive Oil
- 2 tablespoons Worcestershire Sauce
- 6 tablespoons Brown Sugar, packed
- 1 tablespoon Chili Powder
- 1 teaspoon Ground Cumin
- 1 teaspoon Salt
- ½ teaspoon Pepper
- 3 tablespoons Dijon Mustard
- 1 Med Red Bell Pepper, diced
- 1 Med Gr. Bell Pepper, diced
- 1 Med White Onion, minced
- 1 Med Tomato, Diced
- ½ cup Chopped Cilantro

Drain and rinse beans.
To make dressing: In 1-quart non- aluminum saucepan combines bar-b-que sauce, vinegar, olive oil, worcestershire sauce, brown sugar, chili powder, cumin, Salt, pepper. Bring to boil, reduce heat to low and simmer 10 minutes. Remove from heat. Whisk in mustard and set aside.

To assemble salad: In large bowl combine beans, bell peppers, onion and Tomato and the dressing mix with the chopped cilantro. Serve at room temperature.


