Chief's Corner

We recently had a weather event come through our district with a lots of lighting and a little bit of rain. Cal-Fire recorded over 400 lighting strikes in our area. We can be thankful for the rain we had along with the lighting strikes because to our knowledge only two fires resulted. Bald Mountain lookout spotted smoke out in the forest around road 12N59. We were dispatched to check it out. It took about an hour and half to find the fire which was about 400 feet off the road. By the time we got it controlled, it turned out to be a relatively small 3 acre fire. The next day, Bald Mountain lookout again spotted smoke, this time around Mosquito Road and Sand Mountain Boulevard. Forest Service was en route and we were requested to send a water tender to support their fire fighting effort. They had two Forest Service Engines and one hand crew working the fire. It was contained within one and a half acres

Don't be fooled! The little rain, as nice as it is to have, is also a bit deceiving. As soon as the sun comes out, everything will dry out and we will be back in the wildland fire season. So even though there has been some rain, it wasn't enough to lessen the danger. So caution still needs to be exercised through September, October and even November. It seems that there is always someone who thinks that since we have had rain, that it is OK to go out and burn. That is not true so don't let your guard down.

I would like to remind everyone that the District has an evacuation plan in the event that an evacuation is needed. The evacuation route is clearly marked by signs at every intersection. The greatest hazard likely to cause an evacuation is a wild land fire. During such an event, there will be a great deal of confusion, noise, limited visibility and danger. The signs are there to provide direction to the Swansboro Airport - our evacuation center. Several of the pilots have offered their hangers as temporary shelters in the event of an evacuation. With Rock Creek Road on one side of the hangers and the runway on the other side there is very little fuel in the area so that makes the hangers the safest place in our District from a wildland fire. Our evacuation plan is referred to as a "shelter in place" plan. Quite simply, this means that you go to a safe place in the District (the airport) for a short period of time. It then becomes the responsibility of the Sheriff's Department to get us off the hill and find long term shelter if they deem it necessary.

One problem that we have in our community is "access". Sending a large number of cars down Mosquito Road if a fire is coming that way could be dangerous. All it would take is one vehicle accident and the road could be blocked with little or no ability for others to turn around. Evacuating down Rock Creek Road to Placerville is also very risky as fire equipment and other resources will be using that road to get to into our District. In the past, we have had incidences of a car hitting a fire engine on Rock Creek Road. And, if Rock Creek Road gets blocked, then responding firefighting equipment can only access our District through the forest. So in the event of an emergency, everyone needs to drive calmly, carefully and shelter in place.

The Support Group and others, including myself, have started a list of people who would need help in the event of an evacuation. If you know of anyone who would need assistance during an evacuation process, please notify the Support Group or the Fire Department with the following information: NAME, ADDRESS, PHONE NUMBER, AND ANY SPECIAL NEEDS (FOR EXAMPLE, MEDICINE, OXYGEN, OR FAMILY NOTIFICATION).

As far as animals are concerned, please take them with you if you can. If there are animals left behind, leave a note on the door for firefighters. Please note any large animals that would need to be let out of their pens.

I hope these evacuation routes never have to be used. However, we do have an action plan in hand for your safety in case of an emergency, so please be aware and familiar with them. BE SAFE!



Finnon Dam Restoration Project by Neil Matheny

The contractor began overtime operations on the 20th of September that will include 10 hour days and working on Saturdays. This will improve the chances that the dam will be completed before winter. Veerkamp has encountered some mechanical problems with their equipment along with the late heavy rains, cool summer and excessive moisture in the old dam soil. These have slowed the construction progress a little.

In spite of these impediments, the north side of the dam has been getting smaller and the south side bigger. It's not always easy to observe the changes, especially since the observation point at the café is some distance away and much of the current construction is at the bottom of the dam. Another sign of progress is the amount of dirt that has been piled on the lakebed. Old dam materials now occupy most of the lakebed from the "point" on the North, across the lakebed to the south shore and westward to the dam (although some soil has already been removed from the lakebed as part of the reconstruction process). With overtime operations, changes will occur much faster. They are working feverishly to beat Ol' Man Winter.

SCPOA

Jonathan and Kevin are doing their best to keep up with all the projects they have going. They have been focusing on laying road grindings down and rolling them into the areas that were prepped. The comments regarding this process has been positive. The board agreed to commit another \$20,000 to purchase more grindings for Pinecone, Log Cabin, Corder and Wildflower Courts and will hope to continue on to Nugget Court and other dead end areas. The potholes will be taken care of as quickly as possible.

A significant part of prepping for any road work consists of clearing brush, unfortunately many property owners do not clear brush along the roadways so our maintenance crew must do it. There has really been only one way to dispose of this brush and that is to burn it, again unfortunately most of the clearing occurs in the summer so the brush sits until burn season. The board has been looking into the possibility of purchasing a chipper, our new insurance company is willing to provide coverage so it has become feasible. Our Treasurer Tee was able to find an appropriate type chipper for an incredibly reasonable price, in good condition and with the present owners willing to deliver it as well as go over maintenance with our crew. We will be considering the purchase at the next meeting, this would ultimately save us money since brush could be taken care of at the site rather then hauled off and piled for burning.

Discussions are starting for our budget next year. We know our reserve study has projected a dues increase so we will be looking at more savings options. We will need to ask Browning, our reserve study company, to look at what effect doing the courts with grindings has had since this is a much lower cost process then the original plan. Budget meetings will be held after the regular SCPOA meetings and we would really appreciate constructive input from the community.

Our secretary Lynda has been working with Rob Lupient to improve the website, they are trying to make it as user friendly as possible as well as add pictures. Please check it out at www.scpoa.net and feel free to contact us with any suggestions you may have for improvement.

We still have a pretty large outstanding balance for owners who have not paid their dues. Those owners who have made no attempt to make payment will be taken to small claims court. We know times are difficult and Lynda and the board will do whatever is needed to work with owners who are having difficulty in making their payment but communication is necessary. Please contact Lynda at 621-0309 and she will be happy to work with you.

We have been dealing with a complaint about an illegal structure for a number of years now, it is and has been in the hands of code enforcement. They have taken the owner to court and won but nothing was happening since then. The board decided to ask the assistance of Ron Briggs and his office so a letter was sent describing the issue and the lack of response from code enforcement. Within a few days we received calls from Ron Briggs' office with some suggestions of actions we could take and suddenly code enforcement was moving forward. We hope that this issue will finally be resolved and would like to thank Mr. Briggs' staff for their quick and helpful response.

Our meetings are scheduled for the fourth Thursday of each month with the next one being October 27th at 6:00 PM at the fire station, we hope you will join us.
