IT'S DONE!..... (Almost)

Finnon Restoration

Whew! The Dam Is Done. Well, almost. After lamenting last month about the delays caused by rain and prognosticating that the dam wouldn't be completed this year, the contractor suggested overtime and the Project Manager committed the funds. Around the clock operations began on October 31 and lasted for just over a week resulting in the dirt part of the dam being completed and inspected. The last major task is to install the sliding gate that covers the drain. It will have to be inspected and its operation demonstrated. The concrete support structures for the sliding-gate guides were poured on November 17th. Installation of the gate and operating mechanism may occur soon. Other than that, there are a few minor items that need to be done.

A new drainage system will be installed between the dam and the Café. The old drainage system emptied into the lake, but since drainage includes runoff from the parking lot, it now has to be directed away from the lake. Plans are being made to landscape the area around the café to take maximum advantage of the topography created by the new dam.

Before the lake is filled we need to create additional fish habitat. The bottom of the lake will be left "essentially" as you see it now. Some of the vegetation in the lakebed will be removed, but much will still be there to snag your lures. Spawning grounds will be created, rock piles and artificial "condos" will be placed.

Why is there a road half way up the backside of the dam? That's not a road, it's called a "bench" and it is a structural part of the dam. It acts to strengthen the dam much the way corrugations strengthen a flat plate.

As you can see, construction activities are still proceeding around the lake. There is still a lot of work to be done before the campground can be reopened. Please continue to stay out of the restricted areas. We will announce when it is safe to return to using the facility for walking and jogging.

Chief's Corner

I hope everyone had a good Thanksgiving. It's hard to believe that Thanksgiving has come and gone, Christmas is less than a month away and soon a New Year will be here. Time just goes by too fast.

With winter upon us, it is a sure thing that we will lose power. It isn't as common as it used to be but it still does happen and you should be prepared for it. Extra

flashlights and lanterns should be available and functioning properly. If you haven't tested your lanterns lately, now is a good time. Remember to check the amount of fuel you have available for your generator if you have one. If your heating system requires electricity to work, try to obtain a backup-heating source. A wood stove is the most common up here. Before you use it though, the chimney should be checked for safety and cleaned. (See last month's Byte article)

If anyone is dependent on an oxygen generator to support their breathing or requires electricity for health needs, please let us know at the fire department. We have extra oxygen tanks at the fire station in case of emergency needs.

I don't really know of a good time of the year when things get quiet. The probability of something happening is always there. If it does happen to you, please do not hesitate to give us a call. If you think it's an emergency, using 911 is the best and quickest way to get the fire fighters coming to help. If it's NOT an emergency, you can call the fire station at 626-9017. Curtis, Mary or I staff the station 7 days a week between the hours of 8-12 & 1-5. We do have meetings and at times we are out doing business in the District or helping someone out. But we do our best to make sure someone is there during the business hours.

I have been getting a lot of questions regarding burn permits. Yes, burning permits are needed and you can get them at the fire station. Permits are required mostly because of the air quality control. Since permitted burning is now tied to air quality control criteria, don't be surprised when you decide that conditions are perfect for burning but you call the Burn Day Information number (621-5897) and you hear that it is a no burn day. Yolo, Amador, Placer and El Dorado Counties make up the Sacramento Valley Air Quality Control District. So if it's a bad air day in Sacramento, we often can't burn up here. When it is clear up here but foggy in the valley it will most likely be a "NO BURN" day. If there is too much smog from vehicles, or agricultural burning that's taking place in the valley, there's generally no burning allowed up here in the foothills. This doesn't make sense to me but that is because, being a fire guy, I want you to get rid of the brush and fire hazards and the most economical way of doing that is by burning it. But the air Quality Control folks don't see it that way, their concern about the air wins out.

Again, winter is here so please check your heating appliances and make sure they are clean and working properly. Also, it's a good time to check smoke detectors and carbon monoxide detectors. And above all, be careful out there - remember to be vigilant with holiday lights and decorations. Be safe.

Our maintenance crew has had a very busy summer working on our roads. They have finally finished laying down the last of the road grindings for this year. Jonathan and Kevin have completed Pineneedle, Nugget, and Tumelli. They will be rolled with the 10 ton roller that Veerkamp was using at the Finnon project. This roller was scheduled to depart but Veerkamp agreed to keep it here another day to roll the courts for the same price it would have cost to rent the smaller one. With all the work on the courts our crew was not able to get to as many pot holes filled as they would have liked. Now the temperature has gotten cool enough that the patch material requires a torch to heat it up so it will work, but they will get to the worst of the holes as weather allows. The application of the grindings is complete for this year. We were able to complete 12 courts or road sections and used 74 transfer loads. We "Thank" Blain Stumpf trucking for their incredible flexibility in being available when the grindings were and providing the trucking at a reasonable price.

If you drive by Twin Ponds you will notice a significant difference in the look, Jonathan and Kevin have been removing the cattails from the shores. In the past we have had bids to harvest the cattails of well over ten thousand dollars, but with some ingenuity, left over steel and a few hundred dollars, our crew was able to build an attachment for the tractor to do the job and it's pretty impressive what they have done.

One of the issues our crew deals with is brush and berry bushes growing into the roadway. Property owners need to keep their property by the roadway clear. Many members help out their neighbors by maintaining a section of roadway since some are

The board is working on our budget for next year and will be holding a meeting at the fire station on December 12th at 6:00 PM. We hope to be able to finalize the budget at this time and know if we will need to raise the dues or not. We are waiting for the update from Browning Reserve. We were late in getting the needed information to them since we have just finished the road work grindings and wanted it reflected in the reserve report.

The board has been working with our new bank, Mutual of Omaha, to look at options for the association. One of which will be the ability to pay your assessments with a credit card. In the past we had looked at this option but the fees that the bank was charging were too high. The Mutual of Omaha branch that we are working with only deals with homeowners associations and will be providing this option for us at no cost. The December packet will provide this option for next year. Depending on which credit card you use you may be charged a small fee by them but it varies by card companies. We will be using a lock box system so that payments will go directly to the bank who then sends reports back to our Secretary, which will tie into the Tops Accounting System that we use. These are systems that a significant amount of homeowners associations use so while its new to us it's been around for awhile.

Our next meetings: Budget meeting Monday Dec. 12th at 6 PM and regular SCPOA meeting Thursday Dec. 15th at 6PM, both will be held at the fire station.

Recipe of the Month by Chef Frank

BREAD PUDDING

Ingredients:

3 ½ cups Sugar
2 tsp. Ground Cinnamon
1 tsp. of Nutmeg
6 Medium Eggs
1 cup Heavy Cream
4 cups Milk
1 tsp. Vanilla
French bread, sliced thin

SAUCE

Ingredients:

1 cup Heavy Cream
2 cups Whole milk
1 Tbsp. Corn Starch
1 Tbsp. Water
6 Tbsp. Sugar
1/4 cup Bourbon/Whiskey

Bread Pudding:

Preheat oven to 300 degrees. Grease 8" square baking pan. Combine sugar, cinnamon, and nutmeg in a large bowl. Beat in the eggs until smooth, add the milk then work in the heavy cream. Add the vanilla, Arrange the bread slices in the pan pour the mixture over the bread. Allow bread to soak up custard. Cover with plastic wrap and foil. Place pan in a water bath and bake for approximately 45-60 minutes. Uncover the pudding and bake until the pudding has a golden brown color and is firm to the touch. If a toothpick inserted in the pudding comes out clean, it is done. The mixture of pudding should be nice and moist, not runny or dry. Serve warm.

Sauce:

Place the cream and milk in a small saucepan over medium heat, and bring to a boil. Whisk corn starch and water together, and add to cream while whisking. Bring to a boil. Whisk and let simmer for a few seconds, taking care not to burn the mixture on the bottom. Remove from heat. Stir in the sugar and the bourbon. Taste to make sure the sauce has a thick consistency, a sufficiently sweet taste, and a good bourbon flavor. Pour over the Bread Pudding and enjoy.
