Chief's Corner by Chief Bob Davis

Well it has been busy around the fire department during the first month of 2012. We've had more calls in the first three weeks than we did in the last two months of 2011. 3 Medical Calls, 1 Public Assist and 1 Structure Fire.

The structure fire started about 9:15 pm. The first call to dispatch was smell of smoke, later I found out that a 10 year old girl made the first call. It was toned out as smell of smoke. The home owner called back and stated that it was a chimney fire. As I arrived on scene, I noticed lite smoke coming out of the attic vents. I made sure everyone was out of the home, then I went inside and saw fire above the ceiling around the stove pipe. The first engine to arrive connected a water supply line to a near by fire hydrant and then continued on to the scene. The engine crew attacked the fire "knocking it down" and kept it from extending into the rest of the home, Our Fire Fighters did a fantastic job keeping the fire contained to a very small area of the home. We also had help from our neighbors; Engines 25, 46, 251 and Medic-48.

With Fire Fighters it's always a good feeling when you can save someone's home from burning to the ground; that's what we train for on Tuesday nights. But then the reality sets in. In this case, the family that lives in the home has two small children. So if there is anyone out there that can donate clothes, money or food, the family would greatly appreciate it. You can drop off your donations at the fire station.

EMT Class Offered by the Mosquito Fire Department starts January 30th. Cost of the class is \$400 and a total of 127 hours of class work. If you are interested in taking the class contact Chief Davis at bdavis@mfpd.us or call the Mosquito Fire Department at 626-9017.

Chief Davis has been out there with his crew burning brush as a training exercise to help us out too. I would also like thank those who have contributed by your donations. The money you have donated is what we will use to get the rest of the projects done.

Our maintenance crew has been working on opening up another one of our common areas: the area off Swansboro road behind Dyer Lake. Jonathan and Kevin have been clearing out some of the lower growth as well as clearing low hanging tree branches and removing dead trees. This has opened up a 1.7 acre area for walking or horseback riding. This clearing not only opens the area for use but also provides a fire break. The clearing operation(s) have also resulted in a large amount of firewood available to our members. Some of the wood has been put out by the telephone pole by the SCPOA shop on Sluice street. In order to allow more members access to the wood, we ask that you contact our secretary Lynda at 621-0309 if you have a need for additional wood, she will coordinate with our maintenance crew to leave it out for you.

During the first part of the month, while the days have been warm and dry, our crew has been unable to get any road patching done due to the very cold nights. The patch material becomes like concrete when it gets cold and there hasn't been enough heat during the days to soften it up. When we move into warmer weather in the Spring, it will be workable again. We are also on hold with the chipper we purchased. It has been serviced and is ready for delivery but is being held up by a certificate that's required by the state. It should arrive in the next month or so.

Lynda is still doing her best to work with members who owe dues from last year, we still have just over \$58,000 still owed. We will continue to take non-paying members to small claims court where we have not lost a case when no payments have been made. Please contact Lynda at 621-0309 if you owe dues and at least make an effort to start payments. We have many

members struggling yet they manage to make payments.

We are planning two road projects for next year: 1) We will have a double chip seal placed on the areas where grindings were put down last year and 2) Have a double chip mat applied to the areas where asphalt leveling courses were applied. A bid package will be put together and sent out to all interested contractors by the first part of March. Once bids are received we will be able to determine how much of the work we can complete. We hope to have all work completed in July.

Our Annual Meeting will be on Saturday February 11th starting at 10:00 AM at the Fire Station. Ballots <u>MUST</u> <u>be received by 9:00AM on February 9th, 2012.</u>

Please remember NO ballots will be received at the meeting. The results of the election will be announced at the Annual Meeting.

Our next regular SCPOA meeting will be Thursday February 16th at 6:00 PM, at the Fire Station.



It's time for those who were doing rain dances last Spring to dust off the drums and start dancing again. The slide gate over the lake drain is now closed and is holding back a small amount of water. A wet winter and spring would be nice.

In the picture of the slide gate system that follows, the top-left shows an overview of the lake and the gear mechanism that is used to open and close the slide gate. The top-right shows the complete slide-gate system as seen from the lakebed. The lower-left is a close up of the connecting rod and one of its support structures. The lower-right shows the slide gate inside the safety grate and concrete housing.









A nice fenced area was created between the café and the lake that will eventually provide additional seating for the café and enjoyment of the lake. Thanks to the many volunteers who helped.

This is a long-over-due THANK YOU to all of my wonderful neighbors in Swansboro and Mosquito.

In the late evening of February 4th, 2011, almost a year ago now, my beloved husband, Bob Fritz, peacefully

passed away after a 25-month journey with an especially aggressive type of brain cancer, Glioblastoma multiforme. Up to this point, it has been too difficult for me to sit down and formulate my gratitude to all those who stood by our side along the way. I have often sent out numerous Thank You notes in my mind, as various anniversaries made me think of all the incredible love and support we received throughout our journey, but not everyone can read my mind, so I would like to take the opportunity to write a note here in the Mosquito Byte.

It all started on December 16th, 2008 when Bob had a grand-mal seizure in our home office. I was sitting right next to him and had no idea what was happening. I thought he was having a heart attack and that I would lose him right then and there. I absolutely panicked, but managed to call 911... and that was the first of many. many visits from our incredible Mosquito Fire Department. We learned to respect and appreciate each and every one who came to our home at all hours of the day and night. One of the most surprising times was when not only the firefighters and EMT's came to help Bob, but a special couple from the Mosquito Fire Department Support Group, who had heard yet another radio call from our household - this time at 5 AM. offered to drive me to Marshall Hospital because they wanted to spare me the stress of having to follow the ambulance in my own car. How very thoughtful!

And, there were other times when different members of our Fire Department would come over and help lift Bob from his recliner into bed each night, when his body no longer could participate in the process and he became too heavy for me to handle on my own. Imagine the gift that was; it gave Bob an extended "normal life"! Instead of being bed bound 24/7, he was able to sit upright in our living room and participate in the flurry of activities that were exciting to him and always seemed to be going on in our household during those days. As his bodily functions decreased, it became clear that we needed a Hover Lift so I could move him by myself at a moments notice. At that time, several neighbors gathered in our home and took turns to be "the patient", so I'd have ample practice time to learn how to use the equipment. That was so very comforting for me, since I was truly worried that I might drop my sweet husband who was almost fully paralyzed by then. if I didn't know exactly how to operate the equipment before I attempted to move him.

Then there were also the endless moments of moral support and social gatherings by neighbors who truly

transitioned in status from Friends to Family (which was especially heart-warming since our own family members lived in Colorado, Japan and Sweden). From the very beginning, someone in the neighborhood would check in with us almost daily, either by phone or in person. They would make sure to include us in their activities, whether it was a large party, a smaller dinner event, or a spontaneous outing to Rock Creek Café. It became a tradition to always make it for Family Night Dinner at the Café on Wednesdays and we learned to love our times there, especially since Bob would get so many big, rejuvenating hugs from others who were also there. It was always so uplifting for us to feel like we were such a big part of the community. When Bob's health declined and he couldn't walk as well, there was a core group of beyond-words-fabulous friends, who would pick us up and literally carry Bob into their car for the Wednesday night outings. And they did it with such love, tenderness and enthusiasm!!!

Eventually it became too difficult and too much of a strain on his body to leave his recliner, at which time many ordered take-out Family Night Dinners and came to our house instead. That meant that Bob still had company, which made him feel so special... To the very end, he had company! And, to the very end, he LOVED IT!!! (To be continued in the March issue of the Byte.)

Recipe of the Month

Easy Steak Sauce

1/2 cup Worcestershire sauce

1 tablespoon sesame oil

2 tablespoons sugar free maple syrup/pancake syrup

1/4 cup water

1 teaspoon garlic powder

1/2 teaspoon ground ginger

1/2 teaspoon ground cumin

1/4 teaspoon liquid smoke flavoring

1/4 teaspoon salt

1/4 teaspoon black pepper

1 pinch cayenne pepper2 packets sweetener* Optional

if the syrup isn't sweet enough

2 tablespoons tomato paste

Bring all ingredients except salt and tomato paste to a simmer and let simmer for 5 minutes. Whisk in tomato paste and let simmer to thicken (about 5 minutes). Taste and add salt as desired (or not).

Let cool completely to room temperature and then refrigerate. Yield 1cup
