Chief's Corner

Finally we have received some decent rain and snow. The "unofficial" rain amounts that we received were in excess of 9 inches. Then add the snow on top of that and we see that the middle of March gave us a much needed jolt in our moisture accumulation totals for the season.

Even with the latest snow fall covered virtually the entire the district, we had no emergency calls. A significant snowfall, which this last one was, usually is accompanied by auto accidents and public assists., none of which materialized. But, to be prepared we put snow chains on all of the fire rigs after the St. Patrick's Dinner at the fire station Saturday night. And as you know, Saturday night turned out to be the heaviest snow fall of the storm. On Sunday the power was out in the upper district for about 7 hours. With the snow falling on Saturday night and Sunday there were more people at home and less people on the road, it was a quiet weekend for the fire department.

Here are some cold weather tips now that cold weather is here. When working outside wear several layers of loose fitting clothing and shield all exposed areas of your body. Do not smoke because nicotine constricts finger and toe capillaries. Be careful when walking on snow and ice covered surfaces. Wear rubber-soled shoes and take short steps, planting feet firmly with knees bent. If you feel a loss of balance, relax and fall limply to your side. Make sure your wood stove pipe and chimney are functional and clear of obstructions. Have it checked yearly for any loose fittings, burned through holes, cracks, or loose bricks. A spark arrester is a good idea. And please remember to use smoke detectors throughout your house.

burned, drainage improved along the access road, bridge temporarily repaired, picnic tables repaired and painted etc.

The disc golf folks have been busy all winter too, and have done a great job keeping up with maintenance in the areas outside the campground. We have volunteers who are bringing their large tractors with bush hog mowers, so what we will need are lots of weed-eaters (string mowers), a few small trailers to pick up debris and carry it to the burn piles, and lots of eager hands.

Jonathan and Kevin have been taking advantage of the weather to clean up more of the common area behind Dyer Lake. The chipper has been put to use with the chips being used in the cleared areas. Some dead trees have been removed including a large pine, the trunk will be cut into benches that can be placed along the new trails. Kevin estimates that about 19 cords of wood have been removed and made available to members, if you would like some of this fire wood please let Lynda know at 621-0309 so it can be made available to you.

Dyer Lake: The BBQ pits at Dyer have been repaired and are ready for use. There seems to be an increasing problem with paper towels stopping up the toilets again. Since it appears that possibly the towels may be used as toilet seat covers, the board decided to provide tissue seat covers to hopefully alleviate the problem.

Some road repair has been done on Dogwood and will continue as temperatures allow, it was also noted that some garbage had been dumped off the side of the road.

Lynda is doing her best to collect assessments and is making a dent but we still have over \$54,000 outstanding. The board will continue to take delinquent owners, who make no effort to pay, to small claims court. When SCPOA wins, the extra costs get added on to the amount owed as has been the outcome on all previous instances. Please contact Lynda to make arrangements for payment and avoid the extra costs and possible wage garnishment.

We currently have a road contract out to bid. We had three contractors spend 3 1/2 hours going over our roads and making suggestions on our options. We added an alternate area of Log Cabin to the original road plan and will be making a final decision before the end of March. We will have a budget meeting after next months regular meeting with a primary focus on how we will deal with the cost of this years road work. It will be significantly greater then the amount budgeted but will also complete quite a few miles of roads.

Our next meeting will be Thursday April 19th starting at 6:00 PM at the Fire Station. The budget meeting will follow shortly after 6:30 PM so we hope you will attend.

Finnon Dam Restoration Project

The hydroseeding that was applied to the dam provided grass seed and a light "cap" over the soil. It was expected that they would control erosion on the down-stream side of the dam. The seed didn't germinate fast enough and the "cap" was too light for the rains that arrived. Members of the RCD and your local volunteers spent several days cleaning up silt and distributing straw over the dam. If this doesn't work, we may have to cover the dam with plastic sheets.

How deep is the lake now? Rather than give you a month-by-month report on the water depth, you can estimate it yourself. The lake-side face of the dam was graded to a slope of 1 foot elevation change for every 3 feet of horizontal distance. The slide gate activation system is parallel to the face of the dam. There are 13 support structures for the slide-gate connecting rod and they are exactly 10 feet apart measured along the face of the dam. Thus as the water rises from one support to the next, the water depth will increase about 3.16 feet. (For those of you who remember your trigonometry, this is 10 times the sine of the angle whose tangent is 1/3.

This list gives the depth of the water, in feet, above the toe of the slide gate when the water level is at the base of each support structure, counting down from the top: #1 - 42.7, #2 - 39.5, #3 - 36.3, #4 - 33.2, #5 - 30.02, #6 - 26.9, #7 - 23.7, #8 - 20.5, #9 - 17.4, #10 - 14.2, #11 - 11.0, #12 - 7.8, #13 - 4.7.

Recipe of the Month

BREAD PUDDING WITH WHISKEY SAUCE

Yields 6

BREAD PUDDING (back by request)
 3 ½ cups Sugar
 3 tsp. Ground Cinnamon

1 tsp. of Nutmeg
 9 Medium Eggs
 1 cup Heavy Cream
 4 cups Milk
 1 tsp. Vanilla
 French Bread, Sliced thin

WHISKEY SAUCE

1 cup Heavy Cream
 2 cups Whole milk
 1 Tbsp. Corn Starch
 1 Tbsp. Water
 6 Tbsp. Sugar
 1/4 cup Whiskey or Bourbon

To make the bread pudding, first preheat oven to 300 degrees. Grease 8" square baking pan. Combine sugar, cinnamon, and nutmeg in a large bowl. Beat in the eggs until smooth, add the milk then work in the heavy cream. Add the vanilla, Arrange the bread slices in the pan pour the mixture over the bread. Allow bread to soak up custard. Cover with plastic wrap and foil place pan in a water bath. Bake for approximately 45-60 minutes, uncover the pudding and bake until the pudding has a golden brown color and is firm to the touch. If a toothpick inserted in the pudding comes out clean, it is done. The mixture of pudding should be nice and moist, not runny or dry. Serve warm.

To make the whiskey sauce, place the cream and milk in a small saucepan over medium heat, and bring to a boil. Whisk corn starch and water together, and add to cream while whisking. Bring to a boil. Whisk and let simmer for a few seconds, taking care not to burn the mixture on the bottom. Remove from heat. Stir in the sugar and the bourbon. Taste to make sure the sauce has a thick consistency, a sufficiently sweet taste, and a good whiskey flavor. Pour over the Bread Pudding
