Chief's Corner

Spring is coming and the grass is really growing. This just happens to be my favorite time of year. The ponds are full, the grass is green and the trees are starting to leaf out. It's this time of year when the days warm up

and you look outside at the garden and think about how nice it would be to go to town and buy some spring flowers grand vegetable plants. But don't let mother nature fool you. Anyone who has lived up here for a year or more knows that there's another snow event just around the corner. What's the old saying up here; Winter isn't over in Mosquito until it snows on the dogwood blossoms. All I can say is that it's sure nice working outside without having five layers of clothing on..... but the dogwoods have just started to bloom and to my knowledge they haven't seen the snow.

This is also the time of year that I get on my soap box about clearance around the home. Now is the time to take the opportunity to clear the brush, leaves and pine needles off your land and more importantly, get the 100 feet of clearance around your house that's required by State law. Do it while we can still burn.

Starting May 1st, burn permits will be required in order to do any dooryard burning. These permits can be acquired at the Fire Station or at any CDF station in the county. There is no charge for a permit and if you get one at the fire station, all you have to do is put up with our little speech about the rules and regulations and what can be burned with the permit.

Permits are issued for the burning of dooryard trash. That is defined as any vegetation that can be found in someone's yard such as leaves, pine needles, or small piles of cut brush. A dooryard trash pile can only be 4 feet in diameter so keep the pile small. Also, when you are burning, you must be in attendance and a water supply (such as a garden hose or a five gallon bucket of water) must be available for quick use. Remember that only vegetation can be burned so generally if an item is manmade, it cannot be burned. If you have any questions about the clearance around your home or permitted burning, please call the fire department. If you desire, you can arrange to have a member of the fire department come to your home and give suggestions on clearing.

And yes, that is my "Help Wanted" ad that preceded my article. We could use a few more volunteers. So please give it some serious thought and drop by the station if you have any questions or interest.

Finnon Recreation Area to Open Soon by MVFA Board of Directors

The Board of Directors of MVFA would like to make the public aware of our opening plans for the new Finnon Recreation Area. Disc golf opened soon after the dam was completed, and the campground is scheduled for opening on Memorial Day weekend. Our grand opening ceremonies are scheduled for sometime in July. Updated information can be found on our new website at: www.finnonrecreationarea.com.

It is important to know that the costs of maintenance and operation of Finnon Recreation Area are financed solely through donations and local Fundraisers. We are not affiliated with SCPOA, and receive no money from that organization, nor from California State or El Dorado County taxes. The grant money we applied for is designated for specific projects like road and drainage improvements, wildlife habitat, etc. The new dam is paid for thanks to private grants and the work of Mark Egbert and the Georgetown Conservation Resource District. However, we incur dam inspection fees of over \$6,000 per year, plus we have deferred dam fees of \$ 46,164.77. In addition, we have insurance, property tax and utilities bills to pay.

To help pay these bills, the MVFA board feels it is prudent to charge a small use fee for certain activities at the lake such as fishing, boating and disc golf. Fees for camping are competitive with other campgrounds in the area. There will be no charge to hike or bike

through the park, and the fees apply to Mosquito Fire Protection District (MFPD) residents (that includes all of us) and outside visitors alike. Please refer to our new website for details.

Due to the volume of disc golfers, hikers, bicyclist etc., there are no off-roading opportunities in the park, and ATVs, dirt bikes and OHV's are prohibited.

In conclusion, we look forward to a full lake and a beautiful park, and want to thank all the workers and community volunteers who made it possible.

SCPOA

Jonathan and Kevin have been hard at work clearing out some of our little known common areas for use, the latest is lot 70 which is off Swansboro Road. Clearing out these areas will provide a fire break as well as some great areas that can be used for walking as well as riding horses. The area starts at the back of Trout lake, goes along Swansboro Road to behind Dyer, check it out next time you're in the area. Our crew has also refurbished the basketball court backstops and installed new baskets, more will be done to the court as things dry out, including the future installation of some benches. Mowing and road patching will continue as things warm up.

Our secretary Lynda continues the quest of collecting unpaid dues. Eight more cases have been filed with small claims court. The Board wants to strongly encourage anyone who is delinquent to please contact Lynda at 621-0309 to arrange to make payments, avoid the extra costs incurred with small claims court.

The board approved the opening of another bank account at River City Bank in order not to exceed the FDIC insurance limit.

The big news for the meeting was the information about the road bids and work to be done this year, we had already awarded one contract to chip seal over the road grindings that were placed last year. This second contract will finish off all the roads that just had the asphalt leveling course on them and repair and complete all of Log Cabin. Sixteen bid packets were sent out, three contractors came up to walk the job and all three submitted bids. The bids came in with the amounts of \$385,505, \$349,369 and \$328,512 all of these were much lower than we anticipated. It was decided to eliminate the high bid and carefully review the two remaining. In the past the board has looked at the numbers only when considering a bid. We have learned a lot over the past years, so this year we added

a number of other factors. These include the amount of materials in each bid, reputation of the companies and past performance including how the work was done, extra work completed in past contracts, adhering to industry standards and response to problems or concerns with work done. We felt that with our tight budget and doing everything we can to avoid dues increases we really wanted to be sure we were getting the best value for our money. Based on these factors the board awarded the contract to Delta Construction in the amount of \$349,369, work will begin the middle of July. Roads to have work done will include Dyer, Lawyer, Gold Trail, Stope, Maidu, Claim, Swansboro and all of Log Cabin will be completed.

We held a brief budget meeting after the regular meeting to discuss making changes to our current budget to reflect the new cost of the road work. The original budget only had \$115,000 in it for road work so the appropriate adjustments will be made to reflect the cost of all the work that is currently planned.

Our next meeting will be Thursday May 17th at 6:00 PM at the fire station. We hope you will attend.

Fannon Dam Restoration Project

The straw put on the down-stream side of the dam seems to be working. Your local volunteers, and the geese that are eating the straw, are pleased we won't have to cover the dam with sheets of plastic.

As the water rises, questions arise about when fishing will be allowed. Our best guess, subject to change, is that there will be no fishing this year as we are restocking and restoring the fish population; then a catch-and-release policy will be in effect for several years. During this time only artificial lures and flies will be allowed – no organic bait such as worms, crickets or cheese.

As mentioned in the March Byte, EID is obligated to supply Fannon with water (based on a century old water rights contracts). The problem is that it is illegal, and bad for the fish, to dump chlorinated water into the

lake. EID is getting close to having a plan to supply dechlorinated water but we don't have the details yet.

When the rains quit (and we aren't in any rush for that) we will be clearing debris and large trees from below the ancient high-water mark to keep them from floating into the lake. We will also be cleaning up and preparing the campground for opening on Memorial Day. We are installing electric power to the restroom and will have interior lighting soon.

We are still working on the dam, roads and campground. Camping will occasionally be limited as will the size and type of vehicle that can be accommodated. If you are considering using the campground for yourself or for guests, please contact MVFA for status.

The water depth in Finnon reached 23 feet on April 15. It is now at the same level that it was from 1997 until we drained it in January 2011.

Recipe of the Month

Old Fashion Potato Salad

Ingredients

4 cups cubed peeled potatoes
3 hard-cooked eggs, chopped
2 celery ribs, thinly sliced

1/4 cup chopped green onions
 1/4 cup diced red onion
 1/4 cup sweet relish
 1/2 cup mayonnaise
 2 tablespoons Champagne vinegar
 1 teaspoon Dijon mustard
 1/2 teaspoon salt
 1/4 teaspoon pepper

Directions

Place potatoes in a saucepan and cover with water; bring to a boil. Reduce heat. Cook for 20-25 minutes or until tender; drain, while still hot drizzle the champagne vinegar over the potatoes and let cool. Place in a large bowl; add eggs, celery and onions. In a small bowl, combine the remaining ingredients. Pour over potato mixture and toss to coat. Cover and refrigerate for at least 1 hour. Yield: 6-8 servings.
