Chief's Corner

YOU DON'T HAVE TO HAVE A MATCH TO START A FIRE!!!!! Every year, some people who are trying to eliminate their fire hazards by mowing, start fires instead. Hot, dry, and windy weather are perfect conditions for a fire originating from a spark from a mower blade striking a rock or other object. Here's how to keep cool, eliminate the fire hazard and prevent a fire:

1. Don't mow during the heat of the day! Mow before 10:00 AM or after 7:00 PM.

2. Keep the mower's exhaust system, spark arrester in proper working order and free of carbon buildup. Use the recommended grade of fuel and don't top off.

3. Before mowing check the area for rocks. A grasshidden rock struck by a metal mower blade is enough to start a fire.

4. Keep the engine and cooling fins free of oil and dust and debris. It reduces the chance the mower will catch fire and it will let the mower run cooler and last longer.

5. Keep the mower free of flammable materials. Check the grass outlet, around the blade, and the grass bag for obstructions.

6. Spark arresters are required on all portable gasoline equipment. (Tractors, Chain Saws & Mowers are all included in this requirement!)

7. And lastly, keep a shovel and fire extinguisher handy.

BEWARE- LAWN MOWERS ARE DESIGNED TO MOW LAWNS, NOT DRY GRASS OR WEEDS!



ANS – The original dam was built in 1905 to 1907. The café was built on the dam when the area was converted to recreational use by the State of California. Replacing the dam in the original location would require tearing down the café. Veerkamp removed as much of the old dam as possible without interfering with the café and leaving enough room for vehicle access to the

new dam. The south end of the dam was rebuilt between the lake and the café so the café is no longer on the dam.

Recipe for the Month

Chipotle-&-Orange Grilled Chicken 4 servings Total Time: 25 minutes

Ingredients

- 2 tablespoons orange-juice concentrate, thawed
- 1 tablespoon finely chopped chipotle peppers in adobo sauce, (see Note)
- 1 tablespoon balsamic vinegar
- 2 teaspoons unsulfured molasses
- 1 teaspoon Dijon mustard

1 pound boneless, skinless chicken breasts, trimmed Salt to taste

Preparation

Preheat grill or broiler.

Whisk together orange-juice concentrate, chipotle pepper, vinegar, molasses and mustard in a small bowl. Lightly oil the grill or broiler rack (see Tip). Season chicken with salt and grill or broil for 2 minutes. Turn, brush with the glaze and cook for 4 minutes, brushing occasionally with glaze. Turn again, brush with the glaze, and cook until the center is no longer pink, 1 to 2 minutes longer.

Tips & Notes

Note: Chipotle chiles in adobo sauce are smoked jalapeños packed in a flavorful sauce that contribute a rich smokiness. Look for the small cans with the Mexican foods in large supermarkets. Once opened, they'll keep up to 2 weeks in the refrigerator or 6 months in the freezer.

Tip: To oil a grill rack: Oil a folded paper towel, hold it with tongs and rub it over the rack. (Do not use cooking spray on a hot grill.) When grilling delicate foods like tofu and fish, it is helpful to spray the food with cooking spray.


