Chief's Corner by Chief Bob Davis

FIRE DANGER ON THE MOUNTAIN -- YOU ARE NEEDED!

This is the time of year when the fire danger becomes extremely high. Forest fire professionals observed that 1000 hour time-lag fuels (big logs to most of us) are at the lowest moisture levels ever. All around us, large fires have raged, some of them of unprecedented size (Arizona, 450,000 acres, 24,000 people evacuated and Colorado, 500,000 acres; 20,000 people evacuated.) Count your blessings, neighbors. Somehow, we in Mosquito Fire Protection District (MFPD) have had no serious wildland fires in past few years - we dodged the bullet. And we should all be most thankful that our 186-or-so days without significant rain did not include dry lightning strikes or significant winds in the District. If they had, our community could have suffered the fate of some of those in Colorado and Arizona.

In the past I've written about the concern of dangerous amounts of fuel in the Mosquito-Swansboro communities. I have spoken of the frustration of *knowing* that the MFPD cannot protect <u>all</u> of the homes in the district during average-worst fire weather, because of this heavy fuel loading. As Chief I have asked for community involvement to abate the accumulated fuel hazard.

Guess what; I'm asking again and now we have the opportunity to get help through the El Dorado County Fire Safe Council. What's the catch? Well there's no catch! The "Chipping and Disabled Senior Assistance Program" provided by the Fire Safe council are available if you want to use them.

Why bother, we've done fine so far! You might say. Well it all depends on one's confidence in bullet-dodging; and considering what each year does to increase the odds against us, a high level of confidence would be simply foolish. For example,

everyone knows that the danger in playing Russian Roulette with a six-shooter is not the odds (which favor a live round in the chamber only 1 in 6 tries), but the *consequences* that you face if that 1 in 6 happens to come up! Now how many of us who live in this forested community stop to think that the natural fire cycle (the time it takes for ground fuels to build to a point where they promote rapid fire spread) in this part of California is between 3 and 25 years. And, that the last major fire we had was the Chili Bar Fire of 1979. Are you with me here? Haven't we already taken at least one statistical first click on that six-shooter? We dodged the bullet for the last several years but how many more "chances" do we want to take?

Remember the "Fire Triangle". Three things are needed for any fire to burn: fuel, oxygen, and heat. Take away any one of them and the fire will go out. We cannot control oxygen supply or disperse heat except in a limited way by savvy, technical, and expensive firefighting, But we can control the fuels. They are on our property, and there are safe, effective ways to keep them within Fire Safe limits while maintaining the beauty and health of the forest.

Since we can do something about the fuels, then our destiny with regard to destructive wildfire is literally in our own hands. If there isn't enough available fuel on and near the ground to propagate wildfire, then even very bad fire weather need not defeat us, especially with the quality of firefighting forces that we can call upon. I can't help but think that most of us here would like to see our homes and our forests remain about like they are. That's why we ought to seize this opportunity to help ourselves.

More patching material was recently delivered, so patching will continue as long as the weather allows. Recipe of the Month

There are so many folks out there who have taken up gardening and may be wondering what to do with the bountiful crop of tomatoes we have seen this year.....

Gazpacho

Preparation: 4 quarts of tomatoes, chopped and seeded, so approximately 10 four-inch tomatoes; adjust if using a smaller variety. I prefer organically-grown heirloom tomatoes, but Beefsteak or Roma will also work. Blanch 8 to 10 minutes, until skins look like they're falling off and then place them in cold water momentarily. Drain. Yields six quarts; about 14 servings

1 cup chopped and seeded cucumber

1 cup chopped sweet onion

1//4 cup Anaheim pepper (you can also use pasilla or jalapeño peppers, depending on the degree of spiciness you prefer)

1/2 cup roughly chopped large pimento-stuffed green olives

10 roughly chopped garlic cloves (approximately 2 tablespoons)

1/4 cup Spanish sherry vinegar

1/4 cup dry sherry wine

Place all ingredients in a bowl and mix gently together. One portion at a time (there will be about four portions total), run ingredients through your food processor until fully pureed or adjust to meet your own taste. Season to taste using fine sea salt and fresh, ground pepper. I like to serve it warm or kicked up by adding a bit of chili sauce. Keep in mind the peppers

in the gazpacho will heat up. You may want to let the flavors bloom a bit before adding chili sauce.
