MVFA, MFPD, SCPOAWHO ARE THEY? by Byte Staff

Occasionally, there is a degree of confusion by residents when trying to draw the distinction between the three "organizations" in our community. Here's a very abbreviated explanation of those three organizations and who they are and what they are about. Please feel free to come to any of the organizations' board meetings (see Byte calendar) to ask a question or give suggestions.

The Mosquito Volunteer Fire Association (MVFA)

A non-profit, community-wide organization - if you live up here in the Mosquito/Swansboro area you're automatically a member of MVFA. MVFA's stated role in their articles of incorporation is to provide community support and community fire education. MVFA owns and manages the Finnon Lake property but their major source of funding is through public donations and "fund raisers". MVFA organizes, funds and puts on the Community Christmas Dinner, Easter Egg Hunt, Community Picnic and the children's Halloween Party. MVFA also publishes the Mosquito Byte and the Mosquito Phone Book. Additionally, when donations permit, MVFA also purchases small tools, implements or medical equipment which they then donate to the Fire Protection District. MVFA has no employees and all of the things that they do are done by volunteer staff without any form of compensation.

The MVFA is governed by a 7 member Board of Directors elected by the community residents for two year terms. The election is held at the Christmas dinner in December. The Board meetings are open to the public and held at Fire Station 75 at 7:00 PM on the 1st Thursday of each month.

The Mosquito Fire Protection District (MFPD)

A State of California Special District charged with the responsibility of providing fire suppression, fire prevention, and first responder emergency medical services within District boundaries. MFPD was created in 1978 by the voters living in the District at

that time and is a tax supported entity. Their assets include the Fire Station, the Station grounds and the fire equipment. MFPD does **NOT** own or manage the Finnon Lake Property. The members of MFPD are its paid staff and the men and women living in the community who volunteer their time as firefighters, support group members or district board members.

The MFPD is governed by a 5 member Board of Directors who are "public officials" elected for 4 year terms by the District's voters in the State's General Election. Board meetings are open to the public and held at Fire Station 75 at 7:00 PM on the 2nd Thursday of each month.

Swansboro Country Property Owners Association (SCPOA)

A Homeowners Association that governs the Swansboro Sub-division (which is a part of the Mosquito community). SCPOA members are those people owning property within the sub-division. The SCPOA Board is responsible for managing the homeowners association business. They are funded by assessments on the property owners. SCPOA owns and maintains the airport, the roads within the subdivision, and the common areas such as Dyer Lake, Catfish Pond and Trout Lake. SCPOA does NOT own or manage the Finnon Lake Property.

The SCPOA is governed by a 7 member Board of directors elected for 2 year terms by SPOA members at their annual meeting in February. Board meetings are open to the public and held at Fire Station 75 at 6:00 PM on the 3rd Thursday of each month.

Recipe of the Month by Chef Frank

Sourdough Stuffing with Fruit and Kielbasa Sausage

1 large sourdough round loaf cut into 3/4 inch squares (lightly cut hard crust off)

2 T. extra virgin olive oil

1 pound Kielbasa sausage, 3/4 inch slices or half rounds 2 cups Granny Smith apples, peeled and chopped 3/4 cup walnuts, halved (I like to roast them in the over at 350 degrees for 20 minutes)

1/2 cup dried cranberries

2 cups yellow onion, chopped

1 cup carrots, chopped

2 cups celery, chopped

1 T. dried sage

2 cups turkey stock

salt and pepper to taste

To make the stuffing buy a large round sourdough loaf (1.5 -1.75 pounds). Remove the crust and cut it in squares. Place the bread in a baking pan and then in a 325 degree oven for 30-45 minutes to dry the bread. Careful to not dry it so much that it resembles a crouton (you don't want it that hard). When the bread is done place it in a large mixing bowl. In a sauté pan heat the oil and add the onions, carrots and celery. Sauté about 8-10 minutes or until slightly translucent. Add the sausage and cook 5-10 minutes and then add the apples and cranberries. Cook 5 more minutes stirring constantly. Add the stock and pour the mixture over the bread. Add the dry sage and dry walnuts (you can chop the walnuts). Mix well and be sure that the stuffing is not dry, if it's too dry add some more stock. Add salt and pepper to taste. Also, even though it is not on the ingredients list, some of the old timers like to add a couple of raw eggs to the stuffing. If you do this mix very well. Place the stuffing in a lightly buttered 12-by-16-inch or two 8-by-12-inch casserole dishes. Bake for one hour.
