Chief's Corner

Greetings. Brrrrrrrrrr! Since the rain in December it has been cold. It is the first time I have seen ice on Dyer Lake. We have just enough of a winter to make us appreciate the great summers we have. From a weather standpoint, this is a hard place to beat since we do have four seasons and not one of them is severe enough to make us numb. Around March I start looking forward for the summer heat then around August I really look forward to rain. I guess being happy with what is around us is something we just can't seem to handle. Hope you all have taken precautions for the cold weather around your home and the vehicles you rely on to get to and from town and work. Here are some suggestions for your vehicles in cold weather:

Check your antifreeze - Antifreeze is essential for your car's winter protection. Make sure the level is full and that the mixture is close to 50% water and 50% antifreeze.

Inspect your tires - Winter conditions often result in slick or icy roads. Your tires are your best defense. Make sure you have checked your tread depth. The National Highway Transportation Safety Board says you need at least 2/32" of depth to be safe. Also, be sure to check tire pressure.

Replace your wipers & check wiper fluid - Make sure your wipers can handle any snow, water, or sleet that falls on your windshield. Make sure that you have plenty of windshield washer fluid as you'll be using plenty over the winter months. Don't fill your washer fluid reservoir with anything *except* washer fluid.

Stay on top of maintenance procedures. Before winter hits is the perfect time to make sure you've taken care of annual maintenance.

While car trouble is a bummer ANY time of the year, it can be especially complicated and frustrating in winter conditions. Avoid the stress: Make sure you've inspected, checked, or cleaned your car's:

Battery and battery posts. Engine oil, Brakes and brake fluid. Spark plug wires. Radiator, Ignition, Emergency Flashers, Exhaust and Defroster. A properly inflated spare tire. Wheel wrench and tripod-type jack in case of tire issues.

Here are some other items you should carry just in case:

A shovel. Jumper cables in case of battery issues. A bag of salt or cat litter for icy or slick road conditions. A basic tool kit. Working flashlight and extra batteries. Reflective triangles. First aid kit. Exterior windshield cleaner. Ice scraper and snow brush. Non-perishable high energy foods like unsalted canned nuts or dried fruit or hard candy. Items to keep you warm, such as heavy mittens, blankets, socks, sweatshirts and a hat.

Since our winter weather hit, we have not had any serious problems, any major vehicle accidents, chimney fires or house fires. I hope that trend keeps up, but as with all things the guarantee is there will be a change.

Winter is not over. There is still plenty of time for snow, ice and cold. Please take caution daily for your safety and well being. Things are replaceable... loved ones are not.

So be careful, Chief Bob.

Recipe of the Month

Mexican Coffee Pudding with Kahlúa Whipped Cream

Mexican coffee is spiked with Kahlúa, but in these simple puddings, the liqueur is on top, whipped into cream.

Ingredients

1/2 cup (packed) golden brown sugar

3 tablespoons cornstarch

3 tablespoons instant espresso powder

1/2 teaspoon ground cinnamon plus additional for sprinkling

2 cups whole milk

1 1/4 cups chilled heavy whipping cream, divided

1 tablespoon Kahlúa or other coffee-flavored liqueur

Preparation

Whisk first 3 ingredients and 1/2 teaspoon cinnamon in heavy medium saucepan. Whisk in milk and 1 cup cream. Bring to boil over medium-high heat, whisking constantly. Boil 1 minute, whisking constantly. Divide among 6 small bowls. Cover and chill until cold, about 4 hours.

Whisk 1/4 cup cream and Kahlúa in small bowl until peaks form. Spoon atop puddings; sprinkle with cinnamon.


