We are a 501c3 and will give you a donations letter for tax purposes. We have so much talent on the hill and this is one way to get your name out there for your deserved recognition. In the next few weeks you will see the Steering Committee doing needed work around Finnon Lake. They have a long list of repairs on the property, fishing

We would like to thank everyone who attended our annual community meeting, as well as our ballot counting volunteers Sharon Hern, MaryAnn Haywood, Sandi Brauns and Bill Wren. Thank you Sharon for acting as our inspector of the election. We had four openings on the board, all four incumbents were willing to continue as well as two additional members volunteered to run. We had a total of 157 ballots cast out of 698 possible and here are the results with those four receiving the top amounts of votes being on the board. Rob Lupient - 124, Wayne Mikel - 36, Kim Purcell - 141, Al Raymond - 132, Duncan Rose - 44 and Tee Stierwalt - 137. Tee will continue as our treasurer, Kim as president and Rob will take over as vice president.

We want to thank Jonathan and Kevin for all the hard work they have done over the past year; the community has never looked better. Both do an amazing job of keeping our community maintained as well as put in the extra effort to check for problems after storms or snow, often on their own time. This kind of dedication is not easy to find and their efforts are greatly appreciated by the board.

Lynda has also done a great job working with owners to get their assessments paid. With the help of board member Rob Lupient, they have had to take a number of members to small claims court in order to get payment. The association wins each case and all additional costs are paid by the member. While this may not be pleasant for the individual owner, it is in the best interest of the association as a whole. Compared to other associations we have a pretty low delinquency level, which helps to prevent increases in dues, helps home sales, and makes it easier to get loans. In the next couple of months we'll be reviewing our finances, looking at what might be available for roadwork in this next year, and determining where that work needs to be done.

We encourage members to attend the board meetings

and get involved for the benefit of the community as a whole. Look for the signs posted for the times, dates and type of meeting to be held.

Our next meeting will be March 21st starting at 6:00 PM at the fire station.

Questions were raised at our annual SCPOA Community meeting regarding the recent infestation and death of local pine trees. For those of you who have large pine trees near your houses that might be

susceptible to bark beetle destruction, you can use Bayer Advanced Tree and Shrub Protect and Feed II. Information on this product can be found at Bayer's website at:

The amount to use is determined by the circumference of the trunk. It is available at Home Depot and Wal-Mart. This product is not cheap, but a \$6 rebate is downloadable on the same Website.
