CHIEF'S CORNER

Spring is in the air and I am starting to hear the sound of weed trimmers and lawn mowers. Before you know it, fire season will be upon us. Take time to step back, look at your house and ask yourself if your home would survive a wildfire.

1. Create a Defensible Space

Defensible space is essential to improve your home's chance of surviving a wildfire. It's the buffer you create between a building on your property and the grass, trees, shrubs and other wild land fuel that surround it. This space is needed to slow or stop the spread of wildfire and it protects your home from catching fire, either from direct flame contact or radiant heat. Defensible space is also important for the protection of firefighters defending your home.

2. Are You Doing the Right Thing the Wrong Way?

Each year we respond to wild land fires started by using equipment the wrong way. We live in a high fire zone and all equipment must be used with extreme caution. Lawn mowers, metal-bladed trimmers, chainsaws, grinders, welders and tractors can all start a wild land fire if not used properly. Do your part to keep your community fire-safe.

3. Here is How to Do It the Right Way

When mowing, metal blades striking rocks can create sparks and start fires in dry grass. In wild land areas, spark arresters are required on all portable gasoline powered equipment. This includes tractors, chainsaws, weed trimmers and mowers. Keep exhaust systems, spark arresters and mowers in proper working order and free of carbon buildup. Use the recommended grade of fuel, and don't top it off.

SCPOA

With the warm Spring temperatures arriving early, Johnathan and Kevin are spending a lot of their time mowing and weed eating. The large logs along Dogwood are being removed as soil conditions allow and Kevin is getting pretty good at converting them to benches. You may notice these benches in some of the common areas.

We had a brief discussion about the remaining wood fencing and questioned if we could just remove it to replace later. We have not included new fencing in the budget in order to maintain dues without increase and focus on roads while oil prices are down. Kevin thought it could result in duplication in labor if the fence is not replaced when removed so the discussion was tabled to a later date.

Our CPA is in the process of closing out our year end books. This should be finalized soon and we will have a budget meeting after our regular meeting in May to review. At this point we are financially in good shape especially when compared to many other associations. We will also be doing a new reserve study this year in August which will give us a very accurate estimate of our status.

Last month we had a road meeting with suggestions on roads that should be done this year. While we have very little allocated to road repair this year we will have excess funds from last years budget to use and can borrow from our reserves as we did last year. The board agreed to proceed with getting a bid package

out which will include Swansboro, Stope, Dickenson, White Oak and Lupine. When we receive bids we will be able to determine which roads can be done. If oil prices stay low, it will have a very positive effect on our reserve status. The lower oil prices allowed us not to raise dues while still fulfilling our reserve obligations.

One of our members offered assistance in going through the process with Cal Fire to get them to remove trees in our area for fire safety. As an alternative, it is possible for individuals to be teamed up with other owners through the Fire Safe Counsel. This might provide an easier way to create the necessary defensible space at little or no cost. SCPOA will do what it can to help out, so look for information on how to participate in the June packet.

We also had a question about why a "NO TRESSPASSING" sign was posted at Buckeye Court. A homeowner who posted the sign thinks the court is his private property. Buckeye Court is a public road, which can be verified by public records. Anyone who has a problem or feels threatened when using that road needs to contact the Sheriffs department and file a report as they are aware of the issue.

Our next meeting will be Thursday May 16th at the firehouse starting at 6:00 PM followed by a budget meeting.

That is such a nice compliment, especially coming from someone who puts in hundreds and hundreds of volunteer hours to keep things beautiful around Finnon Lake and the café. Any and all compliments truly belong to all of you who have contributed in one form or another. First; A heartfelt Thank You to the incredible hosts and volunteers of the 2012 Swansboro and Mosquito Garden Tour. We only had a couple of weeks to put it all together, but everyone worked hard and put in many long hours to make it happen. It was very hot on the day of the tour, which was Father's Day weekend, but people braved the 100F degrees and the turn-out was pretty amazing. So second; many thanks to all the enthusiastic and supportive garden tour guests! You have also made the new improvements at the café come to fruition... Between the income of the garden tour and private donations, we were able to buy all the items that are currently there (except the wooden arbor, which is on a temporary loan from yours truly \odot until we can install the intended design feature). Although there is much more to come, it feels wonderful to finally start the process of creating some ambiance for the outdoor dining area in the wake of the dam construction. Recipe of the Month by Chef Frank

OLD FASHIONED POTATO SALAD

(Yields 6-8 servings)

INGREDIENTS:

4 cups peeled, cubed potatoes

3 hard cooked eggs, chopped

2 ribs celery, thinly sliced

¼ cup chopped green onion

1/4 cup sweet pickle relish

1/2 cup mayonnaise

2 tablespoons Champagne vinegar

1 teaspoon Dijon mustard

½ teaspoon salt

¼ teaspoon pepper

Place potatoes in sauce pan and cover with water; bring to a boil. Reduce heat. Cook 20-25 minutes, until tender. Drain potatoes. While potatoes are still hot, pour vinegar over the potatoes and let cool. Place in a large bowl. Add eggs, celery and onion. Combine remaining ingredients in a small bowl. Pour over potato mixture and toss to coat. Cover and refrigerate for at least an hour.
